Note from Dan Pankow: 'Our Hike'

Two years ago, Karen & I moved to Saddle Brooke, an Active Adult resort community of 5,000 houses nestled in the foothills of the Catalina Mountains north of Tucson. We have 2 championship golf courses, several indoor and outdoor heated pools, state-of-the-art exercise facilities, tennis, pickle ball, and boche ball courts, facilities for ceramics, art, sewing, woodwork, computer labs, miles of hiking, biking and golf cart trails, countless clubs of every kind, and 3 world-class restaurants.

So yesterday, with nothing to do, we decided to hike a 3 1/2 mile section of the Arizona Trail, which stretches from Mexico to Utah, and which passes by Saddle Brooke approx 1 mile further up the mountain. But it's a 25-mile drive to get to it.

The trailhead is located at the entrance to High Jinks Ranch, which was founded by Buffalo Bill Cody for the purpose of establishing a gold mine, which he did. However, he lost his shirt and abandoned the site but not before building a series of very interesting (tactful term) buildings, including a main house, all of which exist today, albeit in various states of disrepair. We drove on into the ranch and visited with the present owner, who is in the process of upgrading the site and is open as a bed & breakfast. Whatever one thinks of the buildings, the view is worth the price. From a deck outside an upstairs bedroom, one can look down to the valley below, beyond to the village of Oracle, and on to approx Wichita, Kansas.

The section of trail we chose is referred to as The Cody Trail in honor of Buffalo Bill and it's proximity to High Jinks. We intended to reach the end of Cody where it intersects with another section at 6,500 feet, and continues south. At that point, we'd have been directly under Mt Lemmon, at 9,700 feet the tallest peak in the Catalina's, and could have looked down to the west upon Saddle Brooke and to the northwest onto the Biosphere, a famous Arizona landmark located in the Catalina foothills at 3,800 feet. (Our house in Saddle Brooke is 3,200 feet)

But alas, at 5 1/2 miles in, Karen tweaked her ankle and decided to return to the car rather than risk continuing on and getting too sore to make it back. So, we returned home and basked in our pool, contemplating our next attempt at Cody Trail.

We have enjoyed these two years in paradise and only regret not moving here before. We have found only two residents who don't like it here, and I just assume they either hit their head as a youngster or ate their brain as a teenager.

I have kept in touch with several mates over the years, and would love to reacquaint myself with anybody else who would like to visit southern Arizona. We have a casita (a fancy southwestern word for detached guest house) that anybody would be welcome to use. A word of warning – we've had two friends visit from other parts of the country who had no intention of moving, but after visiting, could not resist buying houses here.

I think it's time for a dip in the pool.

#### Proclamation: Hutch to become Smallville again

For the third consecutive year, Hutchinson will symbolically change its name to Smallville – fictional home of Clark Kent, also known as Superman – later this month.

Mayor Jade Piros de Carvalho, wearing a Superman T-shirt, read a proclamation to make the change to "Smallville, Kansas - The Home of Clark Kent" from June 18 to 21, at Tuesday's City Council meeting.

Hutchinson first changed its name to Smallville for a single day in 2013. Last year the name was changed for two days during the Smallville, Kansas Festival organized by Christopher Wietrick and the Smallville ComicCon organized by Jon Robinson. The events have grown since last year, and the proclamation's duration increased to match, from two days to four days.

Wietrick and Robinson joined the mayor for the proclamation. Wietrick said the festival has already started raising money for the Food Bank of Reno County, and he thinks the events could raise \$2,500 for the food bank and the Boys & Girls Club. "It's really touching to see how much people are buying into this," he said

# Classmate Alice Jane Reed Hayes has a new project! Main Street Event Venue Opening Soon

After offering a vacant downtown building she owns to host a couple of nonprofit events, Alice Hayes recognized the need and desire for a dedicated event space, particularly downtown. Collaborating with Gina Nachtigal, of the Hope and Life Center, who has long had her own vision for a downtown event center, Hayes is now converting the nearly 19,000-square-foot building



at 2 N. Main St. which once housed her family's former furniture store into "Main Street Event."

"We can have weddings, receptions, business meetings," Hayes said. "We can host Christmas parties, New Year's and after-prom parties, or baby showers, wedding showers or conferences."

Once they have added a mandated fire sprinkler system to the building, Hayes said, they'll be able to seat up to 1,000 people in the high-ceilinged open space.

The space will also work for smaller events, such as meetings of the Downtown Rotary Club, she suggested.

"I can't think of anything that wouldn't work," she said.

Plans are, "at some point," to stage a fashion show featuring local retailers of women's clothing, said Hayes, who has owned the 50-year-old building since 2001 and lives in a 2,000-square-foot apartment above it.

"We do have some bookings for July and later on in the fall already, but we can't hold any large groups yet," she said.

The space has nearly a dozen 12-foot-long by 10-foot-high false walls used in the furniture store to create room settings that can serve as "nooks," Hayes said, to enable creation of small settings to complement the event, such as a place to set up a guest book during a wedding.

"It's not just open space; this gives points of interest they can decorate and do things to make the event more interesting," she said.

They have sufficient tables and chairs to seat about 80, and plan to order more. They are also having a wooden portable dance floor built, to lay across the existing carpeting, which will be for rent.
