From the Pastor's Pent

Whew! Its Holy Week --- just days before Easter and I have just come in from shoveling accumulated snow off of our back porch!

A tangible reminder that there are not many things in this world that are predictable and normal. As much as ever the world is changing.

As I consider our younger generations --- they are changing too.

And the world that they are facing as they mature and grow into adulthood is as unsettled, violent, and self-consumed as ever. Less and less concern for the 'good of the whole' and more and more concern for self-interest and self-indulgence.

Linda and I saw the recently released motion picture in theaters called PAUL – APOSTLE OF CHRIST.

The 1st century was also a scary time ... in many ways it was more imposing and more threatening than today. Like today there were many self-driven agendas and excesses. In addition, there was also a ocean of fear, persecution, and anger imposed by a series of notoriously evil Caesars of the Roman Empire --- Nero, Caligula, Domitian and others.

Christians – the exploding movement of people following "the Way" --people who believed in the Apostle's persuasive and life -changing witness of JESUS, the CHRIST, were being singled out --- being blamed, persecuted, and too often martyred. Yet, the ranks of Christian believers grew faster and faster --- WHY?

I believe that the Christians of the first century experienced undeniable life change --- they saw in the who 'believed' a different kind of life --- a life that they wanted ... and when they opened their lives to the belief that Jesus lived, died, and rose again their lives exploded with life changing hope, possibility and promise. Paul, Luke and the other leaders of the 1st century church persistently taught and lead these earliest followers of Jesus that they needed to join together --- become a community --- and live a life remarkably different that the threatening world all around them. LOVE, JOY, PEACE, PATIENCE, KINDNESS, GOODNESS, FAITHFULNESS, GENTLENESS, and SELF-CONTROL --- not in their own natural abilities but super-naturally, in the ways of the SPIRIT (Galatians 5:13-22 & Romans 8).

The 1st Century church – the early Christians --- grew incredibly fast. Their core beliefs and existence have persevered and grown over the past two thousand years ... while the Roman Empires fell and crumbled under the self-destructive consumptions of all sorts ... and an enumerable number of societies and cultures have come and gone ... YET CHRISTIANITY continues on ---

THE DISTINCTIONS OF JESUS-CENTERED BIBLICAL CHRISTIANITY CHANGES LIVES, OFFERS HOPE and LIFTS US TO NEW LEVELS.

My challenge to us this Easter Season --- 1st if you have not yet opened your life to the presence & belief in God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit --please consider doing it today. 2nd if you are a believer, renew and recommit to live your live in his power and his presence --- let the LOVE OF GOD be seen in your life. 3rd please consider renewing your desire and commitment to be a part of SHUMC and may the world that we know through our spheres of influence – the lives and people who we know and touch every week --- may they see the LOVE OF GOD in us and through us --- may this community, that we call South Harborcreek Church be a beacon of hope and light that God may use to ignite His church in this community as He did in the tumultuous times in the 1st Century church.

May we care for one another and may the world see us as Easter People living with Easter hope.

May we be recognized, as were the 1st Century Christians, by our love for one another. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Erie-Meadville District Superintendent Rev. Dennis W. Swineford We will have a new District Superintendent this summer. His name is Rev. Dennis Swineford and he is a life- long United Methodist, baptized, confirmed, converted and called to

ministry among the people of Grace United Methodist Church in Indiana PA.

He is a graduate of Asbury College and Asbury Theological Seminary. In 1993 he earned a Doctor of Ministry degree from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary with a focus on stewardship programming.

Ordained a deacon in 1981 and an Elder in 1984, Rev. Swineford served five pastoral appointments across 36 years of ministry. The settings include rural, urban, small town and suburban areas, including the Titusville Bethel Charge (1982-1988); The Sharpsburg/Millvale Charge (1988-1993); Cabot UMC (1993-2003); Bradford First UMC (2003-2010); and Bakerstown UMC (2010 to present). They include rural, urban, small town and suburban congregations.

Our current District Superintendent, Rev. Joseph Patterson will be retiring this July.
