**Executive Directors Report (5 Min)**

**BASS:**

Our Direct Services continues to move towards increasing the number of persons coming to program. As of this writing, only 20 have not attended and Terri is working with those families. Terri continues to follow State guidance as the number of persons attending increases. The other positive is that there have been no positive cases of COVID within all of adult services.

**Conflict Free Case Management:** As part of my return to work, I had a conference call with the president of Alliance, Mark VanAuken. The purpose of the call was to have him brief me on the changes in case management and to confirm having to separate direct services from CCB's. Matt did confirm this and it was also a topic of discussion on the Alliance Board Zoom call on Thursday

9/17/2020. The separation has to occur on or before July of 2024. The Department has been having conference calls with CCB's to secure updates on their plans. More information will be provided in the coming months.

**Legislative News:** JBC Members are expecting a \$1B budget deficit this year. That is mostly the one-time funding they used to fill the budget last year, which is no longer there, and they made a commitment for it to be one-time funding. These are some bills that are being considered and the position that Alliance is taking on them:

- Proposition 116 – reduce income tax rate from 4.6% to 4.55% - oppose position. Would cost the state budget about \$150M and saves individual taxpayers an average of \$37.
- Amendment B – Gallagher amendment – support position. Mill Levy funding directly impacts several CCBs and would create a huge hole in budgets for school districts. [View PPT here](#)
- Proposition EE – increasing tobacco tax and adding a tax on e-cigarettes – planning to support.

**Representative Esgar:** Alliance awarded Representative Esgar “Legislator of the Year for her work on ending the waitlist. She had bipartisan support and close in passing the bill when COVID came on the scene. Representative Esgar is and continues to be a strong advocate of our services. Erica Adamson and I attended the ceremony at PDI on September 15, 2020.

**Early Intervention:** The final rule regarding the change in eligibility to Early Intervention was approved on Sept 4, 2020. Additions made to the current rule include a definition for "Risk factor" and Early intervention.

“Risk Factor” means a 25% delay in two or more domains and, if sufficient appropriations are available, a 25% delay in one domain, or other factors determined by the department to have research that supports the potential for impact on development at a later age such as, but not limited to, a substantiated case of abuse or neglect, neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS), fetal alcohol spectrum disorders (FASD), lead poisoning, global developmental delays and perinatal mood and anxiety disorders.

“Early Intervention early start program” means a program separate from early intervention services provided in accordance with Part C that, if the department determines appropriations are adequate, may provide services to children who meet the definition of risk factor and do not meet eligibility criterion as defined in section 7.920, E.

This is a new program that is in its early stages so there are many unknowns. Thus far, the state has clarified that there is NOT funding for this program currently, that the CCB would not "have" to implement this program, and that it would NOT be under the same requirements as Part C (or Early Intervention's federal guidelines). CDHS will be addressing questions on an Oct 1st call with EI coordinators.
