

Trinity UCC Elliston Council Job Descriptions

President

- ...see that all meetings of the Council are regularly called, to open and conduct such meetings, and to see to the execution of all resolutions.
- ...is empowered, with other members of the Council, to sign all contracts, loans, vouchers, and deeds in the name of the congregation. According to our Incorporation, the Council President, or his/her designate, shall be agent for the Corporation.
- ...shall be ex-officio member of all Church Committees.
- ...shall make elected officers aware of their responsibilities.

Vice President

- ...shall preside at all meetings where the President is not present and also when business pertaining to the President and his administration is before the congregation.
- ...shall be chairman of the Pulpit Search Committee and chief liaison agent between the Board of Christian Education, Family Life and Youth, and the Church Council, presenting Board recommendations for Council action.

Recording Secretary

- ...shall keep a record of all transactions at the meetings of the congregation and the Church Council, attend to all correspondence, and keep a list of all members and their addresses.
- ...shall sign all minutes of the meetings of the Council and congregation.

<u>Financial Secretary</u>

- ...shall be the Financial Officer of the Church.
- ...shall render a monthly report to the Council and an annual report to the Congregation based on the Treasurer's accounting.
- ...all records shall be audited bi-annually.
- ...shall bring all unpaid bills to Council for approval.
- ...shall call together the Audit Committee.
- ...shall be the Budget Coordinator for the Church.

<u>Elders</u>

- ...shall assist and support the Pastor in the spiritual affairs of the Church.
- ...shall be responsible for providing the elements for Holy Communion and their distribution.
- ...shall take heed in the high calling of their office, guarding faithfully all spiritual interests of the Church, visiting the sick, and ministering to the edification and comfort of all.
- ...shall endeavor to prevent strife and discord in the Church. If discord and disputes arise they shall try to adjust the difficulty in order that peace prevails.
- ...shall, as care-takers of the Church, be responsible for the visitation and counsel with members on the conditional list, trying to re-establish them as active members.

Deacons

- ...shall provide a schedule of ushers for all services, with the Senior Deacon serving as the head usher.
- ...shall be responsible for acolytes and instructing them.
- ...shall maintain order and good behavior at all services of worship of the congregation and other meetings of the Church.
- ... are responsible for affiliated services which they are to render to their Church.

Trustees

- ...shall see that all property of the congregation is adequately insured against loss or damage and shall provide for adequate liability insurance.
-shall see that the buildings are kept in good repair.
- ...shall be responsible for janitors in case of absence of regular janitors.

EUROPEAN MOVEMENT CATALYSTS

This month we were invited to a conference which gathered people who are serving the Lord by starting Bible Discovery movements in their communities. There were people there from more than 35 different countries, serving in 27 countries across Europe. It was encouraging to hear where and how God is working in different places and people groups, as we shared strategies and stories with one another.



One man, Youhanna, became a Christian and was forced to flee his country of Afghanistan to Germany. He now seeks other refugees from the Middle East and shares the Gospel with them, and finds those open to reading the Bible and starting groups. He is connected with groups all across Germany, and has seen many people receive Jesus as their savior. While he was at the conference, he went out to talk with people, and while he found one person that was a bit receptive to him, another man, an Iranian, threatened him for being a Muslim convert. This kind of persecution is not unfamiliar to Youhanna, but he continues to be faithful to those the Lord has called him.

Another man I spoke with, Thibaut, is French, and living in southern France, he is starting groups among North African immigrants, who land there by the hundreds. He shared about a Moroccan girl that they had been sharing with for nearly a year, and finally prayed to receive Jesus as savior. Shortly after, she had to return to Morocco for a funeral, and was praying with them for boldness as it was her first time returning as a Christian. These are just two of many stories of people working to see Bible Discovery groups start among every tribe, tongue, and nation across Europe. We ended our time at the conference praying with people from Central Europe and the Balkans, and it was a wonderful glimpse of the Kingdom to come. Please pray with us for the people of Europe, that God would cause revival across the continent, that many people would be open to our Savior, and that they would start groups among their families, friends, coworkers, and communities.

PRAYER REQUESTS

- Please pray for health for our family! Since Ari has started school our family has been passing around sickness, with at least two of us sick at any time. Pray for the Lord to restore our health, and protect us from further disruption.
- Pray for Matej, that the Lord would bless him as he is transitioning apartments and jobs. Transitions are hard for him with his mental health struggles, so pray for the Lord's protection.
- Pray for safe travels, we have a few different events and trips throughout the fall, pray for safe and smooth travels for us.
