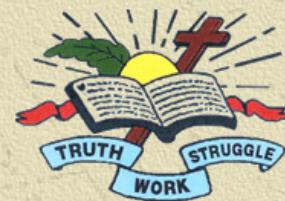

MAKING PIEROGI IS A LABOR OF LOVE...

A tireless group of workers, lead by Jean Doda, make the pierogi, golabki and kapusta that is offered for sale by St. Casimir's parish. This effort has proven a good source of income for the parish.

Although the 'pierogi' team may vary from time to time, it usually includes: Mae Zioto, Josie Wrobel, Wanda Hedrick, Alice Rosmus, Walter Sott, Sophie Kosidlo, Cheryl Grieve, JoAnn Menzia, Janice Klimczak, Father Andrew and Agnes Tenus.

Shopping for ingredients is done by Jean and Janice or Pat Whiting. The filling is prepared on Monday and on Tuesday the crimping team arrives. *Kulki* are made to insure that each pierogi is filled equally. The dough is prepared, rolled out and cut into circles. Finally the crimpers fill and crimp, making sure each one is properly sealed. In the kitchen, Walter and Jean check and cook the pierogi. Cheryl butters, packages and prepares the delicacies for freezing.

Their reward for a hard day's work is a free lunch prepared by members of the team.
