

#### CONSECRATION OF THE DIOCESE TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY OF FATIMA

This Wednesday, September 27, 2017 gathered for their provincial meeting, Archbishop Chaput and the bishops of Pennsylvania will entrust the ecclesial province of Pennsylvania to Our Lady of Fatima. This year marks 100 years since the apparitions of the Blessed Mother in Fatima, Portugal (May 13-October 13, 1917). This provincial entrustment will take place at Saint Patrick Cathedral, Harrisburg, during Holy Mass at noon. Father Dwight Schlaline plans to concelebrate this Mass. I have discovered a notebook in our archives that is a record of parish history until September 18, 1958. Through this collection, I have found the record of a priest who served the community only for about 5 months, named Reverend Norman Koller, CPPS before being recalled by his order - The Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Besides a brief bio that I will show below, I cannot find any information on him. So this week is a call for information: if anyone can remember or knows anything about him please let me know. If he was our first priest, I wish to add him to our official lists of priests. I believe that the hotel that is mentioned is now the Shippen Place Hotel. I have already contacted the Fathers of the Precious Blood, and the institutions mentioned below in the hopes of finding more information and am waiting to hear back.

On February 18, 1950, Father Koller took up residence at Hotel Shippen in Shippensburg. Father Koller, a native of Buffalo, New York, was ordained to the Holy Priesthood May 1, 1938. He made his studies for the priesthood at Canisius College, Buffalo, New York, and St. Charles Seminary, Cathagena, Ohio. He served as Dean of Men at St. Joseph's College, Collegeville, Indiana and has had previous experience in parish work at St. Francis's Church, Harrisburg, and St. Augustine's Church, Youngstown, Ohio.

# OUR LADY OF THE VISITATION CHURCH Sermon on the Amount – September 2017

The work of the Finance Council is to advise our Pastor Father Dwight Schlaline on the financial issues involved in the administration of our parish. We develop and propose a budget for each fiscal year and monitor our financial situation throughout the year providing the members of our parish with an annual report. In this weekend's bulletin you will find a detailed report on the income and expenditures for the full fiscal year that ended this past June 30<sup>th</sup>.

We thank all of you for your continued support. Your donations to the parish totaled over \$333,000 which includes a nearly \$10,000 refund from the Bishop's Lenten Appeal. An additional \$23,000 was given to the various second collections. Giving increased by \$15,000 over what you gave last fiscal year enabling us to continue to build up our savings. Major repairs included replacing the front sidewalk and wall as well as installing a security system. Our building is over fifty years old and will need additional work over the next five to ten years. Therefore, we will need to continue to save "for the rainy day."

The parish continued to maintain its goal of keeping all controllable expenses as low as possible and we owe our thanks to Fr. Dwight and the parish staff for their hard work in this regard.

Major expenditures being planned this fiscal year include repairing or updating the air conditioning system in the social hall. Also, we have been advised that the boiler in the social hall will most likely need to be replaced within the next year or two.

In closing, I want to once again thank you on behalf of Fr. Dwight and all the members of the parish staff for your continued support and restate our commitment to be responsible stewards of the donations you make to Our Lady of the Visitation Parish.
