COMMENTS FROM YOUR COUNTY PRESIDENT

I know this newsletter does not reach your household till February, but I would like to say “Welcome to the New Year” and let’s see what transpires for our Granges for 2024!

We have an extra day added to our calendar this year; the year brings us another important election year; our Granges will also be having elections this year; and who knows what might occur in our everyday lives.

With an extra day added to our lives this year, what will you do with that day? I know I will probably be spending some time in preparation for my home Grange for their monthly breakfast on March 3.

Since this year is going to be a year in which we will be selecting the President of the United States, let us be mindful of the Grange’s position on “politicking” in our Granges, or at Grange activities – Chapter 10 (Code of All Granges) from the National Grange Digest of Laws in section 10.1.4 states: “No Grange of the various divisions of the order shall use or allow to be used any name, insignia or mark of the Order in a manner which could indicate support, approval or opposition of any candidate for political office or any partisan political position.” In other words...don’t use the Grange’s name in support of one candidate over another, we are nonpartisan.

- ◆ Taxes were submitted to the accountant for the latest fiscal year

- ◆ Kenneth Schlegel shared topics from the latest Ag-Legislative Committee meeting
- ◆ Michael Adams reported that all lottery calendars were distributed. All calendar stubs and monies are due to him by March 1.

- ◆ Reminded that the various departments need to submit an income/expense report for the previous quarter at each Pomona meeting
