APPROVAL OF THE CONSENT AGENDA

Committeeman D. Hansen requested that Correspondence #5 be removed from the Consent Agenda for further consideration.

Correspondence #5- State of New Jersey Department of Transportation – RE: Response to NJ League of Municipalities Inquiry Regarding Transportation Funding Agreements:

Committeeman D. Hansen stated that the New Jersey Society of Engineers is preparing a response to pending legislation (A-4114). The bill would hold the State responsible for costs incurred by local governments when ongoing negotiations over a proposed gas tax increase caused Governor C. Christie to temporarily halt all local public works projects throughout the State. Committeeman D. Hansen recommended supporting A-4114.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to accept Correspondence #5 and to consider adopting a Resolution in support of A-4114.

REGULAR AGENDA

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE AND RESCUE UPDATE

HTVFR President B. Wehrenberg stated that the Fire Department will present a tanker truck and the newly refurbished ambulance at the Sussex County Firemen's Parade scheduled for October 1, 2016 in Sussex Borough.

HTVFR volunteers responded to 20 fire calls in September 2016 and 139 year-to-date. In addition, EMS personnel responded to 24 EMS calls in September 2016 and 246 calls year-to-date.

President B. Wehrenberg stated that HTVFR members recently held an "Active Shooter" class, which was very informative. At the request of Township Administrator E. Klose, Committeeman D. Hansen provided the instructor's contact information for the purpose of obtaining information about possible building modifications at the Town Hall.

ORDINANCE 2016-04- AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 109 OF THE HAMPTON TOWNSHIP CODE BEING THE STORMWATER CONTROL ORDINANCE WITH RESPECT TO REQUIREMENTS FOR STORMWATER CONTROL

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman T. Dooley to adopt at final reading Ordinance #2016-04.

PUBLIC HEARING

Township resident Mr. J. Calvani asked for clarification regarding the purpose of Ordinance 2016-05.

Committeeman D. Hansen explained that the ordinance contains revisions to an existing Hampton Township Code regulating stormwater runoff. If adopted, the Township Code would reflect standards put forth by the State of New Jersey. The DEP sets certain guidelines for the design of storm sewers and runoff from developed properties, which are enforced by the Hampton Township Zoning Official. The revisions involve excluding properties that are less than one-acre in area from stormwater regulations.


WHEREAS, The additional balance of \$9.40 will be credited to the current taxes.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING UPDATE

Mayor P. Yetter stated that Township Planning Board Attorney R. Morgenstern planned to attend the Township Committee Meeting to provide updates regarding the recent hearing concerning Hampton Township's Affordable Housing and Fair Share Plan, but canceled due to a scheduling conflict.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RECREATION PARK WATER TEST

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that the well inspection at the Hampton Township Park did not take place as planned on September 15th because the vendor had an emergency. As a result, she notified the NJDEP to request a two-week extension. The inspection has been rescheduled for October 3, 2016.

The inspection was ordered after a water test came back positive for the presence of E. coli. Providing cracks are not detected in the well casing, the NJDEP said the problem could be remediated by using chlorination methods, however if cracks do exist, the well must be abandoned and replaced.

Because the facility is open less than 60 days each year, Township Administrator contacted the Sussex County Health Department about downgrading the Pavilion area. A downgrade would result in seasonal inspections rather than monthly inspections.

DISCUSSION

Township Committeeman D. Hansen stated that he ordered a new custom-built generator, as well as transfer switches for the Hampton Township Municipal Complex. The items should arrive within three-months. There is a possibility that the generator could be installed prior to the winter months, but the spring is more likely.

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that she asked Township DPW Manager D. Bayles to schedule the installation of the generator pad so that the generator could be properly placed upon delivery.


