103rd Annual Meeting of the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau Rockford, Illinois

The 103rd Annual Business Meeting of the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau was held at the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau building, Rockford, Illinois and by Zoom on March 15, 2023. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm. by President Brent Pollard, who led us in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

Board Members Amanda Anderson (virtual), Cody Book, Jessica Bubert, Matt Bullard, Curt Greenlee, Angie Grotjan, John Mitchell, Sidney Moate (virtual), Trevor Olson, Brent Pollard, Phillip Raines, Kevin Shedd, Brian Sisson (virtual), and Clay Sohner were present. Ann Marie Cain, Manager and Farm Bureau members Richard Beuth (virtual), John Cleland, Daniel Hermeling, and Tom Walberg (virtual) were also present.

The Official Notice of the Annual Meeting was read by Secretary, Jessica Bubert. Ann Marie Cain, member of the Credentials Committee, certified that a quorum of the voting members was present in person, participating by video conference, or by proxy and that official business could be conducted. Jessica Bubert reported that we received 163 valid proxies naming the President to cast votes on their behalf.

President Brent Pollard then announced that the minutes of the 102nd Annual Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau Meeting held on March 16, 2022, were printed in the annual report. As no member requested that the minutes be read aloud, President Pollard asked for a motion to approve the 102nd Annual Meeting Minutes as printed. A motion was made by Kevin Shedd, seconded by Cody Book, and passed to approve the minutes as printed.

President Brent Pollard called upon Board Vice President, John Mitchell, to give the Financial Report. The Statement of Financial Position and Statement of Activities, as printed in the annual report, were presented as well as the Financial Report for the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau Foundation, which was also included in the annual report.

President Brent Pollard introduced the Nominating Committee: Cody Book, Jeremy Franseen, Angie Grotjan, Kevin Shedd and Clay Sohner. President Brent Pollard then called on Cody Book, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, to report on the actions of the Nominating Committee and the election results.

Cody Book reported that Amanda Anderson, Matt Bullard, Curt Greenlee, John Mitchell, Sidney Moate, and Phillip Raines have been elected by ballot to serve on the Farm Bureau Board of Directors for the ensuing three-year period. The Nominating Committee hereby certified that they are voting members in good standing and duly qualified to serve on the Board of Directors of the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau. A motion was made by Trevor Olson, seconded by Kevin Shedd, and passed to approve the report and actions of the Credentials Committee. Cody Book turned the meeting over to Vice President John Mitchell.

Vice President, John Mitchell then recognized Brent Pollard for his years of service to the Farm Bureau. Brent served on the board for thirteen years. He served as Secretary for eight years and President this past year.

President Brent Pollard then asked for a motion to give authority for the Board of Directors to appoint voting delegates to the IAA Annual Meeting to be held in December 2023. A motion was made by Kevin Shedd, seconded by Trevor Olson, and passed. President Brent Pollard referred to the printed President's and Manager's Reports. President Brent Pollard asked for a motion to approve the actions of the Board of Directors for the past fiscal year. The motion to approve the Board's actions was made by Cody Book, seconded by Trevor Olson, and passed.

President Pollard then asked the members if there was any other business to come before the meeting. As there was no other business, a motion was made by Matt Bullard, seconded by Kevin Shedd, and passed to adjourn the business meeting at 7:13 p.m.

2023 President's Report

It's been another great year for Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau. After serving as your Vice President under the past three Presidents, the board wasn't going to let me off the hook. Many thanks to the members, board, and staff for all your support this year.

Our mission is to "be the voice, resource, and advocate for farm families and agriculture, while promoting stewardship for today and future generations". To accomplish this mission, our Board of Directors and advisory members work under three committees: Legislative Team, Education Team, and Internal Affairs & Member Relations Team.

It has been a banner year for our Legislative Team building relationships with local legislators. A new meeting format for our quarterly meetings allowed us to meet individually with each county board chairman and staff and hold legislative roundtables with the Republican and Democratic elected officials. A new program for 2023 was Adopt-an-Acre. Local legislators could follow an acre of corn or soybeans on farm visits throughout the year to understand the work and investments that go into growing a crop. At the end of the year, the profits from the acre were matched and donated to the food pantry of the legislator's choice. We were also active on local issues like zoning for farm buildings, animal shows/rodeos, and rewriting ordinances for the new statewide standards for wind and solar projects.

As we move into 2024, I am most proud that we have multiple local legislators sponsoring the Family Farm Preservation Act in Springfield. This potential legislation represents a major shift in the way estate taxes will impact our family farms.

