




STEWARDS OF GRACE

All that we have, All that we are, All that we hope to be We give to You, We give to You


We are an offering!

We hope you enjoyed the produce from this year's Good News Garden, whether cucumbers, peppers, zucchini, tomatoes, or lovely flowers....or just the



Reading Roulette: Read the third book you see on your Want to Read shelf. Lo-Carb Meals on the Go.


Primary Reading: Read a book with a number or color in the title. *Five Sisters* by Fox

Back to School: Read a book about a subject you don't know much about. The Tibetan Book of the Dead






