The Social Security Administration announced that the maximum amount of wages in 2018 subject to the 6.2% Social Security tax will rise from \$127,200 to \$128,400, an increase of a little more than 1%. H. 403(b) and 457 2018 Maximum Allowable Contribution Limits

The IRS announced the 2018 Maximum Allowable Contribution limits. While the catch-up limits remain unchanged at \$6,000, the elective deferral limits have increased from \$18,000 to \$18,500. Employees age 50 and over are entitled to contribute the additional \$6,000 to their plan(s) thereby increasing the elective deferral limit to \$24,500.

Individuals with at least 15 years of service with their current employer may be entitled to contribute up to an additional \$3,000 above their age-based limit, potentially increasing the limit to \$27,500 for a participant utilizing both the age based and the full amount of the service based catch-up provisions. I. FLEX Spending

Flexible Benefits may be used for unreimbursed medical or dental expenses or dependent care. The District has opted for a 2.5 month extension plan. Participants may incur expenses through March 15th of the calendar year following the year of the election; all requests for reimbursement must be submitted to the plan administrator (Preferred Group) no later than March 31st.


