Backpack Program/Food Pantry News




The backpack program is still ongoing. We have a total of 23 families and 34 students in our backpack program! We are in need of fruit cups, boxes of macaroni & cheese, ramen noodles, and snacks (snack bars, chips, pudding cups, packs of crackers or cookies, etc)

for this program. The number normally rises during the school year so any help you can provide is greatly appreciated. Should you have any questions please reach out to January or Debbie Rendes.

As we continue to provide free groceries to families in need within our community, our community food pantry needs Cereal, Spaghetti Sauce, boxes of Macaroni and cheese, and Ramen Noodles. As our congregation begins its 160th year, we are celebrating our rich history by taking a look back at some memorable moments. Look for photos and tidbits in coming newsletters. This month we trace our early origins.

"About 1858 a few inhabitants of Mineral Ridge formed a Sabbath-school, and held prayer meetings in the district school house." And that was the beginning of our church! "On January 11, 1863, a church of eleven members was formally organized by the committee of Trumbull Presbytery." Among those earliest members was Mr. Jonathan Warner and his wife, Eliza. Mr. Warner was elected the first elder as he had previously served as elder in Youngstown. With Mr. and Mrs. Warner's "liberal giving", they donated the land and substantial money, the erection of a building was soon begun. When the building was completed, the church was in debt between \$1400 and \$1800; however, by the time the church was dedicated on January 26, 1865 membership totaled over 100. A collection was taken and "new subscriptions made" which wiped out the entire debt. And thus began our tradition of being debt free!!!

In 1883, 20 years after the founding of the church, the store of Mr. C.F. Whitney, located immediately south of the church (across Church St.), burned to the ground. The "bucket brigade" and use of wet blankets draped on the south side of the church saved the building although damage was extensive. Most distressing was that Mr. Whitney was clerk of Session and the church records were lost in the store fire! Records were restored from memory but detailed information from this period is missing.

A large barn once stood in back of the church to accommodate families who traveled by horse and buggy (or sleigh) to church. Stalls were assigned to various families. There appears to be some question as to whether the church actually owned the structure, as a court order in 1926 authorized the church trustees to sell the barn and share the proceeds with another party.

Until the turn of the twentieth century, the church and manse had a fence around them. Horses and mules were in abundance in the mining town as were village saloons. The fence served to protect the property from encroachment by wondering animals and men on their way home on Saturday nights from the saloons.

The steeple of the church has been toppled several times and repaired or replaced. The original spire was much higher than the one we have now. The bell that we ring on Sunday mornings is exceptionally large for a church of our size. The bell was cast in Troy, NY and is believed to have been donated by the Warners.

Look for more tidbits next month as we continue celebrating this milestone in FPCMR history.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION NOTES

The Christian Education Committee has adopted several new goals for 2023. At the Organizational meeting where we had eight community leaders speak to us we heard much information that informed the CE Committee as they thought about their goals for 2023.

1. We will explore hosting a Mental Health First Aid course. It is run by the Mahoning County Mental Health and Recovery Board. We will invite the community to attend.

2. We will explore hosting a Children's Health Fair for the community to be held at the Community Park. This may be similar to one we conducted some years back. We will ask others in the community to help us make this happen.

3. We will be scheduling fire drills both for Sunday School classes and also for those worshipping in the sanctuary when the weather gets much better.

Survey: The Presbyterian Women of the PCUSA have published a study called What My Grandmothers Taught Me – Learning from the Women in Matthew's Genealogy of Jesus. This survey is to ask you to if you would be interested in meeting as we make our way through information about the women mentioned in Jesus' genealogy. If there is any interest, we could meet once a month through the spring and if there is interest we could continue in the fall. Let's see how much we can get to divide between the Niles Community Services and the Back Pack program that benefits kids in need at Seaborn Elementary School. Last year our congregation along with the matching funds raised \$1112 for the Community Parish Fund. Let's see if we can do that well this year.

What's New at FPCMR

Session Highlights from January Meeting

- 1. Approved use of Fellowship Hall and Kitchen and waived fee for Mercy College of Ohio on Thursday, Feb 16 for Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser, with Jill Fabian serving as point person.
- 2. Designated the Souper Bowl offering to be taken February 12 and to be divided between Niles Community Services and the Back Pack Program.
- 3. Approved communion on the second Sunday of every month in 2023 except for World Communion Sunday on October 1st and 1st Sun in Advent Dec 3.
- 4. Approved a joint Thanksgiving Service with First Presbyterian Church of Warren in November 2023. Bring canned good to stock our Food Pantry.
- 5. Approved Study Leave for Pastor's Retreat Feb 8-9 and CREDO March 13-21. Neither has a cost and Pastor Kori will get Pulpit Supply for March 19th.
- 6. Approved the Updated Procedure for Electronic (E-Polling) Voting.
- Approved use of up to \$10,000 from the Restricted Fund to update our video streaming and audio system. The quote is for \$13,690 and we received a \$5000 grant from Presbytery last year that we have in reserve.
- 8. Heard that membership is now 136 after removing Nicole McMullen from rolls.
- 9. Heard that Nom. Comm. is working to replace Elder vacancy.
- 10. Heard that Back Pack program is still in need of items for Seaborn School.

We have some exciting news; we will be selling new shirts for the Church! Nicole McMullen has graciously offered to make the shirts and provide the church with a portion of the profits of what we sell. We will have an order form in Fellowship Hall beginning on Sunday, January 29th, 2023. We will have the sign up sheet for the next 3 weeks in Fellowship hall.

We will be selling sweatshirts for \$30, Crewneck (long sleeve) for \$20, and T-shirts for \$15. For sizes 2XL and 3XL there will be an additional \$5 charge.

We will be accepting cash and checks. Checks can be made to First Presbyterian Church of Mineral Ridge.
