- Department of Education Updates
 - o The VUB Annual Performance Report (APR) is due on Friday, March 5. Access to the system is available at https://trio.ed.gov/.
 - COE shared the following update with our community: <u>Highlights from a new report</u> published by the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO) recommend the Department of Education (ED) develop a plan to assess TRIO's effectiveness. Congress provides over \$1 billion annually to TRIO programs. GAO says ED could do more to understand how well these grants work to help students enroll in and complete college. <u>Read the report here</u>.
 - New leadership and members for key TRIO committees announced
 - The House and Senate released their appropriations and authorization committee rosters.
 - Senator Patty Murray (D-WA) is the new Chair of the <u>Senate Health</u>, <u>Education</u>, <u>Labor</u>, <u>and Pensions</u> Committee that updates the <u>Higher</u> Education Act governing TRIO law, and is also the Chair of the <u>Senate Appropriations</u> Subcommittee on Labor, Health, and Human Services and Education (Labor-HHS-ED) that funds TRIO annually.
 - Representative Frederica Wilson (D-FL) is the new Chair of the House <u>Education and Labor</u> Subcommittee on Higher Education and Workforce Investment, and
 - **Rep. Greg Murphy (R-NC)** is the new Ranking Member.
 - Rep. Rosa DeLauro (D-CT) is now Chair of the full <u>House Appropriations</u> Committee and remains Chair of the **Subcommittee on Labor-HHS-ED**.
 - Rep. Tom Cole (R-OK) remains Ranking Member of House Labor-HHS-ED
