

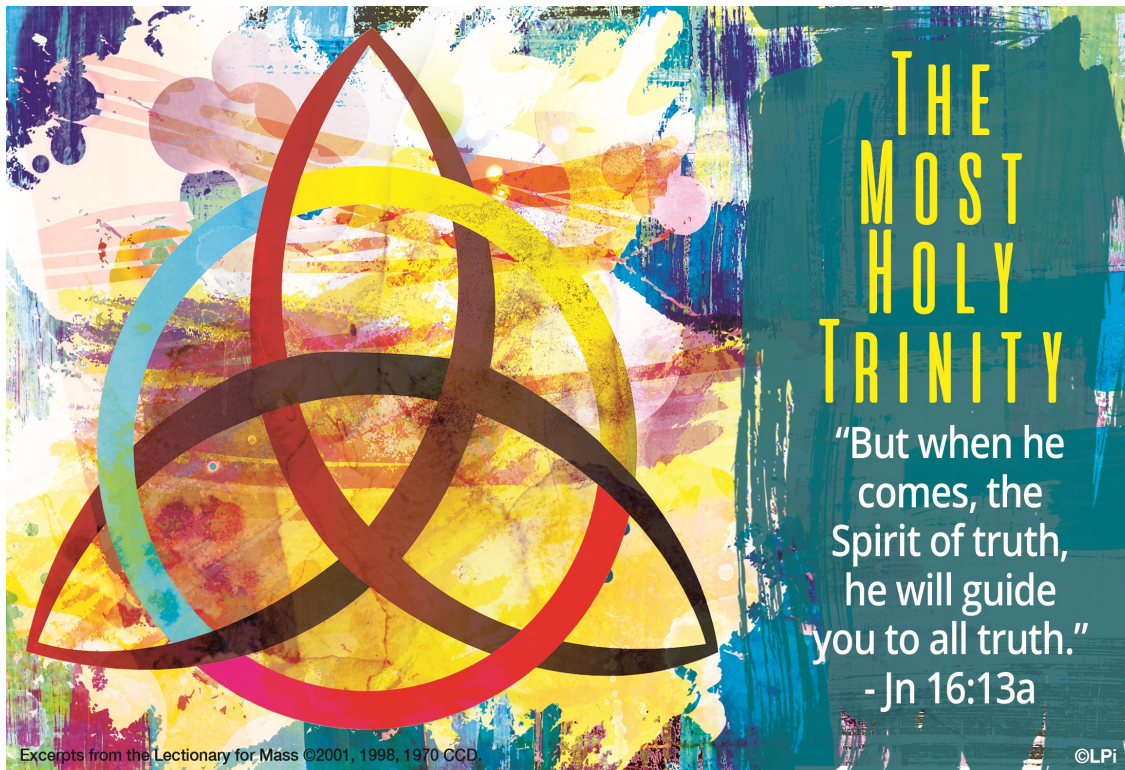

John 16:12-15 "Everything the Father has is mine . . ."
