Castner Range National Monument Update

As you are no doubt aware, Castner Range was declared a National Monu-



ment by President Biden on March 21, 2023. The land is protected but it still remains closed to public access for the time being because of the presence of unexploded ordnance (UXO). The Army, who will be managing the monument, is in the process of planning UXO cleanup operations and will also be determining what areas are safe to

open to the public. Thus, it may take a few more years of cleanup and planning before trails will be opened.


AT FEATHER LAKE

Since the irrigation season started in mid-May, Feather Lake has received small intermittent deliveries of irrigation water. Some flowed in from upstream after being discharged into the Mesa Drain. Some back-flowed into Feather Lake through its outlet after being discharged immediately downstream of the lake basin. In each case, only portions of the basin were flooded.

At this writing, El Paso Water has not yet started its planned work to install two new gates at the Feather Lake outlet, but it is getting ready. In June, it cleared and widened the road leading around the west side of the basin to accommodate the equipment that will be used for the construction.

Since 2010, Feather Lake has experienced a prolonged period of limited water availability. The result has been the loss of many of the cottonwoods and willows that once ringed the lake...and the expansion of western honey mesquite throughout the property. During our June 10 workday, a Bell's Vireo was singing in some of those mesquites near the basin outlet. It was the first new bird species detected at the lake in over a decade.

The next workday at Feather Lake will be **Sat., August 12** starting at **8 a.m.** Join us. Who knows? The lake may have water then. Or we may get another avian surprise. Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.

Water deliveries to Rio Bosque from the Roberto Bustamante Wastewater Treatment Plant resumed




May 1, and deliveries of irrigation water began May 23. Slowly but surely, water advanced in the old river channel within the park until it finally reached the channel's downstream end on June 25. Summer birds now in residence include Yellow-billed Cuckoo, Bell's Vireo, Yellow-breasted Chat, Summer Tanager, Blue Grosbeak and Painted Bunting.
