THREE QUALITIES OF A GOOD LAY MINISTER

What are some of the qualities a minister must have? From my own experience of ministry and from my years helping others to prepare for ministry, I find that it is important that the minister (1) have an attitude of service, (2) have the necessary competence and (3) be a team player. We will look at each of these qualities in relation to lay ministry at the liturgy; the same qualities, however, are important for ministry in the parish and for our work in the world at large.

AN ATTITUDE OF SERVICE—We minister because we follow Christ who "came not to be ministered unto but to minister." We do not volunteer for liturgical ministry to get our own needs met (our need to feel important) but to serve the community, to aid their prayer, to help this assembly become a place where we can contact the living God. Ministers of music know the difference between a prayer and a performance and they know that the worshipping community can instinctively recognize that difference. You can tell a lot about your ministry by the comments people make. A good minister should be hearing things like: "Your singing really helped me pray this morning." "I really felt God speaking to me when you read that Epistle."

COMPETENCE—A minister must be competent. Competence is usually a combination of specialized training and natural abilities. You must know what thing you do best and be willing to participate in training sessions or attend practices specific to your particular ministry. The most prayerful liturgies which I have experienced have been those at which each of the ministers did their ministry well. Ministers of music must be competent musicians. The ministers of the Word must be good readers, capable of being heard and understood, capable of inspiring the assembly and making evident the fact that it is Christ himself who speaks when the Scriptures are read in the liturgy. There is no substitute for competence.



A TEAM PLAYER—Liturgy is never a "solo performance." It is the collaborative worship of the entire community working together. A good football team is not a merely one with good receivers, good passers, good blockers-a good team is one in which all these people work together to make touchdowns and win games! Liturgy is no different: The liturgical ministers must work together as team players; they must know and abide by the rules-and they have to have a huddle now and then to meet and plan! A cantor who wants to show off and "steal the show" can destroy a celebration even though the singing is technically perfect. Ushers and readers must work together: The ushers cannot be seating latecomers while readers are ministering to the community. The words of the music must reflect the words of the Scripture reading and the words of the homily. Ministers must be team players. (Fr. 
