

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman S. MacKenzie, with all members in favor, to hire Colin Merrill as a Township DPW Laborer at a rate of \$17.50 per hour.

**HOPKINS VS. TOWNSHIP OF HAMPTON:  
CLASS ACTION LAWSUIT SETTLEMENT  
REGARDING OPEN PUBLIC RECORDS (OPRA)**

Township Attorney S. Roseman discussed a class-action lawsuit brought by Mr. Shawn Hopkins against several municipalities in New Jersey regarding an OPRA request Mr. Hopkins made to obtain the formula used by Micro Systems to determine local property tax assessments. Micro Systems has not provided their formula to the local governments they serve, therefore, municipalities were not able to supply Mr. Hopkins with the documents requested.

As a result, Mr. Hopkins filed a class-action lawsuit and named Hampton Township as one of the defendants. Township Attorney S. Roseman recommended that the Township Committee consent to a settlement where Micro Systems provides the municipalities involved with the formula for a one-time fee of \$50,000. In addition, Micro Systems will contribute \$5,000 toward Mr. Hopkins' legal fees and the municipalities named in the lawsuit would contribute \$300,000.

OPRA regulations do not require records custodians to provide OPRA applicants with documents that are not on file in their office, therefore, OPRA laws were not violated in any way. Nonetheless, Attorney S. Roseman stated that paying the sum of \$350,000 to settle the case is significantly less than spending thousands of dollars to fight the case.

A **MOTION** was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman S. MacKenzie, with all members in favor, to accept the recommendation made by Township Attorney S. Roseman to consent to the Order Settlement in Hopkins vs. Township of Hampton, as referenced above.

**DISPLAY FOR THE FARM AND HORSE SHOW/NEW JERSEY STATE FAIR**

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that she contacted Kittatinny Regional High School in May 2015 to ask if any of their art students might be interested in participating in a Hampton

Township project to create a display that would represent the municipality at the New Jersey State Fair. The KRHS Art Director indicated that there was not enough time left in the school year to begin the project. Township Administrator E. Klose explained that the township does not receive the State Fair Theme until May of each year, otherwise she would have contacted the school earlier. She suggested that perhaps some of the students could work on the project over the summer to earn Community Service Credits, a graduation requirement. KRHS responded that the school would not be interested at this time.

**TOWNSHIP RECREATION COMMITTEE APPOINTMENT**

**A MOTION** was made by Mayor P. Yetter and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to appoint Mr. Robert Kowalski to the Hampton Township Recreation Committee for a 5-year term.

**ROOSTER ORDINANCE**

Township Attorney S. Roseman provided township officials with information regarding the possibility of adopting an ordinance regulating the ownership of roosters in residential areas. Township Administrator E. Klose explained that she receives complaints periodically from residents who are upset because of they live near crowing roosters in a neighborhood setting. Often these complaints are from people who live in lake communities where the lots are small and not suitable for housing farm animals.

Attorney S. Roseman noted that typically an animal control officer or a zoning officer enforces issues associated with housing roosters. Township Administrator E. Klose stated that the Hampton Township Noise Ordinance cannot be used to enforce these complaints because the sound of a crowing rooster does not reach the required decibel level to constitute excessive noise.

Mayor P. Yetter stated that some residents have chickens and roosters as part of a 4-H project, which should be given consideration if the township does indeed adopt an ordinance.

**HELP AMERICA VOTE ACT (HAVA) GRANT ACCEPTANCE**

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that Township Clerk K. Armstrong submitted an application to the Sussex County Board of Elections regarding the above referenced grant. The township was recently informed that the municipality was awarded HAVA funds in the amount \$33,307.42 to refurbish the front of the Hampton Township Senior and Community Center to bring it in to compliance with the American with Disabilities Act. Township Clerk K. Armstrong stated that DPW Manager D. Bayles provided the supporting technical documentation required, i.e., description of project w/drawings and vendor quotes. Township officials expressed their appreciation.

**WHEREAS**, said Director may also approve the insertion of any item of appropriation for equal amount;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Hampton Township Committee of the Township of Hampton, County of Sussex hereby requests the Director of Local Government Services to approve the insertion of an item of revenue in the budget of the year 2015 in the sum of \$ \$33,307.42, which item is now available as a revenue from the County of Sussex in the amount of \$33,307.42

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the like sum of \$33,307.42 is hereby appropriated under the caption of the "HAVA 261 Grant Program"; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the above is a result of a State Grant of \$33,307.42 from the County of Sussex.

**HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE AND RESCUE UPDATE**

Township President V. Rumsey reported that during June 2015, HTVFR responded to 12 fire calls and 34 EMS calls. Year-to-date HTVFR has responded to 185 EMS calls and 109 Fire calls.

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On August 8, 2015 Hampton Township will partake in the Hampton Borough Barrel Race. The Borough of Branchville Fire Department and the Township of Lafayette Fire Department will provide coverage for HTVFR.

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The HTVFR Chicken BBQ is scheduled for August 22, 2015 at Fire Station #1. The festivities will start at 4:30 PM. The cost is \$15 per adult, \$13 per senior citizens and \$7.50 per child. Beer will be available.

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President V. Rumsey stated that HTVFR plans to refurbish the barbeque pit at Fire Station #1. In addition, DPW Manager D. Bayles is in the process of obtaining quotes to make upgrades to the floor at Fire Station #1.

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HTVFR plans to refurbish Ambulance #4852. Refurbishing is cost effective and will extend the life of the vehicle for approximately ten additional years. The cost is approximately \$40,000, significantly less than a new ambulance.

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President V. Rumsey stated that HTVFR is applying for two grants to purchase backup cameras for certain vehicles, as well as a new stretcher/stretcher lift. The stretcher fits into a separate component that is equipped with hydraulic lifts, reducing the risk of injury to both the patients and EMS volunteers. If HTVFR does not receive the grant, the Fire Department plans to allocate funds to purchase the stretcher and finance it over a period of three years.

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President V. Rumsey stated that HTVFR helped Kittatinny Regional High School park cars during their graduation ceremony. A miscommunication with school officials regarding which lots would be designated for handicapped parking caused certain attendees to become angry and

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verbally abusive to HTVFR volunteers. President V. Rumsey stated that HTVFR has helped with this event over the past several years and never encountered this type of situation.

Township officials asked if KRHS has ever donated money to the fire department in return for their assistance. President V. Rumsey stated that HTVFR is a community minded organization that has neither asked for, nor received, a donation from KRHS in return for assisting with parking duties at the school.

**PUBLIC SESSION**

Hampton Township resident Mrs. R. Lawrey was present to report that she had a new roof installed last year by Roselli Roofing and Siding. Since that time, the roof has been leaking due to improperly installed gutters. In addition, windy weather causes several poorly secured roof shingles to lift. Mrs. Lawrey has discussed the matter with Township Building Inspector B. Huber, who informed her that it is against State law for him to climb up on a ladder to conduct inspections. All inspections must be conducted from the ground. The main objective of a Building Inspector is to confirm the installation of a new roof, not to ensure the quality of the workmanship.

Mrs. Lawrey explained that the roof cost her \$12,000 and is suppose to have a warranty. The roofing company has been unresponsive and has not offered any restitution. It was necessary to hire another contractor to fix the gutters at a cost of \$1,200, which does not include the expense Mrs. Lawry will incur to repair the unsecured shingles.

Mrs. Lawrey filed a complaint with the State of New Jersey and the Better Business Bureau. She asked the Township Committee if they had any jurisdiction regarding this matter to help her get some type of restitution. Township Attorney S. Roseman reiterated that the inspection is to confirm the installation of the roof, not the quality of the work. He suggested that perhaps the Homeowner Fraud Act would provide some kind of relief.

Township officials sympathized with Mrs. Lawrey, but explained the township does not have authority over a contractor's workmanship. They suggested the possibility of going through Small Claims Court. Mayor P. Yetter offered to help Mrs. Lawrey obtain the necessary paperwork if she decides to file a claim.

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Mr. Randy Sprague, the Technical Director of the Swartswood Lake and Watershed Association (SLWA), located in the Townships of Stillwater and Hampton, asked the Township Committee to send a letter to the NJDEP expressing concerns about actions taken by their agency in Swartswood Lake. The issue involves water quality and weed growth in the lake. Mr. Sprague stated that SLWA collaborated with the NJDEP Watershed Management for many years to improve and maintain water quality at Swartswood Lake, but State assistance has since dwindled because the NJDEP Watershed Management was abolished.

Thus far, the SLWA has received support on this issue from State Legislators and the Coalition of Lake Associations. Administrator E. Klose agreed to contact Land Conservancy Representative S. Urgo on behalf of the Swartswood Lake and Watershed Association nonprofit agency that has worked closely with township officials to preserve land in the township. She noted that the Land Conservancy is well versed in Watershed Management.

Mr. Sprague stated that he was free to meet with Township Administrator E. Klose on July 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup> or 15<sup>th</sup> to discuss the matter further.




**DISCUSSION**
