A semi-load of produce pulls up to the Food Bank, and the forklift moves into action. An army of volunteers including the Mounted Patrol join forces to load the boxes into trucks to distribute across town. Like a well choreographed dance, the boxes are counted, moved and ushered to their final destination. Upon learning about a USDA program that would bring fresh produce to our community, the idea of distributing 880 boxes seemed daunting.

However, as a mom notorious for reminding her own that no task is too big, I pondered my own advice: "How do you eat an elephant? One bite at a time." We had to find a way to distribute this farm-fresh produce one box at a time. We first called the Senior Center, asking if Meals on Wheels participants might enjoy getting this produce... 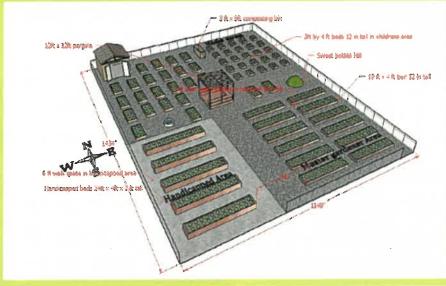

Under the direction of Mary Mertz, the Garden Club sponsor, boys and girls from Cottonwood Elementary have the chance to spend time in the Children's Garden at the Food Bank learning first hand the value of growing one's own "Stuff changes so quickly. food. I'm here Monday and it's green. I come back and it's red," says William as he proudly shows off the tomatoes. While Aaron digs up a handful of good sized potatoes, he mentions that he is looking forward to the sweet potato harvest the most. wants to make fries.

This summer the brothers joined fellow club members in making homemade potato salad to give to Ashby House. With over 75% of the students at Cottonwood on the Free / Reduced Lunch program, the opportunity to cook with garden fresh produce is life-changing. They understand and appreciate food and nutrition in a whole new way. With support from donors, corporations and grant funders like Salina Regional Health Foundation, the Children's Garden will be getting a facelift in the months to come. Adjacent to it, handicap accessible raised beds will be available for gardeners with limited mobility and a new community garden with a section for vegetable trials will enable both novice and master gardeners to "dig in." As 18th-century poet Alfred Austin said, "To nurture a garden is to feed not just the body, but the soul."

As our military's "first responders" in times of disaster, the National Guard is always on hand to help and serve those in need. Seven of these heroes spent 4 hours one Saturday cleaning the Food Bank's pantry shelves and putting together kits for our homeless and transient population. In these kits are travel toiletry and hygiene items, in addition to ready-to-eat snacks and meals. These kits offer a convenient bundle of necessities, but more importantly they offer HOPE to the underserved and neglected. New initiatives like this extend the reach of the Food Bank beyond the pantry and the produce. Each bag can be returned and re-filled until clients find more stable situations and are able to receive our regular week's worth of food.
