WEBB, THOMAS PETER, REV. (1815-1886)

Thomas Burton WEBB III, posted the following on website:

"On March 3, 1845, the Territory of Florida, which the United States had gained from Spain in 1821, became the twenty-seventh state to join the

Union. Florida at that time was hardly the major state it is today - - the 1840 census showed only 54,000 people (less than the city of Tallahassee could claim in 1980) and at the time of its admission to the Union ranked twenty - sixth in population. Only Iowa, admitted the same year, had fewer people. That same year Thomas Peter WEBB, his wife Mary SULLIVAN WEBB, and his brother Samuel Sanders WEBB moved from Culbreath, (Randolph County), Georgia to Madison, County, Florida. Thomas Peter WEBB was a farmer and Baptist preacher, the son of Axiom WEBB, whose descendants, along with those of his brother, can be found in Madison County to this day. Thomas Peter and Mary Sullivan WEBB had thirteen children before her death in 1856; in 1862 he married Carolyn Lyons and with her fathered a further seven children. He was also, incidentally, the first Thomas WEBB, a name which has remained for seven straight generations. Rev. Thomas Peter WEBB, son of Betty DIXON and William Axion WEBB, was born December 20, 1815 in Georgia. On January 7, 1836, in Georgia, he married the former Miss Mary SULLIVAN, daughter of Lydia PEACOCK and William SULLIVAN, who was born February 15, 1813 in Bulloch County, GA. About 1845, Thomas and his wife moved from Culbreath, Randolph County, GA to Madison. Thomas was a farmer and a Baptist preacher. They were the parents of the following children:

Mary Sullivan WEBB passed away in 1856. In 1862, Thomas married Carolyn LYONS and they had another seven children. According to the 1870 and 1880 Census documents these children were probably:

WEBB, LEVY (1849-1922)

Mr. Berry Levy (Levi) WEBB, a confederate veteran and long time citizen of Madison Co., FL, died at the home of his son, Axiom WEBB, south of Lee, on December 1, 1922 due to the infirmities of age. Mr. Webb was born on April 16, 1849 in Madison County and lived there until about 1897 when he moved to Lafayette County. On January 15, 1865 he enlisted in the military and

was discharged May 15, 1865 at the surrender. He applied for a pension on July 17, 1909 while a resident of Lafayette County. About 1920 he and Mrs. Webb moved back and lived with Mr. and Mrs. W. H. PHILLIPS. Mr. Webb was nearly 74 years old when he passed and left five children: Lee and Berry WEBB of Mayo, A. W. Manning and Jephtha WEBB of Lee and one daughter, Mrs. William Henry PHILLIPS (Tempy) of Lee.

Eveline Catherine PETERSON WEBB, daughter of Thymethy PETERSON (buried at Midway) and Catherine WHEELER (buried at Midway), was born January 28, 1845. On January 3, 1867, in Madison, FL, she married Mr. Levy WEBB, son of Thomas Peter WEBB and Mary SULLIVAN. The 1880 US Census for Ellaville and Nortons Creek, Madison,

Florida shows her living with her husband Levy and the following children: Tempy (10), Axum (7), Manning (5), Jephtha (2) and Levy (6M). A website named Burval Genealogy shows that Eveline and Levy were the parents of:

WEBB, MANNING M. (1875-1950)

Mr. Manning M. WEBB, son of Eveline Catherine PETERSON and Berry Levi WEBB, was born December 11, 1875. On June 17, 1895 in Lee, Madison County, he married the former Miss Amanda Seville HICKS, daughter of Elmira SULLIVAN and Lewis H. HICKS. At the time of the

1880 Census, he was living with his parents and the following siblings: Tempy (10 yrs), Axum (7 yrs), Jephtha (2), and Levy (6 mos). He and Amanda were the parents of:

