### DID YOU KNOW .....

Some of Oceanside's neighborhoods have names from the city's founding, while others are much more recent.

The name "Fire Mountain" is shown on city maps dating to the 1860's. It was then an area of small farms and working class families. Citrus and avocado orchards were common.

Some say the name "Fire Mountain" came from signal fires lit by Native Americans, others claim it was the beautiful sunsets seen from the hills. Still others say it was from families who burned trash on their farms which could be seen from far away because the farms were high on the hill.

Another neighborhood is "Historic Loma Alta" Loma Alta means high hill, though it is about the same height as Fire Mountain. The first houses there were built in the 1920's on larger lots with no sidewalks, giving it a rural feel.

Camp Pendleton was initially a Spanish Land grant called Santa Margarita y Los Flores by its owners Pio Pico brothers. The name stayed with the land even after the brothers had to sell it to settle gambling debts. The Marine Corps bought it in 1942. Camp Pendleton is named after General Joseph H Pendleton who served 46 years!
