## **Veterans, women and immigration (DACA) issues to dominate LULAC convention**

The Texas League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC) annual convention and expo is expected to be dominated by veteran's, women's, immigration (DACA) issues and politics beginning Thursday, May 31<sup>st</sup> at the Tropicano Riverwalk Hotel - San Antonio, according to Lupe Torres, Texas LULAC State Director.

City of San Antonio Mayor Ron Nirenberg has been invited to speak. Bexar County Judge Nelson W. Wolff will participate in kicking off the convention that will feature a health, according to Torres.

A senior's breakfast will be held Friday June 1, 2018. George B. Hernandez, Jr., JD, President and CEO of the Bexar County University Health System, will be the keynote speaker. Eva Trevino, Community Service Manager, from WellMed Medical Management, Inc. will be the guest speaker. WellMed is a diversified healthcare company. Rodolfo "Rudy" Martinez, Texas Deputy Director for the Elderly, and Angie Garcia, senior advisor on elderly issues, will give welcoming remarks. Rita Vidaurri, a well-known pioneer singer from San Antonio, will perform.

A veterans' workshop on Friday, open to area veterans, will be hosted by Román Palomares, Chairman of the LULAC National Veterans Affairs Committee, and Gibby Rodriguez, Texas State Co-Chair for Veterans Affairs. A luncheon will honor veterans from the military branches and all previous wars. Palomares is Chief of Staff to LULAC National President Roger C. Rocha, Jr. of Laredo and has previously served as a Texas LULAC state director.

A women's luncheon will be held Saturday, June 2, 2018. The Texas Deputy Director for Women is Marta E. Diaz of Houston. The keynote speaker Sandy Storm, author and writer on human trafficking, is a child sex trafficking survivor. The Honorable Bexar County Court-at-Law #3 Judge Crystal Chandler will be the guest speaker.

The Young Adults LULAC councils will sponsor a townhall meeting focusing on issues impacting minority communities such as education, immigration (DACA), and economic opportunities on Saturday at 3:30 pm. Manuel Rendon, Texas Deputy for Young Adults, stresses that the townhall meeting is opened to the general public.

The Texas State LULAC Director's reception and awards banquet will be held Saturday evening. Fernando Reyes, a former LULAC Rey Feo and president of Reyes Automotive Group, will have a message for the LULAC youth members. The Reyes group provides world class trim components for vendors like Toyota. Keynote speaker for Saturday evening will be Texas Senator José Menéndez of San Antonio.

In addition to the official events, convention officials have received confirmation that two National LULAC presidential candidates will be in attendance to promote their candidacy for President of the National LULAC organization. The two will host individual "meet the candidate" events.

Domingo Garcia, a prominent practicing civil rights attorney lives in Dallas and Darryl Morin, a long-time LULAC leader in the Midwest and at national level, are the two announced candidates.

Garcia is a former member of the Texas Legislature and former member of the Dallas City Council. Garcia says that he "will work to increase the LULAC membership to one million and will work to address issues affecting Hispanics in the United States".

Morin's campaign states that Morin is committed "to recovering and reforming LULAC; to rebuilding its national office and returning LULAC to fiscal stability; to developing needed programs; enhancing its advocacy efforts and ensuring that every member has their views heard."

Elections for new Texas LULAC statewide officers will be conducted Sunday, June 3, 2018. The National President election bid will take place at the LULAC National Convention July 17-21, 2018 in Phoenix, Arizona.