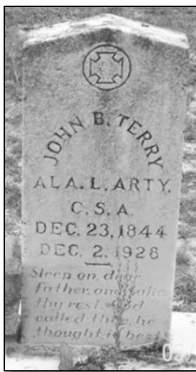
WEBB, JEPHTHA (1877-1966)

Mr. Jephtha P. WEBB, son of Levy WEBB and Eveline Catherine PETERSON, was born November 6, 1877 in Madison County. On July 17, 1895, he married the former Miss Mattie HICKS. Mr. Webb died Saturday, 29 Oct 1966, at the age of 88 years in

the Madison County Memorial Hospital following a

long illness. He was a retired farmer and had spent most of his life in Madison County. He was survived by his widow of Madison; three daughters, Mrs. Rose WELLS of Diboll, TX, Mrs. Evelyn MCLEOD of Madison, and one step-daughter, Mrs. Leona BASS of Madison; four sons, Alvin WEBB of Crestview, Luther WEBB of Toledo, Ohio, Jodie and Olie WEBB of St. Petersburg; three step-sons, John Henry MATHIS of St Petersburg, Willie MATHIS of Madison and Calvin MATHIS of Monticello; 51 grandchildren; 50 great-grandchildren and 13 great-great grandchildren. His funeral services were held at the graveside in Midway Cemetery and conducted by Rev. Carl WEBB. Pallbearers were Lloyd COLVIN, Donald BISHOP, Dorman PICKLES, Leaton BELL, Hoyt PENNY, Truman WEBB, Virgil FOXX, Joe PHILLIPS, Cecil WILLIAMSON, Willard HALE and Olin WEBB. TERRY, JOHN B. (1844-1928)



On Sunday morning at 4 o'clock December 2, 1928, all that was mortal of John B. TERRY passed to the great beyond. He had been confined to his bed for more than two weeks with cold but did not seem to be seriously ill, dying of infirmities of old age. While still young he connected himself with the Baptist church and attended the services whenever his health would permit, and he was nearly always able to

attend. He was born in Barbour County, AL., and if he had lived till the 23rd of the month (Dec.) he would have been 85 years old. He moved to this state and county 49 years ago and had lived here since. In early life he married Miss Susan DICKENS, also of Alabama. She preceded him to the better world 33 years ago. He served in the war between the states for four years, and was always delighted to talk about the battles and the many comrades that fought by his side. He was survived by one son (another son died three days prior to his death), W. M. TERRY of Lee and four daughters, Mrs. Drew HUGHEY and Mrs. T. L. MORSE of Madison, Mrs. S. E. BULLARD of Fort Worth, TX, and Mrs. A. W. MORSE of Homestead, FL. He left five brothers, T. F. and C. A. TERRY of Pinetta, J. T. and W. H. E. TERRY of Ray City, GA, and Obadiah TERRY of Branford, FL, and one sister, Mrs. Savannah HORNE of Ray City, GA. He also left 21 grandchildren and 9 great-grand children, besides a host of other relatives. Interment was made in the family lot at Midway on Tuesday, 4 Dec 1928, in the presence of neighbors, friends, and the sorrowing children, all being present except Mr. T. L. MORSE, who was seriously ill at her home. Rev. A. M. PARKER conducted the

funeral services. The 1910 US Census shows John as a widower living with his children, William, Bell, and Agnes.

TERRY, OSCAR J. (1889-1928)



Mr. Oscar J. TERRY, son of John B. TERRY and Susannah Jane Myriah DICKENS, was born 22 September 1889. Susannah was born August 5, 1856 and married John B. TERRY who was born January 23, 1844 in Muscogee Co, GA. Susan

