The PTA meeting was called to order by Jessica Lieder at 6:38 p.m.

Stacey McReynolds made a motion to approve the June PTA meetings as written, seconded by Nora Pencola. The motion Passed.

Administrative Updates - Principal Lorden

Principal Lorden provided an update on the current school enrollment. There are currently 731 students enrolled. We are working with our current staffing levels. 2 of the kindergarten classes are very large. On September 16th the District will look at the enrollment at each school. We are 7 students shy of requiring another teacher according to district rules. Principal Lorden has been talking with District staff about additional staffing options. Teachers are doing great a job with the situation.

Issuing a call for School Site Council nominations. Please pick up a form on your way out. Have 2 open seats for parents. Nominations are due to the main office by Sept. 30th. Parents vote for other parents October 3-12. First meeting is the 17th of October.

We are starting to see the new building going up. Air conditioning is now up and running in most classrooms. There will be an update from the architect at the October PTA meeting.

Halloween Carnival Update – Jill Parkey jillparkey@yahoo.com – have most of the elements in place – laser tag, twist and spin, big trikes, mini golf, a few games, haunted house and haunted bus. Food truck, steaming hotdogs, cotton candy, 4 shades/canopies, a yoga booth. Really need help from other parents. Bring in prizes and put them in the prize can in the cafetorium. Need help with the food court – someone to operate it. More information will be provided at the room rep meeting. Help needed with clean-up and set-up. Need to get some sponsors. Dana Lingard is heading up the cakewalk. The Friday before need help to collect cakes in the morning and later in the day need to move the cakes to a classroom at the end of the school day.

Imagine Campaign – Vivica Hess

Overview of the Imagine Campaign which funds the science and art programs at Grant. Donations are 100% tax deductible and can be done on a monthly basis. Imagine campaign will be at the major events.

Imagine Campaign – Kristen Boyd – introduced the Board members and also thanked Ginger Tyson for her many years of service to the Foundation. The Foundation needs a secretary. The Foundation is a 5013c – mission to enhance the academic achievement in STEAM areas. It creates and maintains an ongoing fund source for the science coordinator. The STEAM programs on the agenda are specifically funded by the Foundation. The majority of the funds raised are get the turned over to the PTA for the science coordinator and art teacher. This year there are some new developments – we are trying to move up the timing of the next phase of the school construction. As part of the on-going building project we are relocating the Gecko Garden to the front of the school food court. It is currently estimated to cost approximately \$100,000 cost to relocate the garden (maybe less). Will more centrally located on the campus. The capital campaign is looking to raise a couple of million dollars in the next years to complete the rest of the campus improvement. The City of San Diego would also partner on a joint use gym and regulation size soccer field. Any donations to the capital campaign are 100% tax deductible. Will be selling pavers – smaller are \$300, and large pavers for \$1000.

Mission Hills 5K- Kristen Boyd

The Mission Hills 5K will be held on March 18, 2017. They are looking for sponsors. There was great support from families on race day last year.

Next Generation Science Standards

Committee of parents and teachers are looking at the new science standards and are looking to see what teachers will need to help implement the standards. Have purchased some initial science gadgets and curriculum. Provided 17 scholarships to families this year for the after-school enrichment classes.

ASB Update – Katie Hanson – leading ASB. Haven't had elections yet. Will giving speeches next week and will have elections next Friday. October 4th will be the first ASB meeting. ASB Students will help with the Halloween Carnival, Halloween Dance, and Red Ribbon week.

A motion to release the funds, not to exceed the budgeted amounts for the assemblies, field trips, art and music, and ASB funds was made by Lara Gates and seconded by Ginger. The motion passed.

Erik Karpinski, made a motion that the running club is under the auspices of the PTA for insurance purposes. The motion was seconded by Lara Gates. The motion passed.

Treasurer Report

Treasurer Report – Lance Harris was out of town so Dan Sakai gave the report. We are winding up the books from last year. They will be audited by Vicki Knapp. Will ratify the expenses from last year at the October meeting. In August we filed our application to the State Department to authorize our ability to do raffles.

For the months of July and August we had expenses for \$11,857 and \$1,494 respectively. We approved a \$300 advance to teachers for supplies. Teachers will submit receipts. September funds were over \$16,000 for school subscriptions and nursing supplies. Funds were provided to Principal Lorden and an expense report will be provided to the PTA. Have made some minimal expenses for the Halloween Carnival. A motion to approve the July 2016 and August 2016 expenditures was made by Nora Pincole, seconded by Ginger Tyson. The motion passed.
