An Amazing Incredible Sermon

"In the beginning (Gen. 1:1), a certain man went from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell among thieves [Luke 10:30] and the thorns grew up and choked him [Luke 8:7]. And he met the Queen of Sheba, and she gave him a thousand talents of gold and one hundred changes of raiment [1 Kings 10:10]. And he got in a chariot and drove furiously [2 Kings 9:20], and while he was driving under a tree his hair caught among the limbs [2 Samuel 18:9], and he hung there for three days and three nights [Jonah 1:17]. And the ravens brought him food to eat and water to drink [1 Kings 17:6], and one night while he was hanging his wife came along and cut off his hair [Judges 16:19] and he fell on stony ground [Luke 8:6] and it rained forty days and forty nights [Genesis 7:14], and he hid himself in a cave [1 Kings 19:9] and he met a man who said, 'Come in and have supper with me.' [Luke 11:37] And he said, 'I have married a wife and cannot come now.' [Luke 14:20] So the man went into the highways and byways and compelled him to come in and have supper with him. [Luke 14:23] And he went on to Jerusalem [2 Kings 12:17] and sitting high up in a window was Jezebel [2 Kings 9:30] and when she saw him she laughed [Genesis 18:12]. And he said, 'Throw her down,' [2 Kings 9:33] and they threw her down until seventy times seven [Matthew 18:22] and of the fragments they picked up twelve baskets full. [Matthew 14:20] Now, whose wife is she going to be in the resurrection? [Matthew 22:28] Amen!" (Rev. 22:11)

What is wrong with this story? Every word came from the Bible! What do the above passages teach? I believe you would agree with me that they teach absolutely nothing! But why not?

It is an illustration of what it means to take statements out of context. This is so often done when it comes to teaching salvation from the Bible.

A bunch of unrelated passages are taken out of context and the meaning is distorted so as to teach what God did not intend to teach.
