

## What's Happening?

Monday May 30th is **Rockford's Memorial Day Parade**. This is an opportunity to honor all those who have served our country and protected our freedoms. The origins of this solemn holiday pre-date the Model T, going all the way back to 1868. Out of respect for our fallen heroes, parade organizers request that we don't throw candy or honk horns. We are in Division #4 of the parade this year (see map). Enter from 8<sup>th</sup> Street at 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue to get staged and plan to arrive by 8:30 a.m. The parade route is about 1.5 miles long, ending by Beattie Park. Please let Steve Kindell know if you can attend with your Model T.



Midway Village is hosting a **Celebration of Innovation (1860 – 1910)** on Saturday and Sunday, June 4th and 5th from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. There will be an opportunity to have up to four Model T's on display. Advances in technology developed in the Victorian period significantly changed the day-to-day lives of the people who lived during this time. Program theme: Help visitors understand the way that work changed for a number of different people as new technologies were developed such as farming, hand knitting to machines including spinning wheels and knitting machines, food preservation, woodworking, machine shops, linotype machines, flue plates, nursing, wagons to automobiles, forensics, housekeeping technology such as washing machines and vacuums, and the first female lawyers. Please let Kurt Duesterhoeft know if you would like to display your Model T so we get a headcount. You can display either day or both. This is a unique way to engage the public and foster interest in our Model T's.

The 25<sup>th</sup> annual **Model A Day** will be held in Sharon, WI on Sunday June 5<sup>th</sup> from 9 a.m – 3 p.m. Hundreds of Model A's will line the downtown streets as well as a few of our beloved Model T's. There will be live music from the times, a swap meet, pig roast, and ice cream social. The event is sponsored by the Rock-Ford A's Model A car club. The town of Sharon goes all-in for this event each year. 



#### The Great Race

The Great Race is an annual time/speed/distance rally for vintage cars and it's coming to a town (somewhat) near you. This year's race will start in Rhode Island and travel through Connecticut, New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, and Minnesota, finishing in North Dakota. It's been quite a few years since the race passed through this area. With more than \$150,000 in prizes, the race attracts entrants from around the world. Most of the participant cars are pre-WWII, although models up to 1974 are permitted. The 2021 race was won by two young sisters (driver and navigator) with a 1932 Ford five-window coupe. The exact route of the race is not published in advance, to keep the race fair. But you can catch the event at an overnight stop or a lunch stop. If you'd like to see the race in person, the closest locations are:
