

Full-time employees will soon be mailed a Form 1095-C to their home address. This is provided as proof of the health coverage that the Town offers you and your family.

Only one form is provided for all the individuals listed on your policy; you may need to make photocopies for your spouse or dependents if necessary.

What is Form 1095-C?

Your Form 1095-C will contain information that you will transfer to your 1040, 1040A, or 1040EZ tax form. You *do not* need to submit the Form 1095-C with your 1040. In fact, most people will only have to check a box on their 1040s stating that they (and their dependents, if applicable) were covered by the Town of Mount Pleasant's health plan for the year. You do not have to wait for your Form 1095-C to file your 2019 taxes.

When will I receive my Form 1095-C?

Forms will be postmarked no later than February 28, 2020.

Didn't the Affordable Care Act go away?

No. While we do not know what the future holds regarding the ACA, the reporting requirements are still intact for tax year 2019. **Save your Form 1095-C for documentation purposes.**
