Greetings Wildlife and Hunting Enthusiasts:

I hope you've had an enjoyable and productive year in 2015. As I reflect on the year, I can certainly say that the many chapters of Pheasants Forever (PF) in Michigan have. And, the Grand Valley Chapter is one of the chapters that have made a difference. I thought you'd appreciate seeing what these PF chapters have done.

Pheasants Forever Chapters had the following accomplishments in 2015:

- Had 3,982 adult memberships through banquets and 710 youth memberships through banquets and youth events
- Planted 11,959 acres of food plots
- Developed or enhanced 5,095 acres of grassland nest cove
- Planted 370 acres of pollinator habitat that benefits birds, bees, and butterflies
- Restored 74 acres of wetlands
- Planted over 23,000 shrubs and trees.
- Received 6 new DNR Wildlife Habitat Grants exceeding \$300,000 for habitat restoration on public lands
- Held many youth and ladies shooting and mentored hunting events
- Contributed \$58,000 to a PF legislative action fund to influence national legislation, policies and funding for the benefit of wildlife and hunting
- Contributed over \$11,000 to the national No Child Left Indoors program
- Sponsored 124 youth memberships at the Lake Hudson Youth Jamboree that drew over 1000 people
- Supported critical staff positions that work with PF youth programs and Landowner Wildlife Cooperatives in Michigan
- Sponsored Camo at the Capitol and was accepted into the Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus advisory council

A report will soon come out that summarizes all the great work of landowners, agencies and organizations such as Pheasants Forever for the Michigan Pheasant Restoration Initiative during its first 5 years. So much has been done, but so much remains to be done to address the challenges that wildlife face in the farmlands of southern Michigan. With your support through PF chapter banquet attendance, memberships, merchandise purchases, and volunteer activities, we will make wildlife habitat and hunting better both in Michigan and throughout North America.

I hope you are with me in looking forward to a great 2016.

Hello Grand Valley Pheasants Forever Members & Families,


