Gem State Classic Bull and Female Sale

Rules and Regulations

1. Entry Forms, entry fees and registration papers need to be mailed to Idaho Angus Association on or before December 1, 2019. Any information not available by entry deadline may not be printed in the catalog, including genomic or genetic defect test results. Any consignor who does not have their paperwork in order, will not receive their proceed check. Entry fees are non- refundable.
2. All consignors are subject to the term and conditions adopted by the American Angus Association, and stated in the catalog.
3. All consignors are to assist in trucking. Each consignor's animals are their responsibility until proper trucking/delivery arrangements have been made.
4. All transactions are between buyer and seller. Consignors will be paid for consignment only after the funds have been received from the purchaser and cleared the bank. The Idaho Angus Association assumes no liability for any uncollected funds or funds that are slow in being collected.
5. All cattle must be free of any lethal genetic defects. Any female bred to a known lethal genetic defect carrier will not be allowed.
6. Age Requirement for all Bulls- September 1, 2017 to April 1, 2019.
7. All haltered bulls will need to be led with a nose lead at all times.
8. All haltered bulls will be sorted into two divisions, Growth and Low BEPD. There will also be a broke-to-tie penned bull division. These bulls do not need to be halter broke or able to be led, but they will need to be able to be tied up. These bulls will be penned and sold in groups of two. The requirements for the Low BEPD section are as follows:
 - Raw actual birth weight is #80 or below
 - Actual Birth EPD is +2.0 or below
 - Sire and Dam's actual birth EPD is +2.5 or below
 - **Actual CED EPD is +6 or higher**
 - All haltered bulls not meeting these requirements will be considered growth bulls.
9. The classification of bulls will be made from the animals EPD's as of entry deadline. Only official AHIR information will be used and printed in the catalog.
10. There is a maximum entry of 5 non Angus bulls and 5 non Angus females per consignor.
11. Sale order will be made by a qualified judge. The judge and the sale vet will evaluate and grade each entry. All cattle will then be sold by grade, oldest to youngest, including the pens. Bulls, females, then steers. Said vet and said judge have the right to sift cattle for soundness, quality, performance, and etc.
12. Any animal sifted from the sale, forfeits their entry fees. They must also be removed from the sale facility prior to Saturday morning.
13. Each consignor has the right to floor their animals as they see fit. Any no sales from this floor will be charged commission on the said floor as well as sale cost.
14. All animals arriving from out of state, must be accompanied by a brand inspection.
15. No sale flyers or ads for any sales outside of the Gem State Classic will be allowed.
16. Any consignor who attacks, verbally or otherwise, the judge, the sale vet, the sale brand inspector, the ringmen, another consignor, an Idaho Angus Association board or sale committee member, or anyone else affiliated with our sale, can or will have their entry fees forfeited and asked to leave the premises at any point and time.

17. An original health paper from a qualified vet must accompany each animal. One health paper per consignor is sufficient with copies made for each entry.
18. The health requirements are as follows:

Bulls:

- Must have a PCR trich test within 30 days, whether they are virgin bulls or not.
- Every entry must have passed a breeding soundness exam (semen test, etc) by a qualified vet within 30 days.
- Every entry will be required to have a current trich tag in their ear. No exceptions.
- A permanent ID, EID tag or metal ID clip, is required. Each individual's number needs to be recorded on the official health paper.
- If originating from a non-free TB state, then a TB test is required.

Females:

- All females 4 months of age and older, must have been calfhood Brucellosis vaccinated. Every female is required to have a legible bangs tattoo and a metal identification tag. Each individual bangs tag number needs to be recorded on the official health paper.
- All females selling with the status of "Bred", must have a current preg check within 30 days that is also recorded on the health papers.
- If originating from a non-free TB state, then a TB test is required.

Commercial Heifers

Anyone wishing to enter pens of commercial heifers please contact Sarah Fuller or Mark Frisbie. This section is open to all cattlemen, and does not have to be an Angus producer.

- Each of the heifer entries has to be predominately black hided.
- They will sell in groups of 3 or more.
- A consignor must have at least 5 head to consign.
- Heifers will be penned and do not have to be halter broke. However, calm easy to handle cattle are highly suggested.
- Commercial heifers will follow the same health requirements as stated above.
- All commercial heifer consignors will abide by the rules and regulations as stated above.
- Entry fee for commercial heifers will be \$20 per head. This money will be credited towards the final sales commission and fees.
- There will be a maximum of 60 head of commercial females sold, first time consignors will be limited to a 20 head maximum.
