Your Ports of Call: Cozumel

eparting October 28, 2018, from New Orleans, the 30th Annual World Championship Bingo Tournament & Gaming Cruise sails the Caribbean for seven fun-filled days with stops at the Caribbean ports of Montego Bay, Grand Cayman and Cozumel aboard the majestic Carnival Dream.

Duane Buerth celebrated his 90th birthday the same day. The couple plays Bingo at Green Valley Ranch daily and says they plan to celebrate their wedding anniversaries there as well.

Mother-Son Bingo

Dozens of moms and their sons recently gathered at the Lincolnwood Fire Station in Lincolnwood, Illinois, for Mother-Son Bingo. Coordinated by Lincolnwood Parks and Recreation, the fire station has hosted Mother-Son Bingo for the past four years. The evening began with pizza, popcorn and desert, as well as the chance for the boys to look at fire equipment and try on firefighter gear, before the start of Bingo. Lincolnwood police and fire department staff served as Bingo runners and callers. Winners chose from such prizes as fidget spinners, sports balls and more. MB Financial Bank of Lincolnwood, which sponsored the event, supplied giveaways.

Car Crashes Into Bingo Hall

Police have released the name of a woman who was killed after a car crashed into a Bingo hall in Sophia, West Virginia. According to reports, Linda Keens was inside the Sophia Bingo Hall when a car driven by 51-year-old Peggy Griffin went through the building. Raleigh County Sheriff Scott Van Meter says Keens was pronounced dead after the accident. At least a dozen other people were injured. The sheriff's department said

in a statement that Griffin was attempting to pull her vehicle out of the Bingo hall parking lot when it was struck by another vehicle. The statement says Griffin's vehicle accelerated and continued along a sidewalk before striking the Bingo hall. At press time the cause of the accident was still under investigation.

Bingo Fundraiser Supports Florida Parks

This spring, the Town of Southwest Ranches, Florida, Parks Foundation turned to Bingo as a major fundraiser to support the town's parks. The second annual event, titled Bingo at the Barn, was a family-friendly event held in Rolling Oaks Barn, a large community building located in picturesque, 46-acre Rolling Oaks Park. For \$20 in advance or \$35 at the door, attendees received dinner, a Bingo card, and the chance to play two hours of Bingo gaming. Additional Bingo cards were available for \$1. All proceeds went toward development and enhancement funds to benefit parks in Southwest Ranches, which is located at the edge of the Florida Everglades.

Veterans

Headstone

Twice a year in national cemeteries across the country, veterans are honored with ceremonies and visits. Memorial Day has long been the day to honor those who died in service to our country. Now, with the generous donations of Worcester Wreath and the non-profit Wreaths Across America, tens of thousands of veterans' graves also are decorated at Christmas ... as they should be.

But I have a challenge for you. We all live near a cemetery or two. Small cemeteries dot communities across the country, and many of them don't get the attention they deserve. Some are not tended well nor visited often.

My challenge to you is this: Investigate a local cemetery and identify the graves of a half-dozen veterans. The older the grave, the better, as there will not likely be family that visits. Note the names and dates of birth of those halfdozen veterans (as well as the locations, should the cemetery be large).

Take the graves of those veterans into your care. Visit each grave at least twice a year, and not on the days that others will -- Memorial Day and during the Christmas season. Pick another day, as well as the veteran's

This project needn't cost much. Check your local big-box or craft stores for small flags, perhaps 4 by 6 inches, on sticks. Or look online for sites such as www. united-states-flag.com (877-734-2458). Its flags are made in the U.S.A. The 4-by-6-inch flags on 10inch wooden sticks cost as low as 15 cents each.

Take along a pair of clippers and trim around the headstone. Take the kids or grandkids along, if you wish, and teach them about honoring veterans.

Then, issue the same challenge to others. It's the right thing to do.


Dear Fed Up:

Gaming News

U.S.A. There is a lot of "Monday morning quarterbacking" going on all over the nation in the wake of that recent decision by the U.S. Supreme Court to allow states that want to legalize sports betting. The decision strikes down a 1992 federal law that had prohibited most states from authorizing sports betting. According to official documents, the 6-3 ruling is a big "win" for the state of New Jersey and other states that have considered allowing sports gambling as a way to encourage tourism and tax revenue. Among the groups wishing to keep the status quo were: The NCAA, NFL and the NBA.

