What Think Ye of Christ, Whose Son Is He?

"Acquaint now thyself with him, and be at peace, thereby good shall come unto thee." Job 22:21.

"All things are delivered unto me of my Father, and no man knoweth the Son, but the Father. Neither knoweth any man the Father save the Son and he to whomsoever the Son will reveal him." Matt. 11:27.

"Whom do men say that I, the Son of man am? Some say, John the Baptist, some Elias, others say Jeremias,—But whom say ye that I am?—Thou are the Christ the Son of the living God.—Blessed art thou Simon Bar-Jona for flesh and blood hath not revealed it unto thee,

but my Father which is in heaven." Matt. 16:13-17.

True Christianity depends on a correct Scriptural answer to this question, as to whether or not Jesus of Nazareth was the Son of God. That such a person lived in Judea some nineteen hundred years ago, that such an individual was the son of a woman whose name was Mary who was of the house and lineage of David are accepted facts, but children must have a father as well as a mother, and as this woman Mary was living in legal wed-lock with a man whose name was Joseph who was also of the house and lineage of David, at the time Jesus was born would establish the point that he was a descendant of David, both as to his mother and legal father. But while Joseph was the legal father of the child, he was only so in the point of law. While he was not so in fact, true Gospel faith requires that we believe the record that God has given of His Son, otherwise we make God a liar. I Jn. 5:10.

The question then if Jesus was only the son of Joseph in point of

Sanctification

Webster defines the word, Sanctify: To cleanse, to purge, to purify, to set apart. I have always felt that if he had possessed the actual experience he would have put it thus: To set apart, to cleanse, to purge, to purify. Certainly, the setting apart comes first. We set ourselves apart to do God's will when we meet the condition of consecration and faith, then God sets us apart to be His.

People contend there is no second definite work of Grace mentioned in the Bible. Let's see, Eph. 2:8, "For by Grace ye are saved, through faith: and that not of of yourselves; it is the gift of God," (step No. 1) Rom. 5:1-2, "Therefore being justified by faith we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. By whom also, we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand and rejoice in the hope of the glory of God." (step No. 2).

When we make use of this access and by consecration and faith, meet the condition, we have the witness of the spirit that the work is done. That makes it definite.

What is it to have access? If a man is in want — destitute, and someone who had all the things necessary for his needs would give him bread, potatoes, beans, bacon, sugar, etc., he would have those things, but, if the man added, now don't let your family suffer, when you need other things come and ask me and I'll

give them. He wouldn't as yet have the other things promised but merely have access to them and there was no promise that he would get them unless he asked. If he had no faith in the promise and didn't seek for them he wouldn't receive them.

The two scriptures quoted nullify the idea sometimes set forth, "I got it all at once." It doesn't come that way. Sometimes people ask, "Are you Sanctified?" to receive this answer, "Oh yes, I was Sanctified ten years ago." That isn't the question, it isn't what you were, but what you ARE.

God, looking years ahead, might see that you would violate your consecration some time, yet he doesn't withhold the blessing. It isn't what you were or will be but what you ARE that counts. "Today is the da yof salvation" but if you keep your salvation you must maintain your integrity, your conservation.

Recently, someone wrote to a friend that if God sent him to a place that he knew would cause him grief and heartache he would go anyway. The friend considered that a wonderful consecration; the only thing wonderful about it is the God to whom he consecrated.

Everyone that has been Sanctified has made the same promise, though perhaps not in the same words. When we say, "I'll go where you want me to go Dear Lord" and "have thine own way Lord" let's mean it and then keep on meanin git. A Sanctified life is the only safe life, it is so comforting, so satisfying just to turn everything over to the Lord and let Him take complete control.

Questions and Answers

Used On "Gospel of the Kingdom" Radio Broadcast

WHAT DOES THE 5 V. OF ISA, 53 MEAN?

We note four separate statements in this verse: the first. "But He was wounded for our transgressions": This is beyond any doubt speaking of the Sacrifice of Jesus' Blood for forgiveness of our sins, our transgressions. The second statement: "He was bruised for our iniquities," is a clear statement concerning the Double work of the blood and this second for the iniquity of the heart or Carnality; thus we have an atonement for forgiveness and also for cleansing from the nature of sin by Sanctification.

