Description: It's kind of like that casserole made with all the leftovers from the refrigerator. That means it's a great opportunity to dig up leftovers from old projects – that includes thread and unused bindings, too! One of the main considerations to make regarding fabric selection is contrast. What are the differences in the fabric that will allow your piecing to stand out? Think about various types of contrasts: color (blue versus red), value (light and dark), print texture (floral versus striped), and print scale (small versus large scale).

The size of your project determines the exact fabric needed. The ranges below accommodate projects that are 24" (one full circle) up to 72" square (6 full circles).

Clearing out a large workspace will make the day more fun for you. We're going to build slabs of "made fabric" and reuse off cuts. Having extra space will make organization easier. If you don't have a design wall readily available, spread out a piece of flannel or batting so you can see your work as you progress. There is no sewing homework prior to the workshop, but if you have leftover slabs or offcuts from other projects, you may wish to have them on hand

SUPPLY LIST FOR SCRAP QUILT WORKSHOP OCTOBER 17, 2021 1-4 P.M.

Have at least a vague idea of what you are aiming at, for example, juvenile, neutral bcd sizc, wall hanging. Maybe have a color scheme like yellow and purple, or Fall colors, or Christmas. And a sense of adventure.

Bring basic sewing supplies, including machine. A bucket of scraps I will supply iron and ironing board There will be boxes of scraps from the boutique available.

FOR STRING PIECED STAR

Leftover long skinny strips from binding or other projects in medium or dark colors. If you want all the background to be the same fabric, then yardage of the background, maybe a yard for a 36" quilt.

If you want the background to be the same color but not the same fabric, then pieces that are at least 6 inches square.

This works well in red, white and blue.

Isoceles triangle ruler that cuts a 45 degree angle. If you don't have one, you can borrow mine.

FOR THE AUTUMN SPLENDOR

Short strips that are at least 5 inches long and 1 to 2 1/2 inches wide. Works well with leftover piano keys or other strips. Medium and dark strips.

If you want the background to be the same fabric, then yardage of the background. Bed sized quilt calls for 4 1/4 yards. If you are just trying out the block, 1/2 yard will do.

If you want the background to be different fabrics of the same color, width of the fabric is easier, but it can be done with shorter pieces, no shorter than 12 inches and at least 4 inches wide. Square ruler 10 or 12 inches square, or right triangle ruler at least 10 inches across the bottom. If you don't have one, you can borrow mine.

FOR CHURN DASH WEAVE

Out of medium and dark scraps need 3 six inch squares for churn, all the same fabric and 2 six inch squares of the background, probably not white or beige. You will need 5 three inch squares of white or beige for the woven effect. This makes one block.

If you have a ruler that cuts 3 inch strips or 3 inch squares, bring it. Same with a 6 inch square. If not, you can borrow mine.

A 12 1/2 inch square ruler is helpful, I have one. A Tucker Trimmer would also work.





MINIS IN THE MILL

One of the successful fundraisers held during our CHQ biennial quilt show has been a raffle of mini quilts

made by the guild members. The raffle is conducted in tricky-tray fashion, with the drawing on the

afternoon of the last day of the show. It's a great opportunity for members, other quilters and non-quilters to take a chance at taking home a small piece(s) of quilted art made by CHQ members.

In the past we've raffled 50-60 mini quilts per show.

Please consider making at least one Mini for our October Courthouse Quilters Guild Show.

Here are the rules for Mini construction:

1. Your Mini can represent any theme and can be traditional, modern or an art quilt, either from a pattern

or your own creation.

2. Your Mini can be as small as 6"x6" (minimum) or as large as 24"x24" (maximum).

3. No cheater cloth.

4. Your Mini can be machine or hand quilted; no tied quilts.

5. Your Mini should have a label with quilt title (optional), your name, county, state, date and Courthouse Quilters. That way the lucky winner will know all about their new quilt and who made it. It's not necessary to add a hanging sleeve.

6. Your Mini must be handed in by no later than the September meeting. This will give the committee time to photograph the Minis and finalize other details.

In attendance: Cathie Giambalvo, Joanne Gardner, Jude McCormick, Laura Kohl, Kerry Cogan, Ann Oswald, and Joan Lasota.

June Board Meeting minute approval- Penny moved to approve the minutes, Kerry seconded- All in favor

Edit prior meeting minutes to say "Joan made a motion to discuss Zoom and Facebook live for future meetings.

June Board minutes from Fall Event meeting- Kerry moved to accept minutes, Joan seconded – All in favor.

President: Cathie Giambalvo - 4H Fair info and update.

2021 was designated as the year for Courthouse Quilters to shadow the Hunterdon County Quilting Guild at the County 4H fair. They have not met this year, do not have a raffle quilt, and will not be participating in the fair. Stephanie asked Cathie about our guild participating, however it is too much to coordinate in one month's time. The gaming commission has confirmed that the raffle quilt can be raffled for 12 months so it would not be a possibility to raffle the quilt if we did have a presence at the fair. The concern is that during the 2022 fair we will be manning the tent at the 4H fair without prior year training on hanging, intake, etc. Stephanie will also confirm that the Hunterdon County Quilting Guild will not have a raffle quilt at the 2022 4H fair.

Update via Cathie from Camille on Quilts and Crafts November 6th, 2021 at the Flemington Elks. We will now have use of the front hallway as a separate space to showcase the Raffle quilt and host a membership drive. The time of the event is still being determined, but tentatively from 12-5pm. Joan mentioned starting the sale earlier at 10am. If there are no commitments the prior evening at the Lodge, set up can begin the prior evening however the time must be confirmed for advertising the event. The contract has been signed at a cost of \$300 which includes display tables. Lunch and drinks will be available through the lodge. Currently there are 8 vendors, plus boutique and charity. Once floorplan is confirmed we will know if additional vendors can be accommodated. Help will be needed for volunteers to help Sue Garcia with boutique items. New Business:

Two new ideas for CHQ Charity/Outreach and CHQ Membership. The first uses resources we have to make kits and the second targets prospective members & fosters quilting in our guild and local community.

- Make "I Spy" kits -Use fabric from Boutique to make kits for our membership to use to generate more baby quilts, make "I Spy" kits & "I Spy" Charm packs for CHQ Boutique to sell.
- Create a free mentoring program/workshop to introduce the "art of quilting" to people who are interested in learning how to quilt. Have students use "I Spy" kits to make baby quilts that they get to donate to CHQ Charity/Programs/Education. It was noted that fabric and supplies are abundant in the storage unit. Tools included would be the essentials- Rotary cutter, mat, rulers, etc and would be signed out by "students" like library items or used for the day. CHQ members would work with the students on the baby quilts, showing them how to use a rotary cutter, how to piece, about batting and binding. The first mentoring workshop would focus on piecing, while the second would focus on completion of the quilt with quilting and binding. Cathie asked the board members to suggest creative locations to advertise to get new members and interested beginners. Some locations suggested social media, flyers in gyms, libraries, craft stores like Michaels and Joann's, local colleges like RVCC, and possibly an information table at the 4H fair to collect emails for people who are interested in participating and CHQ welcoming tables, other quilt shows or craft shows. Free babysitting was suggested as a "draw" for young parents. Offer "free CHQ Membership" as a door prize, to accumulate new members.

Meeting locations throughout the year will need to be secured.