Washington. The gaming machine company Scientific Games
Corporation says it's signed a deal to provide services and equipment to a gaming facility in Washington State, the Quinalt Beach Resort and Casino. "Scientific" is based in Las Vegas and will provide the equipment and upgrades as part of a \$25-million expansion of the popular resort.

Indiana. After numerous years when its Ohio River Boat Casino, the Horseshoe, has had to be closed because of flood, Caesars Entertainment has decided to bring the entire project onto higher ground. The moving of the facility could cost more than \$85-million. The "water proofing" of the casino will involve the

construction of a 100,000-squarefoot, single-story gaming house that is farther away from the riverbank. The state of Indiana, which authorized the facility as a "riverboat," has approved the idea, if part of the original footprint is retained. The facility is 14 miles from Louisville, Kentucky.

Iowa. Lottery officials in Iowa report that a man from Davenport has won a huge prize without actually buying a ticket. Here's what happened: The man involved won nearly \$5-million because of a "free play" element in what is called the Iowa Lotto Surprise. The short-lived promotion printed out free tickets, at random, for people who had participated in several other lotteries and had registered to participate. The man did not realize he was a winner until several days after his numbers were drawn.

Macau. The government of China has decided to slow down the application process for new poker venues in Macau. Recently, media are reporting that two poker rooms have closed and a new tournament series was called off due to the regulations. More issues may arise in the future as the World Series of Poker may see an event canceled due to the recent policy changes. Government officials have not commented on the closings or the crackdown.

Lucky Lotto News

Iowa Man Wins With Free Ticket

Chuck Anderson of Davenport, Iowa, recently claimed a \$4.38 million lottery jackpot he won with a ticket he received as a free play in a lottery promotion. Anderson, 52, won Iowa's first jackpot in Lotto America just six months after the game's start. His winning ticket was one that he received for free from the Iowa Lottery during a promotion called "Lotto Surprise." Random players received free lotto plays when they bought tickets in a particular game. Anderson matched all six numbers in the Lotto America drawing: 8, 15, 18, 32, and 45, with Star Ball number 1. "I'm excited for the opportunity to help family and feel lucky to have won this prize," he said. Anderson chose to receive his prize as a lump sum of \$2.6 million.

Canadian Wins on Retirement Day

A Canadian man had a truly amazing 24 hours, winning \$1.5 million on the lottery on the same day as his birthday and retirement. Vancouver resident Ping Kuen Shum was already in high spirits after celebrating his birthday and retirement when he decided to buy a ticket for the BC/49 draw the same night. Amazingly, all six of Shum's numbers—09, 12, 13, 18, 21, and

29—came through, winning the birthday boy his jackpot. Shum said he celebrated with a dim sum meal alongside family and friends. He is planning on spending his winnings on a trip to China. "It's unbelievable that all three events happened on the same day," said Shum. "I have worked hard for so many years and I'm looking forward to sharing this fortune with my family."

Poker Talk



Errors Abound in a Micro-stakes Game

By Jonathan Little

Mistakes are mistakes at the poker table, and you'll be punished for errors even in microstakes games.

In a \$.10/\$.20 no-limit hold 'em cash game with \$35 effective stacks, the players in first and second position limped in, as did the player in the hijack seat. Our Hero raised to \$.70 with 7c 7s.

If Hero was going to raise, he should have raised larger. By making it \$.70, he'll frequently be called by all the limpers, resulting in him seeing a flop with what will usually be a marginal underpair. He might also get three-bet by one of the limpers, forcing him to fold.

I would have preferred to see Hero limp behind, allowing him to try to flop a set. There was really no point in raising. Another reasonable line of play would have been raising to about \$1.70, which would usually either steal the pot before the flop or result in only one player calling, allowing Hero to play a pot in position.

Surprisingly, only the small blind and the second limper called.

It's worth noting that when you limp and someone raises to only a small amount more, you should call and see the flop with most of your range. The only hands that would make sense to fold are uncoordinated hands such as Ah 6c or Ks 7d, but those hands should not be limped in the first place.