The next or third part of the verse speaks of the chastisement of our peace being upon Him or He bore the suffering for sin which we would have borne had it not been laid upon Him and by His chastisement our peace is made with God when we appropriate that sacrifice by faith. The last statement in this verse is so plain, and yet so many have tried to twist and change it to so many other things. But let us say in simple, easy to understand words that the breaking of His body was for, and does yet, bring physical healing from every sickness or disease. Thanks be unto God for the Stripes of Calvary, by which we are healed.

WHEN DID JUDAS ISCARIOT BACKSLIDE OR FALL?

A. The answer to this question is, Judas never was converted or had anything to backslide from. Someone will say, he was one of the twelve. That is true but he never was a disciple at heart.

Early in the ministry of Jesus we find Jesus saying, "Have I not chosen you twelve and one of you is a devil (present tenses). He was to betray Jesus, thus tulfilling the prophecy of Gen. 3:15 wherein it was said "there would be enmity between satan and the woman and between her seed and Satan's seed. Just as Jesus was God incarnate so was Judas, Satan Incarnate or the seed of Satan.

WHAT WILL OUR BEING AND STATE OF EXISTENCE BE LIKE IN HEAVEN?

A. The question as to whether we will have a real bodily existence and power of recognition of others seems to be one which is of much interest to many, and it should be, for there are so many mythical conceptions of this matter that many are confused about it.

We wish to say first, and in a plain statement that we will have a body and physical features and will recognize one another.

As for our Biblical substantiation of this statement let us consider a few scriptures: First, in Lk. 24:36-43 we find Jesus after His resurrection appearing to His disciples telling and showing them that he had flesh and bones and He also had retained the physical marking of the nails in

His hand and feet. He was so real in His bodily existence that he actually ate food in their presence. Now we know the Bible does positively teach that His saints will be raised in the likeness of

His resurrected body.

Some one will say, but the Bible savs flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God. what about that? The Bible does not contradict itself, and it is true that flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God or in other words, our flesh and blood lines will not give us entrance into heaven no matter how noble or royal may be the family tree or how great or how small, we will not enter by these things; then too, I am sure we will not have blood flowing in our bodes then; here blood is the life source of these mortal bodies while then the spirit of Christ will be the life source of the immortal bodies.

Many other scriptures teach us of a bodily existence and power of recognition, which we mention a few. briefly: Lk. 13:28-29, tells us that we will see and recognize Abraham, Isaac and Jacob in the kingdom and sit down with them to enjoy the eternal bliss of God's love. In Mat. 17:1-4 we read the scripture concerning the Transfiguration of Jesus and find Peter recognizing Moses and Time will not permit a further treatise on this matter but let us say in conclusion, that the realities of eternal life and our existence there is one of the grandest rewards in the whole plan of God. Friends, please crase for all time, the mythical thoughts concerning heaven and take God's wonderful realities as they are.

"The March of World Empires"

An Outlined Study of the Book of Daniel

As we begin another study of the wonderful Prophetic truths contained in the Book of Daniel it is with a prayer from our hearts; O GOD GIVE US THE UNDERSTANDING NEEDED THAT WE MAY PREPARE OURSELVES FOR THE DAYS AND EVENTS WHICH ARE AHEAD AND THAT WE MAY ALSO HELP OTHERS TO FIND THE WAYS OF THY SALVATION.

We closed the previous article with the consummation of the study of the first six chapters, now we enter the latter half of this book and trust we shall find great events foretold in such a manner as will inspire our hearts to prepare for the hour of REDEMPTION OF THE BODY AND THE USHERING IN OF A REIGN OF PEACE AND RIGHTEOUSNESS.

Will you now please read the entire seventh chapter of Daniel?

It has already been mentioned that many have attempted to align the Beasts which will present themselves in this study of Chap. 7: with individual nations; sometimes as follows: The Lion, Great Britain or England, the Bear, as Russia, the Leopard, as Italy, etc., but the writer has never been able to find Scriptural substantiation for such and therefore must take the position that these four Beasts are the

identical World Empires that were revealed to Nebuchadnezzar in his Image dream rather than to make a presumption that they are single nations.