died February 5, 1896 in Madison. John died December 2, 1928 in Madison Co. They are both buried at Midway Cemetery. See a photo of both at: <http://www.genealogy.com/users/b/u/r/Sheri-L-Burnsferris/PHOTO/0002photo.html>. Oscar was the 469th person drawn in Madison County for the World War I draft on 20 Jul 1917. At his home on the Troy Road, 14 miles south of Madison, FL, Mr. Terry passed away on Wednesday night, November 28, 1928. He had been sick with malaria and flu for two and a half weeks, and the last few days that he lived his illness had developed into pneumonia. He was 39 years of age and had lived in Madison County his entire life. All that medical skill and loving hands could do was done, but the grim monster death had come for his spirit and he went away. He left to mourn his passing a heart-broken wife and four children, two sons and two daughters, also one brother and four sisters. He was buried in the presence of a large concourse of friends and neighbors. Rev. S.G. WARD conducted the funeral services. 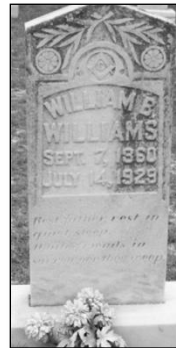
WILLIAMSON, OTTIS (1899-1946)

and Jefferson Daniel WILLIAMSON, was born 21 August 1899 in Dowling Park, Florida. He married the former Miss Vader Arlene WEBB, daughter of Mary HICKS and Jephtha P. WEBB. Mr. Williamson, a well known citizen of Madison County was living south of Lee when he passed away on Thursday, June 20, 1946. He was laid to rest Saturday afternoon, June 22, 1946. His pallbearers were Messrs. Clinton ANDERSON, Elize ROGERS, Joe PHILLIPS, Norman HOWARD, Glisson WILLIAMS, and Gordon RAGANS. The 1910 US Census shows him living with his parents, J. D. and Annie, and the following siblings: Mathew and Eula May. By the 1935 Florida State Census, he is shown living with his wife, Vader and the following children: Johnnie (17), Wilbur (13), Vansy (10), Eldridge (5) and Lenard (3). She was born June 5, 1856 in Florida and passed away on December 3, 1929. They were the parents of:

Correcting Wrong Information

As we all know, wrong information once it is published is repeated and is very hard to correct. Case in point:

Cherry Ann Harrell and James Newton Albritton

Cherry Ann HARRELL was born May 14, 1843 to the parents of Daniel HARRELL and Eliza GRANTHAM. She had the following siblings: Benjamin Daniel, Nathan Alterman, Elisha Mason, and Eli Wesley. Her mother, Eliza died 4 Aug 1847 in Marion Co., Florida. In 1850 Cherry Ann is living in the household of John S. HARRELL. Her brother, Eli is living with his maternal grandparents, Benjamin and Cherry Ann GRANTHAM in Marion Co. FL. Her brothers, Benjamin and Elisha are living with his father, Daniel. I have not found Nathan on the 1850 census. October 30, 1858 Cherry Ann married James Newton ALBRITTON; in either Lowndes Co., GA or Taylor Co., Florida.

The above information was from the following: 1850 Georgia and Florida Census Records, Judge Huxford's notes, Grantham genealogy records, James Newton's and Cherry Ann's obituaries, various other documents as well as and talking with Cherry Ann's daughter, Nancy V. Albritton PICKELS and with several of her grandchildren and other relatives.

In the book, *Brooks County Georgia Echoes of Its People* on page 246 it states: "11. Cherry Ann HARRELL (b. 1844, Cherry Lake, Florida) married Wesley MCCORMICK on November 11, 1860."

- Error 1. Because Cherry Ann was living in the household of John S. HARRELL in 1850 and he had a son born in July of 1843 it has been assumed that Cherry Ann was the daughter of John S and Nancy AUSLEY HARRELL and since they had a son born in July of 1843 Cherry Ann's birth date has been listed in 1844.
- Error 2. Cherry Ann did not marry Wesley MCCORMICK in 1860. She was already married to James Newton ALBRITTON. Wesley MCCORMICK married Polly Ann HARRELL in Brooks Co., Georgia November 11, 1860. (*This marriage record is from the Brooks County Court House and posted on Ancestry.com*)

Other Errors that I have seen in other places:

- In his book, *Albrittons of the Second Millennium, Revised Edition*, Bobby ALBRITTON has Cherry Ann's name as Sarah Ann (Fannie).
- On the 1900 census James Newton ALBRITTON's wife is listed as Sarah A. and thus some have assumed and posted that he was married twice. This is false, he was still married to Cherry Ann

when he died in 1918. It's just another proof that census takers didn't always write down the correct information. According to her grandchildren she was never referred to as Fannie.

