The JLGA is in no way responsible for the conduct and/or competence of Show Location Management employees & any other Show Location Representative. This is the sole responsibility of the Show Location Management.

At non-sponsored JLGA Shows (other shows where JLGA Members will be able to count points) the JLGA is in now way responsible for the conduct & competence of Host Show Employees & any other Host Show Representative including but not limited to implementation of show activities, placings, or awards. The only privilege that the JLGA has at these shows is the ability to count points for "End of Year" awards.

The JLGA does not & will not assume & or accept any duties and/or responsibilities for safety of person(s) and/or third party, livestock, and/or property where any JLGA event is taking place.

All JLGA Members, their families, third parties, & all non-JLGA members & participants assume any & all of the risks associated with their participation in any JLGA event. They further release & agree not to hold responsible the JLGA Officers, Board of Directors (Governing Body), Representatives, and/or employees from any & all liability, when or however it may arise, regarding but not limited to personal injury and/or livestock, property damage, loss, theft, or conduct of any person while attending any JLGA event.

Youth 6 years & under as of January 1 of the current show season may have help in the ring during showmanship & during their regular goat classes, providing it is another youth.

***\*PLEASE NOTE\* ADDITIONAL NOTE TO PARENT(S) & GUARDIAN(S) FOR SAFETY REASONS (Added 11/14/09)*** - There is no age limit on goats shown by an exhibitor, however for safety reasons, please make sure your youth can handle the goat(s) you are allowing them to show. Animals who are continuously unruly & uncontrollable by the exhibitor, may be dismissed from the ring at the discretion of the JLGA Show Personnel and/or Board of Directors.

**FIRST OCCURRENCE:** Ring personnel will help where needed & encourage youth to handle their goats on their own. All goats can have a bad day & youth will be given the benefit of the doubt for the first occurrence. If show can be finished, youth will receive their placement

recognition, awards, & "End of Year" points if eligible. Parents of youth will be informed of situation and this will serve as the 1st & only verbal warning.

**SECOND OCCURRENCE:** If situation again presents within the same year, exhibitor & goat will be dismissed from the ring & will not receive any awards, placement recognition, or "End of Year" points. Parents will be asked not to bring the goat back during that current show season.

**PEEWEE YOUTH WHO TURN 2 DURING THE SHOW SEASON (Added 01/2015):**

New PeeWee rule was added at the start of the 2015 show season regarding youth who turn 2 during the current show season allowing them to start showing on or after their second birthday, however for safety reason these youth may not show bucks. Also their parents and/or guardians are responsible for providing them an age appropriate goat to show in the show ring.