Before we go further into this exposition let us note that Daniel is in a very different position in this chapter from that which we have found him previously; In this event we find him as the one to whom the vision was given and he must deepnd on a Heavenly interpreter, whereas, in the former events someone else received the vision or dream and Daniel was the interpreter. There must be some specific reason for this.

WHY WAS DANIEL IN THE POSITION OF RECEIVING THE VISION, AND WHY WAS IT GIVEN IN THE FORM OF BEASTS?

To Daniel was revealed the rise and fall of Empires as concerned the Spiritual course and destiny of peoples and nations, while to Nebuchadnezzar and others were revealed the natural phases of these things; thus we find the reason for the Image dream as revealing the natural course of events while to Daniel in the form of Beasts, a symbol of the spiritual forces of Satan which were to hold forth in the successive World Empires.

Since Daniel was a prophet to the Gentiles, (he was not of the Gentile people, but prophecied largely of the times of the Gentiles and how it would affect his own people, the Jews) we should expect, and will find many important prophecies to the people of this very time in which we are living.

WHEN WAS THIS VISION OF THE BEASTS GIVEN?

The answer is very simple, yet very important, in order to time these events with the Empires they represented. It was given during the yet existant Babylonish Empire. We wish to emphasize here that verses 2 and 3 are the introduction to the entire chapter.

WHAT IS MEANT BY "THE

GREAT SEA"?

It will be helpful if we can understand why the term, "The Great Sea" was used in this passage. The expression has, no doubt, both a literal and symbolic interpretation. Literally, what is the Great Sea? The Mediterranean. Why then is the term important? It is located, so far as Bible events are concerned, in the geographical center of the world and has through the ages again Biblically speaking, and also secular history played the most important part of all the oceans in the course of empires.

It is great because it is touched by so many continents, it is greater yet because around its shores have risen and fallen ALL THE GREAT WORLD EMPIRES.

Symbolically, it refers to the great masses of humanity, when Daniel spoke of the four winds of heaven striving upon it this was no doubt referring to the political trends and powers of the passing centuries.

Now let us give careful attention to the identifying of the four Beasts.

OF WHAT WERE THE FOUR BEASTS SYMBOLIC?

To answer the question in a general term we would say, of FOUR SUCCESSIVE WORLD EMPIRES.

The first was like a Lion, had Eagles wings, the wings were plucked off, it was lifted up, stood upon the feet as a man, a man's heart was given unto it. Now let us compare, The Lion is regarded as king of beasts. Was not Nebuchadnezzar a king above other kings? and Babylon an empire above other empires previous to that time? and we dare say, to this time. This King and his empire was well portrayed as a Lion and also as the Head of Gold.

Some one will say did not the Eagles wings represent the United States? We will answer that question with another: If the Eagles wings here represented the United States why not say then that the wings on Leopard in a later verse also represented the United States? and the Eagles wings mentioned in Rev. 12 as representing the United States? yet we never try to make such application of these. Friends we must not jump at conclusions or take previous traditions but rather seek to rightly divide the scripture. Surely the Eagles wings did perfectly portray the swiftness of the rise of the Babylonish Empire and the height to which it soared. And did not that sudden rise in all its swiftness come to a sudden halt as if the wings were plucked off?

It is indeed true that Nebuchadnezzar's pride and being lifted up in himself is clearly pictured in the beast standing as if on the feet of a man. "A man's heart was given to it"; some will say that is representative of the Christianity of America; What is the way of man's heart? Is it the way of Christianity? NO. Man's heart has continually gone away from God and the ways of Christianity until God changes that heart.

The giving of a man's heart is so clearly set forth in the course of Nebuchadnezzar's life as we remember his attitude and words concerning his mighty Empire. "Is not this great Babylon, that I have built for the house of the kingdom by the might of MY power, and for the honour of MY majesty?" No wonder things were revealed to him in the form of an Image of a man. Truly that and the following empires have been an age of man, going after the ways of a man's heart.

The wings were plucked off. "While the word was in the king's mouth, there fell a voice from heaven, saying, O King Nebuchadnezzar, to thee it is spoken; The kingdom is departed from thee."

Let us also remember the sudden end of the Babylonish Empire at the time of Belshazzar's blasphemous feast. How completely was the entire Babylonish Empire portrayed in the Lion.