- Cherry Ann is listed as Nancy Cherry Ann on several Family Trees on Ancestry. Cherry Ann's brother, Nathan had a daughter named Nancy Cherry Ann but Cherry Ann Harrell never used the name Nancy Cherry Ann.

- 1870 Madison Co., FL; Newton J.; age 35, wife Cherry A., 26
- 1880 Madison Co., FL; J. N. ALBRITTON; age 44; wife Cherry Ann, 38
- 1885 State Census Madison Co., FL; J. N. ALBRITTON; age 47, wife Cherry Ann, age 41 (ancestry reads it as Cheryma)
- 1900 Madison Co., FL; James N.; age 63; wife Sarah A., 57
- 1910 Madison Co., FL; James N.; age 70, wife Cherry; age 67; married for 51 years

More Errors:

- Several family trees on Ancestry have James Newton ALBRITTON living in Oktibbeha, Mississippi in 1880. There is a Newton ALBRITTON and a Nancy ALBRITTON living there in 1880 listed as brother in law and sister in law of the head of household but our James Newton and Cherry Ann always lived in Madison County after they were married.
- Another instance Daniel HARRELL is listed as having married Eliza or Elizabeth PAGE. Again this is in error. He married Eliza Grantham. His son, Benjamin Daniel married Elizabeth Page.
- Daniel Harrell married Sarah "Frances" WILLIS May 19, 1850 following the death of his first wife, Eliza GRANTHAM. Many assume because Frances, listed with him on the 1850 census is 16 and younger than some of Daniel's children, that Frances is a daughter. However she is his wife

While exploring the web for information on our folks from Madison, we stumbled across a site which contained information we thought would be of interest to some of our members. After making contact with the site owner, Jeff Thomas, gg-grandson of the below mentioned Isham B. Thomas, we received his permission to share it with you. If you can add any information to that below, please let us know so that we can share with him.

The descendants of Ivey A. Thomas of Madison County, Florida, 1840 - 1922

Ivey A. THOMAS and Isham J. THOMAS are shown as members of the Isham B. THOMAS household on the Alachua County, Florida 1860 federal census. However, they are listed after the other household members and are shown as farm laborers and not as children of Isham B. THOMAS. I have been looking into both these persons as a possible link to determine more information about Isham B. THOMAS thinking they must be some way related to each other and to Isham B. Hopefully, someone will have some information on these people....

Ivey THOMAS, son of William M. and Nancy THOMAS, was born 16 Nov 1840 in Madison Co., according to his Florida Confederate Pension application. He died 26 Aug 1922, also in Madison, where he had lived in the Lovett community. His death certificate does not list a date of birth, nor give any information about his parents. The 1860 census shows Ivey's age as 18 which roughly coincides with his date of birth of November 16, 1840 shown on his Confederate Pension application. Will records at the Madison courthouse, for William M. THOMAS, specifically show Ivey A. THOMAS and William H. THOMAS as his sons and heirs. William M. THOMAS died in Madison sometime between 1 Oct and 11 Nov 1857 and his will was probated there. This will left his estate to his wife (unnamed) and upon her death, equally to his two sons when they came of age. The 1850 Madison County federal census shows the William M. THOMAS household as follows: William M. THOMAS, 41 years old, farmer, born in GA; Nancy THOMAS, 44 years old, born in GA; Jermiah THOMAS, 10 years old, born in GA; William THOMAS, 7 years old, born in GA.

Based on the age of Jermiah, and the names of his father and brother matching William M.'s will, I suspect that Jermiah and Ivey could be the same person.

