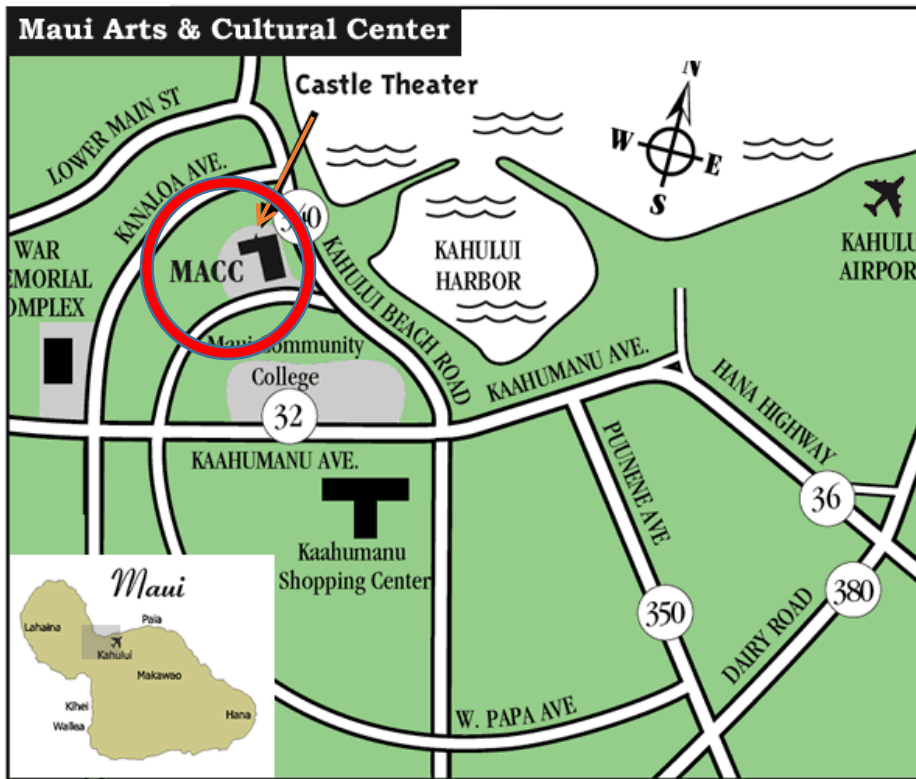


**Maui's Live-Stream of the
