## Jacobo's Story

My name is Jacobo. I am from Honduras. I came to the United States 8 years ago. After a year, my wife and our children came to the United States. I have two boys and one daughter.

I work in construction. I am the foreman on the construction site. I have to make sure everyone is safe. I speak English to the 32 guys who work for me and I have to speak English to my boss. Usually my boss and I speak over a radio or we text. I have to listen good when he speaks to me over the radio. Sometimes I hear things wrong. Once I heard him say, "Oh my bad." But he said "Oh, my back." I understand the difference now. Some English words are very similar.

My tutor works with me two times a week. On Tuesday we talk about the verb "to be" and the days and months of the years. On Thursday he helps me with the citizenship test. I learn about American history: about the first president of the United States and the Civil War. I want to apply for citizenship in two months and I hope I will get my citizenship 6 months after that. My dream is to get my citizenship and for my family to get their citizenship.

In my home country of Honduras there is a lot of violence. There are a lot of Narcos. Many kids my sons' ages are doing drugs. I don't want that for them. I want them to go to school and to feel safe. I want to buy three more houses for my kids. That is my dream.
