Creating a Fall Suncatcher

As hard as it is to believe, fall is quickly approaching. Welcome the changing season with this fun, and beautiful craft.

Materials:

- Contact paper
- Stencil of leaves (see below for instructions)
- Powder tempura paint, glitter, pom poms, nature materials like real leaves, grasses, flowers, etc. (lots of possibilities)

Steps:

- 1. To make a leaf stencil, simply trace and cut out leaf patterns on a piece of card stock or other sturdy paper.
- 2. Cut a piece of contact paper that is the same size as the stencil. Place the stencil on top of the contact paper, sticky side up.
- 3. The leaf cut-outs should be the only sticky part still visible.
- 4. Provide paint, glitter, or other decorative materials and allow children to press into the sticky, leaf cut-outs.
- 5. When complete, peel off the stencil, shake off any excess and stick right to a window. Now you have a beautiful, homemade fall suncatcher!
