




As part of St. Augustine's long-term sustainability strategy, Father Angus, the Finance Council, and the Local Pastoral Council decided to sell the rectory. This sale will bring in much-needed cash and lower annual parish operating expenses. Our sales goal is to work with the non-profit sector focussed on housing vulnerable citizens to complement our parish's social justice mission. The Archbishop of the Moncton Diocese is completely aware and is very supportive of the sale of the rectory and does have the final decision on the terms of sale. We entertained two proposals and are now finalizing a Purchase and Sale Agreement with one of the organizations. We had two meetings with parish committee representatives to advise them of our plan and progress. Parish offices for the staff will move to the Villa basement and Father Angus will work out of the church sacristy. We will keep parishioners informed of our progress. We ask for your prayers and support as we pursue this new chapter in our parish. God Bless.

St. Augustine's Financial Summary

Father Angus and your Finance Council members would like to take this opportunity to provide a 2020 church financial summary. Our church has done well in this exceptionally challenging COVID-19 period, and our parishioners' generosity is a big part of this success. Our council thanks you for your generous donations.

The bank account balance was \$148,200 on December 31, 2020,

compared to \$112,200 on December 31, 2019, an increase of \$36,000.

Total revenue for 2020 was \$336,000 compared to \$378,900 in 2019, a reduction of \$42,900. Cash collection was down by \$28,300 and envelopes by \$31,300; however, this was partially offset by a \$14,200 increase in pre-authorized payments. For parishioners currently not on pre-authorized payments, please give serious consideration to this option.

In 2020, in response to the uncertainties of COVID-19, the federal government introduced the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy which provided the church with \$30,100 in revenues. The amounts received per month reduced as the pandemic progressed in 2020, and the amounts received each month are expected to be smaller in 2021.

Total expenses for 2020 were \$290,900 compared to \$389,900 in 2019, a reduction of \$99,000. The main expense reductions were: Salaries \$34,600; Maintenance \$14,800; Heat \$17,500; Electricity \$4,400; food and lodging \$9,600; and church goods \$5,900.

Net income was \$45,100 for 2020 compared to negative \$11,000 for 2019, an increase of \$56,100.

We continue to ask for your generous support as we have several postponed capital expenditures that must be addressed: heating system, front steps, energy efficient lighting, and parking lot paving.

Exploring our Faith

God IS L-O-V-E

Often in our lives we experience darkness in some way. Whether it be when the power goes out, if we drive through a tunnel, or simply pull a blanket over our heads. These are instances of literal darkness. What about those times where our darkness could be an internal struggle, such as a battle with addiction, mental health issues or simply grief and loss of a loved one. We have all been there. Rest assured that this darkness is balanced out by light, as is mentioned in both the second reading and in the gospel.

The gospel according to John uses the metaphor of light to describe God as light and Jesus as light. Jesus tells Nicodemus, who comes to him in the dark of night, that whoever lives in truth lives in light. We know that there cannot be life without light. We as humans have a tendency of hiding in the darkness. Notice that when Jesus says that the Son of God is light for the world, he is not just talking about making everything bright and sunny, "*but those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God*". He is talking about bringing to



light things that we are ashamed of and want to keep hidden. And yet his purpose is not to condemn the world, but rather to set things right because if nothing changes, all will indeed be lost. God has intervened out of love and by responding to that love, by aligning ourselves with God and his way of doing things, we are saved.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." (John 3:16) This, in my opinion, is one of the most beautiful verses in the Bible. It is one that, as a hopeless optimist, gives me so much hope. I mentioned before in another reflection, when writing about this verse, that John 3:16 hit the top of Google's hottest searches in 2009, thanks to Tim Tebow. I believe it's worth pointing out that it is still one of the most researched verses and that Mr. Tebow was a great light, shining to others what we already know, that God is love. Love is God's very nature, and it should be our nature too since we were created in His image and likeness. God's immense love for the world, which he expresses by giving us his Son (and to which the only appropriate response is for us to now love others as Jesus does), becoming ourselves channels of God's love for the world. Like Tim Tebow, let us go out and shine bright the love of God.

Catechetical Gatherings: Given that Zone 1 has moved to Yellow Phase of COVID-19 Recovery, beginning Sunday, March 14 catechetical sessions will now return to in-person gatherings for those who were part of that format previously. The Province of New Brunswick indicates the following on the website respecting indoor formal gatherings, under which criteria this would fall: "Occupancy limits are based on capacity of facility to maintain physical distancing of people who are not members of the same household or Steady15 and are to be no more than 50% of the facility's capacity. Continuous mask use is required. Record keeping for participants is required to facilitate contact tracing." Our parishes will ensure that this criterion is followed.

Laudato Si' – A Canadian Response Laudato Si' was an encyclical letter written by Pope Francis in 2015 to all the people of the world to bring to our attention to the fact that the earth "cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her." (LS2) In 2017, the Episcopal Commission for Justice and Peace with the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops prepared *Living Out Laudato Si: A Commentary and Practical Resource for Canadian Catholics* in response to this encyclical.
