FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

The last several weeks have been overwhelming in the lives of people in our nation. Natural disasters, violent protests, mass shootings, and more have been in the forefront of our lives. Our tears are renewed each time, and our hearts are broken. These are tumultuous times for a variety of reasons, and we offer our prayers for peace, for love, for respect and compassion.

We have the gifts within us to heal and to offer healing to others. Take the time to talk with friends, with neighbors, and with strangers. Stepping out of our comfort zones is risky business, but that is where the healing begins to take hold.

In the latest conversations on preventing gun violence I couldn't help but think of incidents from my youth. As a young teenager I was "required" by my mother's husband to learn how to shoot a hand gun and a rifle. Off we went into the woods for target practice and lessons. Who knew if he had any appropriate training in the use of guns, and I was not a consenting participant. A few times I asked "why" I had to learn these things and was met with the age-old "because I say you do." It was not lost on me that my mother's husband had spent a 90-day "Psych Hold" in the New York State hospital located in Binghamton, New York. Apparently, unhappy with a relative, he entered their home with a shotgun and blew apart the furniture in the house. Looking back on it now, I can't help but ask: how was he able to get guns after that and other incidents?" That is a good question, it seems to me.

In the wake of the Las Vegas shooting and too many others, I am revisiting some of The Social Principles of the United Methodist Church, and I share some with you. If you have a moment, ponder these words:

The United Methodist Church urges "congregations to advocate at the local and national level for laws that prevent or reduce gun violence."

Some of those measures include:

Universal background checks on all gun purchases; Ratification of the Arms Trade Treaty;

Ensuring all guns are sold through licensed gun retailers; Prohibiting all individuals under restraining order due to threat of violence from purchasing a gun;

Ensuring greater access to needed services for those who have mental illness;

Establishing a minimum age of 21 years for a gun purchase or possession;

Banning large capacity ammunition magazines and weapons designed to fire multiple rounds each time the trigger is pulled;

Promoting new technologies to aid law-enforcement agencies to trace crime guns and promote public safety. (UMC Book of Resolutions, 3428)


So Here Is the Worship Plan
