Course Description

- The study group will be divided into four topics impacting the practice of speech-language pathologists in a variety of settings.

- During the sessions, those readings will be discussed. Time will be allotted for participants to discuss the topic in relation to current caseloads.
- There will be four, 1.5 hour sessions during 2021.
- Rotating facilitators will be scheduled to lead the study group sessions.

- 5:00-5:30: Summary and critique of articles read.
- 5:30-6:00: Guided discussion of application of information to caseloads.