The second Beast was like to a bear, raised itself on one side, had three ribs in its mouth. This can compare to nothing else as completely as it does to the MediaPersian Empire, the successor of the Lion, or Babylonish Empire.

Let us compare; to the two arms of Media-Persia, or the Silver Empire, the Persian side of the dual Empire became much the stronger, thus raising itself on one side, it had three ribs in its mouth, between its teeth, (already won victories) and these ribs were in league with the bear.

The request of the ribs was, "arise and devour much flesh" and that is exactly what the Media-Persian Empire did.

By way of comparison let us note that according to history there were three major conquests attributed to Cyrus the Great, which gave him a greate Ermpire so far as territory is concerned than Babylon ever held. These conquests were: First, Media, second, Lydia, third, Babylon. These undoubtedly make up the three Ribs. The ensuing events show that devouring much flesh is exactly what this Empire did.

This same Empire is also represented in Dan. 8:3 as a Ram with two horns, and one horn higher than the other.

The third Beast: Like a Leopard, four wings on its back and had four heads.

Here we have a clear prophecy of the coming Grecian Empire, again we find wings, this time four. The history of Alexander the Great, the founder of the Grecian Empire is one of great swiftness of conquest and when he had conquered the then known world and that at a very youthful age we are told that he wept because there were no more worlds to conquer; yet at a very early age he came to his untimely death because of his liecntous and immoral life.

The four wings represented the four leading Generals of Alex ander the Great and their ability and the swiftness of their conquests, also the four heads were fulfilled in these at the time of Alexander's death and their acquisition of the Empire and its division into four parts, namely, Syria, Egypt, Macedonia and Asia-minor.

For a fuller prophetic description of this Empire read Dan. 8:4-8.

The fourth Beast: A non-descript Beast so dreadful and terrible, strong and exceedingly, devouring, iron teeth, stamping with THE FEET, Ten horns and A LITTLE HORN.

This Beast which was so terrible that Daniel could not find a name is a full description of the Roman Empire not only in its first stage but also inclusive of the restored Roman Empire of the close of the Gentile Dispensation with its Association of Nations as the Ten Horns or Ten Toes, the stamping with the Feet can be only one thing, the oppression and persecution of that time and the rise of the LITTLE ANTI-CHRIST HORN or World Dominion.

There is one truth which we wish to emphasize here. Many people think of the Roman Em-

pire as being non-existant through the past several centuries. This is not entirely true, through the means of certain of its agencies it has remained very much alive and is hidden among the Nations of the world today, bideing its time to be restored to its prophetic status as this TERRIBLE NON-DESCRIPT BEAST IN ITS FINAL STATE.

This fourth Beast is very def initely described in Rev. 13:1-2, as a Beast embodying all the likeness of the fourth Beast of Daniel's Vision. How can this be? Certain tendencies and traits of all the preceding Empires are going to be carried down through the ages to manifest themselves in this last Beast thus fulfilling the many prophecies concerning the rise and reign of the Anti-Christ.

OF WHICH BEAST IN THIS VISION WAS DANIEL MOST CONCERNED?

It seems that Daniel was most concerned about the fourth, the last, and felt that specific and definite explanation was needed in regard to this one. Thus, almost all the remaining chapters were given to fully explain the Roman Empire in its first and more especially in its restored state and the rise of the Anti-Christ.

In order to fully and finally identify these four Beasts as to their place in world history we note the 23rd verse, where it tells us "The fourth beast shall be the fourth kingdom upon earth." Now we know there has been

many more than four kings or kingdoms on the earth if we think in terms of individual nations or kingdoms so then this can mean only one thing that the Image Dream of Nebuchadnezzar and the Vision of Daniel were both portraying this fact, including the Babylonish Empire, the Head of Gold, the Lion, there were to be four World Kingdoms or Empires to the time of the end and these were fulfilled in Babylon. Media-Persia, Greece, and Rome. O my friend, there can be no doubt but that we stand at the very threshold of the close of the dispensation and event spoken of in verses 9-10, 26-27 of this seventh chapter.