Ivey Thomas' pension application shows he served in the Confederate Army during the civil war. He first enlisted in Madison on 5 Apr 1861 in Company F of the 1st Florida Infantry Regiment. Upon the expiration of his enlistment, he was discharged at Montgomery, Alabama, on April 4, 1862. He later enlisted in Hardee's Company H of the 9th Georgia Infantry Regiment. On August 30, 1862 he was wounded in the right thigh in the second Battle

of Manassas. He was permanently disabled and was sent home from the hospital and remained at home during the rest of the war.

Ivey THOMAS married three times, all in Brooks County, GA: 1) Catherine MCMULLEN, md. 21 Jul 1864, Recorded in Book A, Page 50, Notes: probably divorced before 1877. 2) Feby JOHNSON, md. 4 July 1880, Recorded in Book B, Page 474. 3) Julia THOMPSON, md. 13 Aug 1884, Recorded in Book C, Page 159, Notes: Survived him.

Real estate records show several property transactions involving Ivey THOMAS for land in both Brooks and Madison and the property apparently straddled the state line. An 1877 transaction showed that Catherine THOMAS was residing in Hillsborough County, FL while Ivey was in Madison indicating they were living apart at that time. I have not yet found any record of divorces for Ivey A. THOMAS. Also, there are some actions involving real estate owned jointly by Ivey and his brother, William H. THOMAS.

William's wife is identified as Laura L. THOMAS on an 1876 deed. William married L. L. BLOCKER on 7 Feb 1867, in Madison. Laura was the daughter of Haley T. and Sarah BLOCKER and was born in Leon County, FL about 1851 and died Sep 1884 in Madison.

A July 10, 1902 Madison deed from Ivey A. and Julia THOMAS to their daughter, Jessie T. THOMAS, conveyed Ivey's and Julia's real and personal property to Jessie leaving Ivey and Julia a life estate. There is a record of a marriage of Jessie T. THOMAS to Clarence CRAMER on August 5, 1906.

Madison probate records show Ivey A. THOMAS died at Lovett 26 Aug 1922. His will, dated 26 May 1906, was filed for probate on 4 Sep 1924, in Will Record Book 3, p. 1-4. More documents are in Administration Record Book 2, p. 269-272.

State of Florida
County of Madison

I, Ivey A. Thomas do make and publish this, my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

I hereby bequeath to my daughter Jennie Quinn one dollar to my daughter Mary Church one dollar, to my daughter Nannie Sloan one dollar, and to my daughter Jessie Thomas one dollar, the rest of my property both real and personal, wheresoever the same may be, to my beloved wife Julia to have and use during her natural life then at her death all of said property both real and personal to go to and belong to my daughter Jessie. I hereby appoint my said wife the executrix of this my last will and testament. My will is that my said wife shall not be required to give any bond or security to the Judge of Probate for the faithful execution of the duties of executrix.

In witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th day of May A.D. 1906.

Ivey A. Thomas (L.S.)

Signed, published and declared by the above named Ivey A. Thomas as his last will and testament in the

presence of us who at his request have signed as witnesses of the same.

Probate documents filed 12 Oct 1922 show he was survived by: Julia THOMAS, widow; Mrs. Howell QUINN, daughter; Mrs. Minnie SLOAN, daughter (not listed as "Nannie"); Charlie CHURCH, Jr., grandchild; Lucius CHURCH, grandchild; and Ivey Thomas CRAMER, grandchild

Based on the above, Ivey THOMAS had four children: 1) Jennie THOMAS (b. 2 Nov 1864, md. James Howell QUINN bef. May 1906, died 12 Oct 1924, Miami, Dade, FL; 2) Mary THOMAS (Mamie Lea THOMAS md. Charles CHURCH on 25 Oct 1885 and died between 1906 & 1922; 3) Nannie (or Minnie) THOMAS (md. "unknown" SLOAN before May 1906 and died after 1924; and 4) Jessie T. THOMAS (b. Mar 1885, md. Charles CRAMER, 5 Aug 1906, died between 1910 & 1920).

