



**REFLECTION**

This Sunday is filled with lessons of the Eucharist and how Christ nourishes our body and soul. The first reading focuses on Moses explaining the great works of Christ who saved the people from the desert and fed them with want of nothing in return. This first reading just begins to prove the significance of trusting in Jesus. He will provide you with life when you entrust your faith in him.

The second reading speaks about how we are all one. We are all God's children cut from one loaf, meaning that we are all a part of one another, and of Jesus. Whenever we celebrate the Eucharist, we are once again representing how Jesus sacrificed his part of the loaf so that we would forever live with him in us.

The Gospel expresses how Jesus is infused within our lives. By receiving the body and blood of Christ, we are reminded that we are also receiving life. Just as literal food and drink provide physical living sustenance, receiving Jesus provides sustenance in spiritual faith and eternal life. When we take the time to acknowledge all that has been sacrificed and offered to us, it should provide meditation of how we are utilizing the gifts of Christ. In what ways are we using the life the Lord has blessed us with? Let every Sunday's receiving of the Eucharist be a reminder of how we are one with Christ and how we can live a life worth sacrifice.
