WHAT FOLLOWS OUR YES AND OUR NO?

Last Sunday I mentioned the pressure vineyard owners in Jesus' time went through during harvest season. They had so much to harvest and very little time and not enough workers to do it. So the vineyard owner in last Sunday's reading had to go out five times to hire workers just to get it all done and in time (Matthew 20: 1-6). This Sunday we have another vineyard owner in need of workers. Maybe he too was racing against time. This time, maybe in addition to hired workers, he asked his children to help out. One said no, but changed his mind and did it, while the other said yes but never bothered to do it (Matthew 21:28-32).

As I read the story my initial reaction was "Wow, what perfect timing". Indeed, God speaks to us all the time and in every situation. If only we listen.



We just rolled out our parish pastoral plan. We're in the process of asking and encouraging parishioners to consider helping us to fill some of the needs we identified through the surveys and meetings. I never for once feared or doubted

that we will get enough volunteers to help St. Bart's. My fear and doubt is really more of how many will follow through. And this is not unique to St. Bart's. Pretty much every church struggles with this problem. I don't think that most people purposely say yes and then become a "no-show" like the second son. Often we're pulled in so many directions with very limited time. Then there are some of us who don't know how to say no. Then, truth be told, there are some of us who don't want to be disturbed. Next, there are those who believe that others will do it. Finally, there are those who believe they are not cut out for it or that they wont be able to do it. But whatever the case, Jesus invites us to review our response to the demands made on us daily or even hourly, at home, at school, at work, at the church, at sports, and all the other extra curricular activities and events. With a spirit of generosity and knowing that we're called to build the kingdom of God wherever we are, we must strive to give an appropriate response to the demands we receive daily. Then we must follow up with action.

May the Lord bless us with the grace to say and mean what we say. Amen.