Jessie THOMAS was born in 1885 according to the 1900 census and her mother would have been Julia THOMPSON. Catherine (Kate) MCMULLEN was the mother of Jennie (per Jennie's death certificate) and Mary (as Mary was old enough to marry in 1885). Catherine probably was the mother

of the other daughter but I have no proof of this since Ivey THOMAS eluded both the 1870 and 1880 federal censuses as well as the 1885 Florida state census. Daughters Mary Thomas CHURCH and Jessie Thomas CRAMER did not survive Ivey THOMAS as their shares of his estate went to their children

In a September 4, 1924 filing with the court, Julia THOMAS stated that Ivey A THOMAS was survived by herself; two daughters, Jennie QUINN and Nannie SLOAN; and three grandchildren, Charlie QUINN, Lucius QUINN and Ivey THOMAS. There is no mention of the name "Cramer" for the grandson Ivey THOMAS. The court records in the Will Record Book regarding this probate case are typewritten transcriptions, so both the Minnie-Nannie Sloan name conflict and the omission of "Cramer" from the grandchild's name may be typographical errors.

If you have any connection to or information about any of the above mentioned folks, please let us know so that we can help Mr. Thomas. He is specifically requesting help determining if there is a relationship between Isham B., Ivey A., and Isham J. THOMAS. This information is located at the following website:

GRAHAM, LEWIS W./NOV. 2, 1889/DEC. 14, 1956

Lewis Waterman GRAHAM, 67, one of Brooks County's leading citizens, died Friday, December 14, 1956, at his home in the Rock Hill section following an illness of several months. Several months ago it was realized Mr. Graham was suffering from an incurable illness and friends had joined members of his family in grave concern over his suffering. He was in the hospital for some time but several weeks ago he was moved to his home to spend his last days. Mr. Graham was born in Horry County, South Carolina on November 2, 1889, a son of the late Covington GRAHAM and Mary JORDAN GRAHAM. The family moved to Brooks county fifty eight years ago and is among the county's most highly esteemed residents. Mr. Graham was an outstanding farmer, his pasture, developments having gained south-wide acclaim. He was designated as the Kiwanis Club Key Farmer several years ago and was a leader in all agricultural movements here. A member of Morrison Baptist Church for a number of years, he had served in various official capacities including deacon, Sunday School teacher and other posts. He served as clerk of Mercer Baptist Association for several years and gave to his church a devoted and loyal service. Mr. Graham served as representative from Brooks County from 1939 to 1945 and his record as a legislator was unusually admirable. He was a former member of the Brooks County Board of Education. Occupying a position of importance in this section he was recognized as a leader in all community developments, but it was in his personal life he was most genuinely loved. His quiet, gentle manner, his kindness to those in trouble and his charitable nature made him a man popular with friends in all walks of life and he will be missed in Brooks County. He is survived by his wife, the former Miss Janie COOPER; three sons and two daughters; Lewis Vivian GRAHAM, Wilson W. GRAHAM and Paul GRAHAM of Brooks County, Mrs. Janelle GRAHAM TILLMAN of Savannah and Miss Evelyn GRAHAM of New Smyrna Beach, Florida. He is also survived by eleven grandchildren, a sister and a brother, H. H. GRAHAM and Mrs. C. G. FUQUA of Barney. Funeral services were held Sunday, December 16, 1956, at Morrison Baptist Church where he had worshipped for so long. Rev. Lawrence AGAN, Rev. Paul SWOFFORD and Rev. Gans ERNEST conducted the service. Active pallbearers were Oral YATES, E. L. CHILDERS, I. B. HAYES, Luther GRIFFIN, Steve ASHLEY and James HARRIS. Honorary pallbearers were J. W. MCALLISTER, C. C.
