



**GIVE GENEROUSLY:
THE BENEFICIARY MIGHT BE YOU!**

"In this world nothing can be said to be certain, except death and taxes".

This was said by Benjamin Franklin in 1789 commenting on the fairly new Constitution of the United States. Clearly, this was not a familiar saying to Jesus, for if it had been, it may have been the answer he would have given to the Pharisees and the Herodians when they posed the question we read about in this week's gospel. Such an off-the-cuff response would have been appropriate considering the motives behind their question. They were trying to trap Jesus in a lose-lose situation. If he answers yes, then he is condoning and even supporting the tyrannical rule of the pagan Romans over God's chosen people; if he says no, then he is vulnerable to arrest by the Romans as an enemy of the state. Jesus' answer is so clever, it resonates with us even today; "give to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's".

In my years in the work force as both manager and employee, I have yet to come across anyone who is thrilled about paying taxes. There is usually a great deal of complaining about government bureaucracy and the wasting of tax payer's dollars. I very seldom, if ever, hear anyone comment on how nice Wheeler Blvd. is now that it's paved, or how much they appreciate being able to get to work on time thanks to the road being plowed after the latest winter blast; or the fact that we can visit a doctor or hospital anytime day or night without worry about ability to pay. (This last one hit home after spending time on retreat in the United States this summer). So, when Jesus tells us; "give to Caesar (Justin Trudeau) what belongs to Caesar"; let's do so gladly, because this place we call home is not so bad.

Jesus also tells us; "to give to God the things that are God's". The question for me here is; what things do I have that belong to God? The short answer is everything. If I look at my life, the good, the bad and the ugly, as total gift from God, then this mission that Jesus is calling me to today is far from simple. It's going to involve a much larger commitment from me than just showing up at mass on Sunday, putting money in collection and being nice to SOME folks throughout the week. To paraphrase another parable, I had better do something good with the coin the master has entrusted to me.

So, how do I go about giving back to God the things that belong to God? I believe I give to God best when I give to God's people. If I can give the smallest glimpse of God's kingdom in the way I treat the people God puts in my path each day, then I am on the right path. But I have no illusions; I am not going to get this right every time. It's going to require a great deal of effort and involve a fair amount of discouragement. The most important thing for me is that I do this with a grateful heart because the investment I am making is worth it. This kingdom that I am building, which we will all call home one day, is a pretty nice place too.

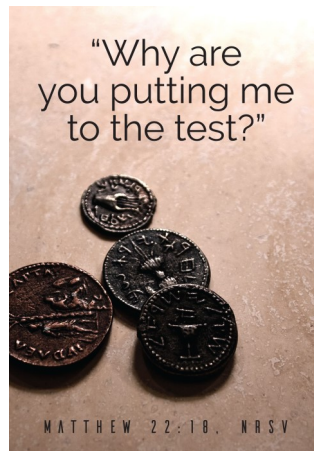

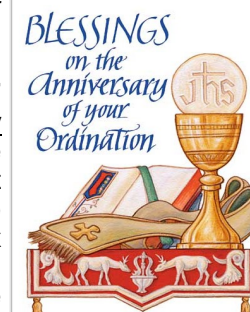