The flop came Qh Qs Jc. Everyone checked to Hero, who bet \$1.50 into a pot of \$2.60.

When more than two players see a flop, you should tend to play in a more straightforward manner because it's likely that someone connected with the board. With this particular flop containing some high cards, Hero needed to proceed with caution. This was a spot where Hero should have either checked or bet small, perhaps \$.70. If Hero gets called after making a bet of \$1.50, he's surely up against either a better made hand or a strong draw that will often fare well against 7-7. I would have checked behind with the intention of folding to any turn bet.

Only the small blind called. The turn was the 8d. The opponent checked, and Hero bet \$3.00 into a pot of \$5.60.

This bet made no sense. The opponent easily could have been holding 10-9 or a Q, in which case he certainly wouldn't fold. The opponent also would have been unlikely to fold a J or 8 to this modest turn bet. There was no reason for Hero to turn his hand into a bluff, although I suppose he could have made a sizable river bet to try to make the opponent fold any hand worse than trips, but that would have been optimistic.

The opponent called. The river was the Jh. The opponent bet \$9 into a pot of \$11.60.

I disliked the opponent's lead because it made it impossible for Hero to bluff. The opponent should have checked his entire range, giving Hero the change to bluff. Instead, Hero made an easy fold.

While this hand may seem like a standard micro-stakes hand to some people, in my eyes, Hero lit \$4.50 (the amount of his last two bets) on fire. In a \$.10/\$.20 game, that is 22.5 big blinds, which is a hefty, completely unnecessary loss.

If approved, this would be the first time in many years that a project in the area started from scratch.

PALMS SAYS YES TO UNION

Media in Las Vegas have reported that workers at the Palms Casino Resort Spa have voted overwhelmingly to unionize; they are to be represented by the Local 165 branch of the Bartenders Union and the Local 226 chapter of the Culinary Workers Union. Secret balloting was held over a two-day period. Among the 900 workers, more than 84% voted to join a union.

BIG HIT IN VEGAS

Officials at the Paris Las Vegas casino recently reported that a player hit one of its Megabucks slot machines to the tune of \$11.2-million. The announcement affiliated with the company International Gaming Technology. The huge payout is the third Megabucks progressive jackpot in the Vegas area in less than a year. Each time the Megabucks jackpot hits, the progressive prize resets to \$10-million.

Blackjack Basic Strategy

The basic playing strategy is the optimum way to play your hand in blackjack when the only information available is your hand and the dealer's upcard. If you play every hand dealt to you using basic strategy you will reduce the house edge to half a percent or less (depends on the number of decks and the playing rules). Suffice it to say that learning the basic strategy is vitally important if you are serious about winning at blackjack.

You'll find basic strategy tables in books (e.g., my "Blackjack: Take The Money & Run"), and on the Internet. One way to memorize it is to prepare "flash cards" using index cards. On the front side of each index card write your hand

(e.g. 9), and on the back write the correct strategy (e.g., "Double on 3-6 otherwise hit"). Prepare an index card for every hand in the strategy table. When you are done, you will have a set of flash cards that you can use to memorize the basic strategy.

Spend about 10-15 minutes a day going through your flashcards. The cards on which you did not get the strategy correct set aside. After you go through your entire pack of flashcards, take the cards where you made a playing mistake and run through them again. Keep doing this exercise every day until you can are able to recall from memory the correct playing strategy for each hand. Now you are ready for the next drill.

On page 141 in my book, there is a strategy table that lists only the dealer's upcard and your hand (everything else is blank). Make copies of the table (or create a "blank" table yourself), and then fill in the correct strategy for every hand from memory. Compare the strategy table that you created with the strategy table in books. Your goal is to be able to accurately reproduce the basic strategy table from memory,

Next, take a deck of cards and place one card face up on a table. This is the dealer's upcard. Then flip over two cards at a time representing your hand and decide how you would play the hand. Check how you would play each hand against the basic strategy table. Keep practicing with a deck of cards, only changing the

dealer's upcard.

And, nowadays, there are relatively inexpensive blackjack software programs that you can purchase for your smart phone or PC that will help you learn the basic strategy.

