Our Mission

Thrive is an informal gathering of homeschooling families who exists to provide practical support and spiritual encouragement to each other through weekly meetings, resource sharing, and prayer while building a sense of community through children's classes, activities, field trips and opportunities for enrichment and interaction.

What is Homeschooling?

We subscribe to the following definition of effective, quality home education as outlined by the MACHE directors and veteran home educators: "...the traditional family is the foundation of society and parents have the God-given responsibility to determine the proper education for their children. Home education takes place when children are primarily taught under the authority of their own parents in their own home. We believe that parents, not government, should determine the curriculum and standards for their own children. We believe that home education fulfills its highest calling when parents educate their children according to Christ-centered, Biblical principles."

Statement of Christian Faith

Bible - The Scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, are the inspired, infallible Word of God and is the final authority for what we believe and how we strive to live. It is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness. The Bible is the complete revelation of God's will for the salvation of man and the supreme and final authority in all matters of faith and life. 2 Timothy 3:16-17, 2 Peter 1:20-21

God - There is one living and true God who is infinite, eternal and unchangeable in all His attributes. He is eternally existing in three persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Man - Man was created in God's image to have fellowship with Him and to glorify and serve Him. When man fell into sin he was separated from God. He became spiritually dead and therefore unable to please God or merit salvation.

This gift must be individually received in faith, not trusting in good works, but only in the sacrificial death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.  - Respecting building and property.
 - Do not run.
 - Do not go outside without an adult.
 - Treat all furniture, walls, doors, etc. with respect.
 - Do not enter any room not assigned to us.
 - If you make a mess, clean it up.
 - Following Classroom Etiquette:
 - Please don't interrupt.
 - Participate cheerfully!
 - Take turns.
 - Positively representing the homeschool community while at off-site field trips.

Discipline Policy

If a child is disobedient or disrespectful, the person in charge of the activity will:

- 1. On the 1st offense, the adult will talk to the child and explain that the behavior was unacceptable.
- 2. On the 2nd offense, the child will be removed from the activity and the parent will be contacted.
- 3. If the behavior continues, the parent will be required to sit in the class with the child.
- 4. If the offense occurs during unstructured time, the students will need to sit next to their parent throughout the rest of the day or for the following class day.
