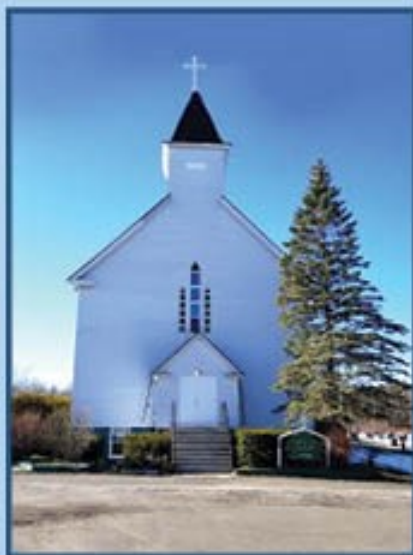

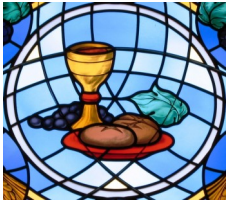

UPDATE FROM THE ADULT FAITH COMMISSION

To help celebrate the Year of St. Joseph, remembering that Joseph was a faithful protector of and provider for the Holy Family, last spring the Adult Faith Commission for the Archdiocese of Moncton invited parishioners to help those less fortunate by sponsoring a plot or donating gift cards or seeds to the *Peter McKee Community Garden*. All food grown at the *Peter McKee Community Garden* goes towards feeding food insecure families. Alicia Clarkson, garden coordinator has advised us that our appeal generated a great response, which included about half a dozen sponsored garden plots, at \$200 each.

Also in the spring, the Adult Faith Commission appealed for donations of canned soup in support of *Isthmus*, (formerly *Blessings in a Backpack*) an organization which provides healthy weekend snacks for food insecure families in 31 area schools during the school year. They have begun their program again this year, and last Friday, received the 1,121 cans of soup collected in our parishes. Tara Stirrat, the volunteer spearheading this initiative, says the numbers of children they support are now over 800, so the need continues. If you are interested in donating again to this worthy cause, drop the soup at your parish, and ask them to contact Mark Mahoney at St. Elizabeth of the Trinity to arrange pick up. On behalf of the folks who work hard to provide for those most in need, the Adult Faith Commission wishes to thank you for your support of these initiatives. "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." (Matthew 25:40)



NEW REGULATIONS REGARDING CATECHISM GATHERINGS

Due to concern around the rising numbers of COVID 19 cases in NB, new regulations have been announced by the government of NB. As per directives issued by the Honorable Dorothy Shephard, Minister of Health, the following guidelines have been determined by Archbishop Valéry Vienneau pertaining to the catechism of children:

All people 12 years of age and older will need to provide proof of vaccination to participate in in-person catechetical gatherings. **If those presenting themselves are unknown to the catechist/ coordinator, government issued identification will also be required.** This applies to catechists, parents and all adults who may be present at sessions. During in-person gatherings, masks must always be worn, although catechists may remove their masks for direct teaching, while maintaining a physical distance of 6 feet (2 metres) from the families. Those unvaccinated will be welcomed to participate in virtual catechetical sessions, via Zoom. The Zoom schedule and registration details are available from parish catechetical coordinators.

It has been a difficult 18 months for everyone as we navigate the pandemic. The situation continues to be fluid with frequent changes, which are frustrating for us all. However, the health and safety of families is of paramount importance. Therefore, as responsible citizens and Christians, it is imperative we follow the directions of public health officials. We thank everyone for their patience as we work to keep one another safe. Through all we are living, and how we are living it, please remember Jesus' words: "I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew, 28:20)

Exploring our Faith

The Gift of Marriage



Today's gospel had me pause often as I find the subject to be touchy, divorce! I had almost a full page written out then I stopped, read, and erased everything. This happened to me twice. I'm not going to lie, I'm happy I'm not the one having to preach today's gospel. We live in a time where divorce is a common and acceptable practice. We've all heard the statistics; fifty percent of marriages end in divorce and over sixty five percent of second marriages end in divorce. I researched these statistics. I couldn't find anything to confirm about second marriages, but I was able to find that in Canada the rate of divorce is forty percent, but only because the "practice" of marriage is on the decline. Did you know that the average marriage in Canada today only lasts fourteen years? I've been married for five and according to this statistic, I can expect to possibly be divorced in nine years. What a distressing thought! Instead of focusing on the gospel, I want to particularly focus on the beauty of what God did for man when he created the woman (and I don't mean in the girl power kind of way).