Some one will say what about the other kings spoken of in verse 24? Let us note that both the Ten Kings and the One King (the Anti-Christ) arise out of "this kingdom." What kingdom? The fourth, the Roman Empire. Thus we have the Restored Roman Empire in the Ten Kings and also that spoken of in Rev. 17:11 as the "Eighth" and here as "an-"another" king, this "Eighth" or "Another King" is the Anti-Christ. Yet this comes out of the Fourth Kingdom on the earth. Permit us to state once more that the fourth was the Roman Empire, the Ten Kings, the restored or revived Roman Empire and the "Another king" the Anti-Christ.

We come to the events spoken of in verses 9-10 and 26-27 concerning the judgment of nations at the Coming of Jesus. We have

a picture of the Throne of God with its attendants of "thousand thousands" ministering unto Him and because of the blasphemy of the "Horn" (Anti-Christ) hour of the judgment of the nations is set. (Here many confuse this with the White Throne Judgment). In verse 13 we find Jesus coming with the clouds about Him, to the Throne of God for the final orders to go and overthrow the Kingdoms of the earth, (Battle of Armegeddon) and take over the kingdoms of the world as His own whose rightful place it is to reign and to judge among the nations and the nations will learn war no more

"And the kingdom and dominion and the greatness of the kingdom under the whole heaven, shall be given to the people of the saints of the most High, whose kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and all dominions shall serve and obey Him." Dan. 7:27.

Thank God for His great wisdom and priceless rewards which are in store for those who are living in this present time. Stand fast and keep your faith in God for surely He cometh quickly to fulfill all things.

For I know whom I have believed and am persuaded that He is able to keep that which I have committed unto Him against that day. (II Timothy 1:2).

Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good wrks, glorifying your Father which is in heaven. (Matt. 5:16).

A RESOLUTION ADOPTED

The following is a resolution adopted at the annual camp meeting of the Original Apostolic Faith Movement held in Laverne, Oklahoma, August 7 to 18, 1940.

The Original Apostolic Faith Movement consists of hundreds of ministers and thousands of laymembers throughout the world who stand for the fundamental principals of the Word of God.

In a publicly announced meeting in which there was brought before this assembly with the opportunity of open discussion the question of our view in regard to compatant military service it was decided by unanimous vote that a committee should be appointed to draw up the resolution that expresses the sentiment of the movement represented at the camp meeting. Such rommittee was appointed which consists of Robert Girouard, Robert L. Parham and Ralph A. Durham, ministers of the Apostolic Faith Movement, with the approval of the meeting and drafted the following resolution:

We believe and stand for God first in everything, the Gospel of Jesus Christ as our doctrine and hold our country, our government and our flag in highest esteem and honor and gladly stand by it as far as the laws of God permit not only in peace but in war, yet we agree that according to the (Continued on page 19)

Why Does God Allow War?

Many people are asking questions along this line just now: Why does God allow war? Why does He not stop the war? Why does not Christ intervene? If Christ lives today, and Christians believe He does, why does He not do something? But this question might be enlarged into the same question concerning any great sin. Why does God allow drunkenness, for instance, with its resultant suffering in the lives of thousands of innocent children? Why does He allow dishonesty and gambling, with their resultant harm? Why does not God banish poverty and the unfairness that causes some of the poverty? So the question about war might be enlarged? Why does God allow any of the great wrongs that we see in the world?

It might also be enlarged into a question as to why God allows the catastrophic in nature — the earthquake with its destruction of property and human life, the cyclone, the flood, the fire. Oh, but you say in regard to the catastrophe, nature is controlled by law. Why not believe that nations, too, are controlled by law? They are under the moral government of God, and if they are in rebellion, they must pay the penalty.

It is still true "righteousness exalteth a nation: but sin is a reproach to any people." (Proverbs 14:34). It is more than poetry, it is the philosophy of history when the sacred writer says, "The wicked shall be turned into hell and all nations that forget God."

(Psalm 9:17). There is a penalty to be paid for forgetting God and denying and defying God. God may or may not intervene. He may or may not interfere with the affairs of nations, or in the affairs of individuals, but He is still God. He is still working toward a plan.

What right have the nations to peace? If some ask, why does God allow war? Why does not Christ do something? We ask, Why do not men do something Do men really want peace, or do they merely wish to be undisturbed in their rebellion against God? Most of the men who are calling for peace merely desire that their lives shall go on uninterrupted with their Sunday golf, their Monday bridge and Tuesday amusement, and their persistent struggle for money, and their total denial of God. But now they cry out in desperation. "We want peace," when they merely wish to be undisturbed in their sin.

