The project initiated in the former Town Branch Market (soon to be The Casual Pint), and then the Festival Market building on Main Street. The intent of this project is to bring light and beauty to the darkness, and call new attention to available downtown spaces. As installations rotate, business owners within the district will have the opportunity to bring artwork into their spaces.
- 2016 The Key: As the 2016 CARAVAN Exhibition of Art, THE KEY is a major East-West peacebuilding traveling art exhibition/installation that uses the globally recognized ancient Egyptian symbol of the Ankh as the canvas for a contemporary message of hope for a harmonious, peaceful and tolerant world.