The creation story from the book of Genesis speaks of the woman being created from the man's rib and from "*the bones of my bones and the flesh of my flesh*". It states that "*It is not good that man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner*". How wonderful that woman was created as a companion and a partner for man. Her being created directly from his rib and his flesh speaks to the unity of the relationship. Woman was created as a compliment to man, as an integral part of his being. This creation

story also speaks of the spiritual ideal where both man and woman come together and become one flesh. This does not imply in any way diminishment, as though the woman disappears into the man or vice-versa but rather that something new is created in which there is increased greatness for the two that become one. To quote Pope Francis: "*This is what marriage is all about – Man and woman walking together, wherein the husband helps his wife to become ever more a woman, and wherein the wife has the task of helping her husband to become ever more a man*".

Marriage is a celebration of creation and of God's love, it is clearly a gift. People believe that marriage is just any two people making a commitment to one another when in fact the spousal bond between two baptized people is elevated to a sacrament and this sacrament builds up our church community and our society.

FROM: Mgr Valery Vienneau

September 24, 2021

We received new directives from the Minister of Health concerning the sanitary measures to be implemented in our churches. Accordingly, the four bishops of NB agree on the following steps to make our churches as safe as possible for our faithful.

1. No proof of vaccination is required for Sunday or weekday masses, baptisms, prayer groups, and others.

However, the following measures will apply.

- Everyone masked at all times.
- Operate at 50% or less capacity.
- Maintain two meters of physical distancing between different households (bubbles).
- No congregational singing. However, soloists and choirs are allowed to sing but respecting the 4 meters as before.
- The names and contact information of all attendees shall be recorded, and the lists maintained. Prevent anyone displaying COVID-19 symptoms or who has been instructed to self-isolate from entering.

2. Proof of vaccination required and maintained for weddings and funerals

Everyone will be required to show proof of full vaccination when accessing certain events such as **weddings, funerals**, conferences, or workshops. Masks must always be worn. For funerals and weddings, there is no distancing required which allows for full capacity and there is no requirement to keep a record of those present. But to be admitted, a person must have proof of full vaccination.

For the catechesis of children, we will follow the rules in force in the schools. Catechists should be fully vaccinated. When other adults attend meetings, they should also be doubly vaccinated. For a celebration in the church, we follow the rule in force in our churches. It is very desirable that the employees of the parish be fully vaccinated. If not, they will need to wear a mask at all times and be tested for COVID periodically according to government policy. For access to the office, we will accept any person who comes there to obtain information or a service. They will need to wear a mask. We understand the concerns of Public Health and continue to collaborate by following the guidelines issued to reduce the transmission of COVID-19. We are all concerned about the current situation in the province. I am very grateful to all the parish priests and teams of volunteers who put everything in place to ensure the health and well-being of our faithful. May the Lord bless us and continue to watch over us!

Statement of Apology by the Catholic Bishops of Canada to the Indigenous Peoples of This Land

We, the Catholic Bishops of Canada, gathered in Plenary this week, take this opportunity to affirm to you, the Indigenous Peoples of this land, that we acknowledge the suffering experienced in Canada's Indian Residential Schools. Many Catholic religious communities and dioceses participated in this system, which led to the suppression of Indigenous languages, culture and spirituality, failing to respect the rich history, traditions and wisdom of Indigenous Peoples. We acknowledge the grave abuses that were committed by some members of our Catholic community; physical, psychological, emotional, spiritual, cultural, and sexual. We also sorrowfully acknowledge the historical and ongoing trauma and the legacy of suffering and challenges faced by Indigenous Peoples that continue to this day. Along with those Catholic entities which were directly involved in the operation of the schools and which have already offered their own heartfelt apologies [\[1\]](#), we [\[2\]](#), the Catholic Bishops of Canada, express our profound remorse and apologize unequivocally.

We are fully committed to the process of healing and reconciliation. Together with the many pastoral initiatives already underway in dioceses across the country, and as a further tangible expression of this ongoing commitment, we are pledging to undertake fundraising in each region of the country to support initiatives discerned locally with Indigenous partners. Furthermore, we invite the Indigenous Peoples to journey with us into a new era of reconciliation, helping us in each of our dioceses across the country to prioritize initiatives of healing, to listen to the experience of Indigenous Peoples, especially to the survivors of Indian Residential Schools, and to educate our clergy, consecrated men and women, and lay faithful, on Indigenous cultures and spirituality. We commit ourselves to continue the work of providing documentation or records that will assist in the memorialization of those buried in unmarked graves.

Having heard the requests to engage Pope Francis in this reconciliation process, a delegation of Indigenous survivors, Elders/knowledge keepers, and youth will meet with the Holy Father in Rome in December 2021. Pope Francis will encounter and listen to the Indigenous participants, so as to discern how he can support our common desire to renew relationships and walk together along the path of hope in the coming years. We pledge to work with the Holy See and our Indigenous partners on the possibility of a pastoral visit by the Pope to Canada as part of this healing journey.

We commit ourselves to continue accompanying you, the First Nations, Métis and Inuit Peoples of this land. Standing in respect of your resiliency, strength and wisdom, we look forward to listening to and learning from you as we walk in solidarity.
