February is the Month for Love By Pastor Tim

I guess because of St. Valentine's Day, February has become known as the month of love. That's pretty good, but the problem is how we often interpret the word 'love'. Some interpret love simply as a feeling or emotion. Others interpret love more as an action.

I would suggest that we also remember that love is actually based in God Himself and therefore love can ultimately only be interpreted by who God is and how He acts. This is why Paul offers us the wisdom found in Ephesians 5:2 - *And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God* (English Standard Version).

Just reflect on that for a moment. How often do you walk in love in the way in which Jesus loves you? It's easier to justify our behavior and thought patterns than it actually is to be guided by the pattern of Jesus' love. Instead of Jesus' love, nasty opinions fill our brains. Instead of Jesus' love, caustic comments 'accidentally slip' out of our mouths. Instead of Jesus' love, we pretend to not see someone in order to not have to serve them.

Scripturally, to love is to treat others the way you want to be treated. It all starts in how Jesus treats me! That means I would never want to hurt anyone, but love them with all of my heart, mind, soul, and every action of my body because that's how Jesus loves me. The Apostle Paul wrote about it most clearly in his letter to the Roman Church: *Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. For the commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.* (Romans 13:8-10, ESV).

Paul gives a great illustration of this in suggesting we love our spouses in the same manner in which Jesus loves the Church. <u>OUCH</u>. Jesus is way more loving with me than I am with my wife or the rest of family (and they know it!) He's far more accepting and forgiving than I will ever be. So am I really loving 'neighbors' as myself? Hardly!

But every day, that same love is forgiving and motivating me to walk in His love as He loves me and gave Himself up for me. Love then becomes more than cards, flowers, and candy. It becomes part of Jesus in me, loving everyone around me the way He loves me first.

Thank you for your future support, for sharing your children, and praise God for all His blessings. Keeping the youth ROOTED in Christ! Cindy Werth – Youth Director




The Apostle Peter was asked about love by our master and by my estimation he too appeared to not fully understand love. John 21:15-17 ¹⁵ Then when they had eaten breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, Simon, son of John, do you love Me more than these? He said to Him, Yes, Lord, You know that I love You. He said to him, Feed My lambs. ¹⁶ He said to him again a second time, Simon, son of John, do you love Me? He said to Him, Yes, Lord, You know that I love You. He said to him, Shepherd My sheep. ¹⁷ He said to him the third time, Simon, son of John, do you love Me? Peter was grieved that He said to him the third time, Do you love Me? And he said to Him, Lord, You know all things; You know that I love You. Jesus said to him, Feed My sheep.

Fellow believers, **do you love Jesus**? He calls us today, Feed His Lambs with the study of His word. Shepherd His sheep with caring, sharing and prayer. And Feed His sheep with the world's only hope for salvation that we have been given to share.

Your 2017 Council will be presenting several proposals for study and outreach in the coming months. I ask that you open your heart and respond to "feed our Lord's sheep" as He ommanded. 