Our Education Team also saw continued growth. Our Ag in the Classroom program, led by Ag Literacy Coordinator, Diane Cleland, and her staff, saw over 45,000 students in the 2022-2023 school year and they are poised to do it again! We also welcomed Holly Wiltfang into a new role as our Consumer Engagement Director while she continues to work in the classroom with our AITC program. I am excited to see how Holly will expand our interactions with the public and continue to tell our story to consumers. The Education Team also assists with some of our biggest events including the county fairs, the Farm Breakfast, and Ag All Around Us, where we will see tens of thousands of people each year. This team is also responsible for the "Start Seeing Farmers" signs you've seen along the roadways and the Farmer-in-Training safety t-shirts available now!

The Internal Affairs & Member Relations Team saw a positive year in our finances which allowed all our great programs to happen! The biggest building projects at the Farm Bureau this year were the sealcoating and striping of our parking lots and driveways and the roof replacement to the FB building at the Boone County Fairgrounds.

Our Young Leader committee has been very active in promoting several farm safety efforts and engaging with FFA and 4-H, our future leaders.

We also saw growth in the number of members taking advantage of opportunities to travel with us, including many shows and tours, even a bus trip to the Farm Progress Show. We had a fun evening of camaraderie at a Rockford Rivets game last summer. Look for more exciting events in 2024!

Our Foundation Board has done a tremendous job supporting our local scholars and the Ag in the Classroom program.

Last, but not least, a big thank you to our Manager, Ann Marie Cain! Ann is truly second to none in the Illinois Farm Bureau family and I'd be terribly lost without her and our awesome staff.

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to serve you!

Carroll learned about the process of producing Christmas trees as well as how Illinois farmers raise hogs. Later, Rep. Carroll enjoyed lunch with local farmers and discussed important agricultural issues. Thank you to Ben's Christmas Tree Farm, Doetch Farms, and Randall Farms for providing

Rep. Carroll with the opportunity to learn more about local agriculture.

Representative Tony McCombie, Representative David Vella. and Representative Maurice West traveled out to Shedd Farms for our <u>Adopt-a-Acre</u> program this summer. Representative Vella helped harvest corn this fall and donated the proceeds, matched by the Farm Bureau to the Community Closet in Belvidere, IL.


Policy Development

It is important that we hear from you regarding your concerns and suggestions on what direction your organization should take on issues at the county, state, and national level. Policy Development starts with you.

Local Affairs

The Legislative Team met with Winnebago County Chairman Joe Chiarelli, Boone County Chairman Rodney Riley and administrative staff from both counties to discuss local issues impacting agriculture. Issues ranged from ag exemptions for building permits for farm buildings, rural roads and bridges, illegal dumping, animal welfare, and more.





March/June: Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau leaders are excited to call the Boone County Board and the Winnebago County Board an "Ally in Agriculture" after the boards' adoption of a Pro-Agriculture Resolution, demonstrating local elected officials' support for farmers.

Illinois is home to more than 71,000 farms, 96% of which are family-owned and a third of which include

livestock. Boone County accounts for 457 of those farms and Winnebago County accounts for 736. Farmland is a finite resource that is vital to agriculture, food production, and the economic well-being of Boone and Winnebago Counties.

Local elected officials across the state are showing support of agricultural communities through the adoption of Pro-Agriculture Resolutions. County board members work with their local Farm Bureau to better understand the role agriculture plays in their local economy, such as providing jobs and generating property tax revenue, which is used to fund services for all citizens. The result is a strong working relationship between county officials and the agriculture community.



The Farm Bureau continues to work with county government on issues in the two counties.

Education & Outreach



January: To help develop Agvocates for the future, the Farm Bureau continues to invest in our youth by partnerning up with the Boone and Winnebago County 4-H.



The Farm Bureau sponsored our fourth <u>Public Speaking Training</u> session for forty-six 4-Hers. The training invited 4-Her's from the U of I Extension: Boone-DeKalb-Ogle and Winnebago-Stephenson- Jo Daviess Units to improve their public speaking skills and boost their confidence as a public speaker. Each 4-Her that completed the training and competed in the Boone or the Winnebago public speaking contest received a gift from the Farm Bureau. A total of six 4-Her's from Boone and three 4-Her's from Winnebago completed the training and competed locally.

February: The Farm Bureau, in partnership with the Illinois Farm Bureau, hosted our annual Belvidere Chamber of Commerce Farmer's Breakfast Before Business.

Approximately 40 businessmen and women participated in a discussion with Adam Day, Conserv FS Agronomy Sales and Marketing Manager, on the impacts global events have



on agriculture for local farmers. Topics of discussion included global impacts on fertilizer markets, seed inputs, CPP markets, and additional impacts such as inflation, interest rates, equipment purchases, employee shortages, trucking shortages, etc. Farm Bureau volunteers served breakfast prepared by the Steam Plant Restaurant.