You remember the title in type given to our Lord, "King of Righteousness and Prince of Peace." That is the order righteousness and peace-righteousness the root, and peace the fruit. But men want the fruit without having the root. They want peace, but they ignore righteousness. The nations have had many peace conferences. Did you ever hear of a righteousness conference? Let me remind you of what the apostle says: "I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, interces-

A Warning

As a Minister and co-worker in the cause of Christ, we feel the need to warn other Ministers and workers against a few things which will if not guarded against, cause a lot of grief and hinder the progress of the work of the Lord.

One does not necessarily have to be possessed of a streak of jealousy, nor have a tendency to wag the tongue to gender strife. Nor fail to have a love for the truth in order to allow the enemy to come in and do hurtful work through our lives. But if one fails to stay on the job for God and souls; if one parleys too lng, hoping a certain thing will happen so we will feel more free to work for God; that is the first gap opened for the devil to come in.

The harvest is white and the laborers are few. Shame on the Minister or Layman who will allow uncommendable talk concerning fellow-workers to go into the ear and out on the tongue! Methinks I see a million little poisonous arrows flying in every direction from that tongue, shooting first at the most influential members of the body of Christ.

He, or she must first convince the other fellow that the "Hearsay" is real, but the first thing they know they will wake up to the fact that the devil has started something that is not easily stopped. One may make restitutions to man and God and feel that God has for given all mistakes but the damage can not be erased from the field overnight.

Here are some rules which, if

followed may be helpful along this line:

First: Stay prayed up, let noth-

ing hinder your prayer life.

Second: Stand still long enough to discern the voice of the Lord, then heed his biddings. Let not men nor devils keep you from doing His will. Be sure God is speaking, then go ahead.

Third: If someone tells you something your Pastor or Evangelist has said that is not commendable, stop it at the ear; don't let it go through the head and out on the tongue. Nine tenths of "I hear" and "They say" is false and when strife is started it is difficult to stop.

Fourth: Resist the devil and he will flee from you; "Let love be without dissimulation." Pass on that which is good and commendable, bar that which is hurtful.

Fifth: If you feel that you have not been given due courtesy by fellow Ministers or workers just keep quiet, and pray until you don't feel the hurt or neglect; at least, pray until you don't have wrong feelings toward the other parties. The message you have or the song you would like to sing will keep until another opportunity is proffered.

Remember this: Where brotherly love is predominant no friction is found. "By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one for another." God help us all to grow in the Grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

We have written this article after wrestling with pride and self, and feel that perhaps it may (Continued on page 25)

law, whose son was he in fact? The answer emphatically, He was the son of God.

Some people might tell us that the phrase, the Son of God, although it is used about forty times in the New Testament comes far short of expressing the Divine relationship. That we must believe that Christ is the very God, God incarnate in human flesh, that if Christ is not all, even God and Father, then our worship is idolatry and vain. What is meant by worship? Does not the term express Reverential Obedience? It does, and if there is any idolatry in worshipping the Son in obedience to the Divine command I fail to see it; "When he bringeth in the first-begotten into the world, he saith, let all the Angels of God worship Him." Heb. 1:6.

Is obedience of the angels to the Divine word of God to be counted as idolatry? "God who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son." Heb. 1:2. Again, "As God could swear by

no greater, He swore by Himself." Heb. 6:13.

Jesus says, "My Father is greater than I." Jn. 14:28. Christ could not be greater than Himself, neither could he be his own father. Why not believe the record that God gave from heaven? saying, "This is

my Beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." Matt. 3:17.

"We made known unto you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, and were eye-witnesses of His majesty, for He received from God the Father honour and glory when there came such a voice to Him from the excellent glory, this is my Beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." II Pet. 1:17. Consider for a moment, from whom came this voice, was it from an angel? Was Christ the son of an angel? But if we believe that it came from God the Father, then we have the fact established beyond any successful contradiction and controversy, God the Father was personally in heaven while Christ His Son was on earth. Two persons united in one in the work of human redemption, this union is fully explained in Jn. 17:11.

"For God so loved the world that he gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in him should not perish but have everlasting

life." Jn. 3:16.

"Go ye therefore and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost." Matt. 28:19.
