

KNOW YOUR FAITH

Penance: A Gracious Blessing not a Payable Punishment By Fr. Stephen Sohe



T—— Penance is the action of God placing the penitent back in his or her rightful adopted position, the child of God, co-ARE heirs with the Son of God, Christ Jesus (cf. Gal. 4:7). We can take another lesson from the parable of the prodigal **FORGIVEN** son. Like the penitent mentioned earlier, the prodigal son wanted a harsher punishment for his sin, but the father instead treated him even better that the son that has always been with the father. The father, by that very act, put

the prodigal son back to his rightful position. Still learning from the same parable, we can say that penance is an invitation of God Himself to the penitent to a grace-filled celebration, which God Himself put together for the lost-butfound penitent, the dead-but-now-alive sinner. Unlike other worldly celebrations, this graceful celebration never come to an end, as long as the penitent remains in it.

Regardless of the degree of a penance, we do not literarily draw down mercy with or through it, such that one may think that the harsher or harder the penance, the more mercy one can call down upon oneself. No one can control or direct the mercy of God, for to do so will amount to directing or controlling God. God's mercy is already outpoured for us whether we realize or accept it or not. Take a lesson from the parable of the prodigal son again, it was not the action of the son's return that brought the father out to embrace him. Rather, the father was ready, always awaiting the return of his son. He was always waiting outside of his house gazing into the highways and byways, eagerly awaiting the return of his son.
