Moqui Marble by Mrs. Trumbo

Moqui Marble concretions are found near Utah and Arizona's sandstone hills. The marbles are iron-oxide coated sandstone balls, exposed when weather erodes away the surrounding softer material.

Moqui marbles, also called "Martian blueberries" (evidence of water on Mars?), are usually banded round balls, a size so small that many can be held in one hand.

Black or grey in color, they simply are mineralized or glued particles of sand, formed as water percolates through sandstone over centuries of time.