So there you have it, two different approaches to learning the basic strategy. Whether you use paper and pencil to prepare your own flashcards and strategy tables or use the built in features of a software program, either are valid tools to help you master the basic playing strategy.





The New MIND Diet May Help Prevent Alzheimer's

Dear Savvy Senior,

I've heard that there's a new diet that can help prevent Alzheimer's disease. What can you tell me about this? My 80-year-old mother has Alzheimer's and I want to do everything I can to protect myself. — **Concerned Daughter**

Dear Concerned.

It's true! Research has found that a new diet plan — called the MIND diet — can have a profound impact on your brain health as you age, and can even lower your odds of getting Alzheimer's disease.

The MIND diet takes two proven diets—the heart-healthy Mediterranean diet and the blood-pressure lowering DASH diet—and zeroes in on the foods in each that specifically affect brain health.

The MIND diet, which stands for "Mediterranean-DASH Intervention for Neurodegenerative Delay," was developed by Martha Clare Morris, a nutritional epidemiologist at Rush University Medical Center, through a study funded by the National Institute on Aging.

The study followed the diets of nearly 1,000 elderly adults, who filled out food questionnaires and underwent repeated neurological testing for an average of 4.5 years.

It found participants whose diets most closely followed the MIND recommendations had brains that functioned as if they were 7.5 years younger, and it lowered their risk of developing Alzheimer's disease by as much as 53 percent. And even those who didn't stick to the diet perfectly but followed it moderately well reduced their risk of Alzheimer's by 35 percent.

The MIND diet has 15 dietary components. The emphasis is on eating from 10 brain-healthy food groups, and limiting foods from five unhealthy groups. Here's a rundown of the healthy foods you should work into your diet:

- Green leafy vegetables (like spinach and salad greens): Eat at least one serving per day.
- Other vegetables: At least one other vegetable a day.
- Whole grains: Three or more servings a day.
- Nuts: Five one-ounce servings a week.
- Beans: At least three servings a week.
- Berries: Two or more servings a week.
- Fish: Once a week.
- Poultry (not fried): Two times a week.
- Olive oil: Use it as your primary

cooking oil.

- Wine: One glass a day.

 And the five unhealthy food groups you should limit include:
- Red meat: Eat fewer than four servings a week.
- Butter and margarine: Less than a tablespoon daily.
- Cheese: Less than one serving a week.
- Pastries and sweets: Less than five servings a week.
- Fried or fast food: Less than one serving a week.

One of the best things about the MIND diet is that it's easer to follow than most other diets and you don't have to stick to it perfectly to gain the benefits, which makes it more likely you'll follow it for a long time. And the longer you eat the MIND way, the lower the risk of getting Alzheimer's disease.

Another advantage is that the MIND diet can help you lose some weight too, if you keep your portions in check and are careful about how the food is prepared.

It's also important to understand that even though diet plays a big role, it's only one aspect of Alzheimer's disease. So get regular exercise, if you smoke, quit, and learn how manage your stress to lower your risk even more.

Summertime Spareribs

It's summertime. Can you tell me a simple recipe for spareribs? My husband is doing the grilling, so make it easy please. — **Georgie from Atlanta, Georgia**

Dear Georgie,

Here's an easy recipe for spareribs and a "somewhat" homemade sauce. I like this sauce better than the store bought flavored barbecue sauces. This recipe uses the oven and the barbecue grill. Enjoy! — **Annie**

SPARERIBS WITH A HONEY-MUSTARD BARBECUE SAUCE

3 pounds spareribs

1 teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon pepper2 cups mustard

1 cup barbecue sauce (plain)

½ cup honey

2 teaspoons onion powder

Using a foil pan, season the spareribs with the salt and pepper. Add a cup of water, cover the pan with aluminum foil, and bake for about 45 minutes to an hour in a preheated 375-degree oven. Drain most of the liquid from the pan. Combine the mustard, barbecue sauce, honey and onion powder in a blender. Process until smooth. Spoon over the ribs. Grill over a low flame for about one hour. Carefully watch the ribs, turning them over and making sure they do not burn. Serves 6. The sauce can also be used as a glaze for pork tenderloin, chicken, turkey or fish.