March- Answering consumers' questions about food production, food safety and food labeling is one of Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau's top priorities. The Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau and WBFB Agriculture in the Classroom partnered with the Discovery Center Museum to host our <u>5th Annual Ag All Around Us</u> event to celebrate agriculture. Stations covered various agricultural topics, including goats, dairy

and butter churning, honeybees and pollinators, poultry (chickens, ducks, turkeys and more), corn, pigs, sheep, "Making Sense of Food Labels," and a Kids Corral. Approximately 1,400 people attended on Saturday, March 11, 2023, and talked with 19 local farmers and family members about food and fiber production.



The Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau would like to thank Lockwood Park, the Belvidere FFA and Durand FFA students, and the Winnebago County 2023 Fair Queens for volunteering their time to provide agricultural experiences for the museum visitors. This event was sponsored in part by the Illinois Farm Bureau.

Adyson & Ashlyn Haerterich helped attendees make their own chick in an egg to take home.

April- Our farm kids are our most precious commodity. Fun highly visible shirts are a way to help keep them safe while playing on the farm. The Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau sold 48 <u>FARMER IN TRAINING</u> t-shirts in yellow and safety green during the "Start Seeing Farm Kids Campaign". The Education Team decided to expand the safetly line to include more designs and different styles. Order online anytime and select pick up at Embroid This in Machesney Park or have your order shipped directly to you.





July: The Farm Bureau invited families to join us at Belvidere Park for Touch a Tractor at <u>Unplug Illinois</u> <u>Day</u>. Families took pictures in a tractor and made a tractor photo frame to take home.

August: Farm Bureau went to the Boone and Winnebago County Fairs for family farm fun. Fairgoers joined our "Burger Bash" backyard BBQ. We celebrated "We are the 96", provided proper

meat cooking temperature magnets, measurement conversion magnets, and substitution magnets along with recipes in reusable sandwich bags. Visitors learned

about how farmers raise the items needed to make hamburgers as well as fun facts about honeybees and baby chicks. Members enjoyed a ice cream cone.

October: Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau partnered with ADM-Seward, Central Grain, Delong's (Garden Prairie) and Farm City. Thank you to the local Elevators' staff for helping us hand out 400 <u>Harvest snack bags</u> to our local farmers and their employees as they worked hard to bring in the harvest. The bags were packed by some of our youth volunteers.





Stewardship

The Farm Bureau expanded our efforts to protect the environment. In the spring of 2021, the Farm Bureau put in a pollinator garden in front of the building. Later that fall, we planted about a half-acre wildflower prairie plot. The first year it looked a little rough. The second year yielded some color and wildlife. We are excited to see how it will look this year.

To help promote pollinators, Farm Bureau gave away one Mason Bee Station kit each Friday between March 13-April 28. In addition to the weekly drawing, Farm Bureau donated a Mason Bee Station kit to the five local FFA Chapters. The kit included a bee station house, spring natural reeds, 10 Mason Bee cocoons, the 26-page Native Bee Guide and accessories to increase the success of hosting Mason Bees.



June: The Young Leader Committee partnered with Culvers of Winnebago and hosted a <u>Donate while you Dine</u> event to help support the local food pantries. The Young Leaders brought out farm friends, farm equipment, activities and held a Basket Raffle. Thank you, Young Leaders and Culvers of Winnebago, for helping us raise just under \$700 for our local food pantries!

The Young Leaders donated their time to help support the WBFB Foundation by selling 50/50 tickets at the <u>Farm Breakfast</u>. They raised \$460 for ag education.



September: WBFB YL's held their 2nd Annual Farm Safety Expo for the Boone and Winnebago FFA in honor of National Farm Safety Week. Presenters talked to over 60 students from Belvidere FFA, Durand FFA, North Boone FFA, and Pecatonica High School FFA about Farm Safety. Students learned about how to apply tourniquets and wraps to Stop the Bleed, Road Safety and Sharing the Road with large farm equipment. Students had the opportunity to experience Conserv FS' sprayer simulator and see a drone demonstration. Aaron Mitchell joined the FFA students for lunch and discussed opportunities available through the Young Leader program. This event was sponsored in part by Illinois Farm Bureau and COUNTRY Financial.

The FBCM program, which recognizes county managers for professional achievement and staff leadership, was started in 1993 by the Illinois Farm Bureau. To receive the FBCM designation, county Farm Bureau managers must complete a series of six exams which assess expertise in various managerial areas. Recertification is granted every five years based on 50 hours of continuing education areas and professional staff leadership.


Welcome to our 2023 Summer Intern
