Jesus and Blues Clues? Read further

with Pastor Eric

For a few days in August, the Kimpel family went to a Fan Expo in Chicago. At this convention, we participated in various panels about people and experiences of Pop-culture. To put it bluntly...it was a nerd convention ③ which was filled with creatives of all types. I sat in on a panel with Steve Burns, who hosted the children's show, <u>Blues Clues</u> in the mid to late 90's. He impacted many people now in their 20's like my daughter and son in many ways like **Mr. Roger's Neighborhood** did for me.

A fan asked Steve what he learned while performing and producing this show over his five seasons. He responded that he learned two things:

- 1. When faced with a problem, or having a new experience, stay curious, ask questions, and approach it with awe and wonder (like a child).
- 2. Never be afraid to ask for help of any kind.

Steve left the show in the early 2000's because he was suffering from imagination fatigue (*yes there is such a thing*), and depression, which he struggled with for many years. Once he left a rumor went around that he was dead, and no matter what he did to dispel it – it only grew! Early social media messing around with "alternative facts or fake news". His depression got worse

and what brought him through were these two lessons from that show.

Jesus teaches us these same two lessons but first we must remember what he says about entering the Kingdom of God! ¹⁴But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is too such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. ¹⁵Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." (Mark 10:14-15).

With this approach to the world and life, we learn as a child with curiosity and awe – rather than judgement and narrow-mindedness. In a way, Jesus modeled this attitude for us, Jesus asked as many questions as he made statements and sometimes answering a question with a question (*ex. Luke 10:25-28*).

And he prayed all the time and teaches us to do the same! Jesus asked for help from his Father at every turning point in his ministry, and we should as well. We expect our children to ask for help and seek guidance from others, especially parents and God does as well.

As we begin this new school year, we have an opportunity to be the children that we are and face this year with a thirst to learn and ask and pray and seek guidance as we grow...and I mean all of us – children of God!

Let us pray. Heavenly Father, open our hearts and minds to learn from you this new academic year in confirmation, in children's church, in Bible study, in worship and in every experience in daily life so that we might receive what is needed to help us grow as your children, in Jesus's name. Amen.

- Connect provides activities and questions to help participants apply the truth found in Scripture to their lives
- Vision suggests activities for additional growth during the week to come

- Parsonage Renovations Update
 - Going really well

 - Overall looks really nice inside.
 - Need to sand some hardwood floors and apply finish
 - Kicking of can is over with parsonage, looking good.
 - It was discussed whether it makes sense to forgo collecting rent for two months in exchange for labor by tenant to scrape, clean and otherwise improve the property.
- Sound system
 - Need to revisit the sound project
 - Richter will speak with Dovre, would like to conclude this before end of the year.
 - Work on refreshing quotes as a next step
 - This is important to those who attend remotely
 - Larson's son-in-law, Joe, is interested in looking into a quote.
- Powerline easement

- VBS Balance is negative, need to reconcile and fund the balance from treasury.
 - Pote moved to reconcile
 - Shelton seconded
- Altar Guild meeting regarding backroom by Pote
 - Still seeing mouse droppings and is also generally disorganized
 - When everyone is back from summer, will be upcoming meeting to talk about what to do next.
 - Some ideas are to eliminate exterior wall. Need space to hang paraments.
- September meeting
 - Work through normal agenda and then do a church tour to address what needs to be done?
 - Make a list of plans for each room to create a direction.






