



REFLECTION

Jesus and His Arrest


Have you ever seen good people get in trouble for something they didn't do? Have you ever seen a bad person get away with something that they shouldn't have? I have many times in my life. Most of my friends in band get in trouble and they do nothing wrong. It has even happened to me many times before. This happens to everyone, including adults, elderly people, and little children.

This gospel this week is mainly about two things. The first thing that it is about is the Passover that Jesus had with the 12 disciples. This is where our communion mostly relates. We eat the bread and drink the wine and get the blessing just like the 12 disciples in the gospel did. Then Jesus went to pray. This shows us that we can pray to the Lord anytime and anywhere we need to. What happened to him next was something that people thought would never happen to him.

The second thing the gospel talks about is when Jesus gets arrested. He gets accused of being the King of the Jews. He is asked many questions, but he doesn't answer most of them. Then, they decided to talk to Peter. He did just what Jesus told him he would do. "Before the cock crows, you will deny me three times," meaning that he would act like he had no idea who Jesus was. There were not many people who believed in Jesus at that time and there are still people today who don't know who he is. They don't learn about him at their church. In the end, they all decided to release the bad guy instead of the one who didn't do anything bad.

Sometimes, things are hard to understand. Why would they release the bad guy and arrest a guy who was just praying? Employees would even ask themselves why did their boss fire a person who didn't do anything wrong. People would think of it the other way. Many people in authority don't like people who claim to be something that they are not. That is most likely the main reason why Jesus was arrested.

At the end of the day, it seems like you are watching a superhero movie. Jesus was like the Batman and Barabbas was like the Joker. The Joker went to prison and was always set free and he went and caused more mischief. We learn many things from watching a superhero beating the bad guy, but this time the good guy came a little short in an attempt to beat the bad guy. This teaches us that you can't take anything for granted and you can't do things that others will disapprove of.

The significance and symbolism of incense used in the church

We cannot tell the exact period in the Church's history when the use of incense was introduced into liturgical celebrations. However, since the early Christian community never abandoned their worship in the Synagogues completely (cf. ...), it could be said that they retained the use of incense in their emerging liturgy. As early as the fifth century, reference to the use of incense in the Church's liturgy was made in liturgical documents such as the liturgies of Ss. James and Mark and a seventh century Roman Ritual.



From its earliest usage, particularly in Judaism, incense has been associated with prayers. The smoke that rises from the burning of incense symbolizes the prayer of the people rising to heaven. The Psalmist, in Ps. 141, made reference to this symbolism saying, "Let my prayer come like incense before you; the lifting of my hand like the evening sacrifice". The burning of incense also symbolizes purification and sanctification. We should note that the use of incense is directed toward the worship of God. It is of great necessity that the people and the materials used within such worship be purified and set apart for a worthy worship of God. Thus, the need to incense the altar, the sacred species (bread and wine), and the people and ministers during liturgical celebration. The significance of incensing the people at liturgical celebrations, including the body of a deceased at funeral liturgy, is supported by the fact that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit. As such, our "temples" are symbolically purified and sanctified with the use of incense. "The usage of incense adds a sense of solemnity and mystery to the Mass. The visual imagery of the smoke and the smell remind us of the transcendence of the Mass which links heaven with earth, and allows us to enter into the presence of God" (Fr. Saunders, President of Notre Dame Institute in Alexandria, https:// www.ewtn.com/library/ANSWERS/INCENSE.HTM).
