#### Ponders: A look back at 2019

This is the time of year when the club officers and board members ask ourselves how did we do in the past year?

Like algae in a pond, we were disappointed in some outcomes this past year that we need to improve for 2020.

Did we do everything right? Nope, not at all. We had some meetings that didn't go as well as we would have liked. We will try harder next year.

Were the speakers all fascinating? Not all of them were and perhaps we can do better, or try something completely different.

Did the pond tour go perfectly? While the weather cooperated and we had some nice ponds, we did hear that some folks missed having a book of locations (more about this later), and a few of the ponds did not meet some of our member's higher expectations.

We wanted to increase membership and that has been a challenge and somewhat of a disappointment. This will be a goal for 2020.

We wanted to recruit some additional volunteers to help with various activities and efforts. Sadly, we did not achieve this goal. It will remain a focus for 2020. Now we can look at some of the bright spots:

The major accomplishment this year was developing an app that would help the club in the long term with administration of club activities, communications, memberships, and financials. The primary goal was to cut back on the expense and huge effort required to produce the tour books. Producing the books took a tremendous amount of time, were quite expensive to produce and it became an un-sustainable effort to continue given the volunteer resources we have. In addition, the books were distributed to members and sponsors but were hard to control to ensure that what had been distributed was ultimately paid for, something we were never able to reconcile accurately. We will investigate if a short, printed list of addresses might be an option for next year that could be emailed to members.

The advantages of the app are:

- The app administers all aspects of the pond tour and allows last minute additions or deletions of tour locations which was not possible after the books of past years were printed.
- It provides a GPS map of each pond with directions to each location that is easily retrievable on a smartphone.
- It provides much improved and accurate tracking of tour revenue over the old book distribution process.
- It electronically retains past tour locations, photographs, addresses, directions, parking information, and other information that could be easily retrieved for use in the future.
- It keeps track of paid members, past members and those interested in possibly joining and allows for expanded communications capabilities via email, text and social media.
- It keeps track of all sponsor information, contacts, logos and financial information.
- It has the capability to summarize financial information as well.

• It allows for easy uploading of photos, videos and other information needed for the pond tour.

In short, the app has accomplished a great deal to cut future expenses and save time in developing future pond tours and other club activities as well as having a central location to maintain membership information, sponsor contacts and communication activities. The officers, board members and volunteers spent considerably less time and money this year by making the change allowing us to focus on other activities. Hang in there, like a good wine, it will improve with age!

One of our big successes was incorporating the use of a credit card reader for our members to pay for membership and extra activities, such as the banquet and evening pond tour. This is much more convenient than remembering to bring cash or a check. Thanks to Daniel Peel who was instrumental in setting up the club to accommodate the card reader.

We increased the number of ponds on the tour from a total of 15 ponds on the tour in 2018 to 23 in 2019.

King Richard was able to encourage some past members who had let their membership lapse to rejoin and we are grateful for his efforts in this regard. Our board meetings have improved by keeping better notes to track tasks and commitments as well as having a clear picture of the club finances.

A new club event was developed this year-the evening "Light Up the Night" pond tour. Our first effort at this type of event was very successful. We have identified ways to improve this event and we may attempt an improved version for 2020.

The club website was greatly improved by adding the current newsletter and past issues to review or download. We have done a much better job keeping our website up to date with meeting and tour information. We have a lot to thank Kelly Flint for in being so instrumental in improving our website. A significant accomplishment this year was the big increase in the number of paid sponsors. Next time you see Lewis Wayman, please thank him for his outstanding efforts in this regard.

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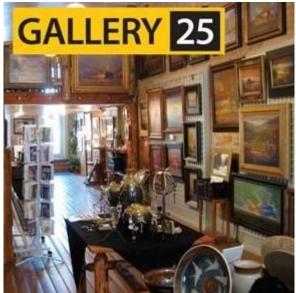
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
