July Reflection

Luke 9:57-62 "As they were going along the road, someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go. And Jesus said to him, "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head." To another he said, "Follow me" but the man said, "Lord first let me go and bury my father."

But Jesus said to him, "let the dead bury their dead; but as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God."

Another said, "I will follow you Lord but let me say farewell to those in my home first." Jesus said to him, "No one who puts a hand to the plough and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God."

A friend of mine is a pastor in Charlotte, and he said that when he first got to his appointment he would sometimes meet people who would say, "I'm not a member of a church, but I am very religious." But he noted over the last couple of years, he has noted a shift. No longer do people identify as "religious" perhaps it is too specific, too demanding. No, now people say, "I'm not religious, but I am very spiritual."

In my time here in Cherryville, I have heard much the same thing. "I used to go to church at (you can put any church in Cherryville in this blank) but now I worship on my own terms. I found God, but left the religion for the spiritual." But I must say, much of this seems rather vague and mushy to me. Perhaps that is part of the appeal of spirituality, because it is so vague it can literally become whatever you want it to be.

You will note that while Jesus levies heavy criticism against the religious establishment of his day, he never falls into the vague spirituality that has so gripped our day and time. In our Scripture today Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem. He is about to take up his cross and go down a narrow road that few will tread. And on his way he invites us to walk with him. Three people come to Jesus and announce, "I will follow you wherever you go." But then Jesus confronts them with specific demands of discipleship.

As this Scripture points out, Jesus is demanding and calls us to a very specific way of life. Jesus is not infinitely pliable. True, there is a great deal that we do not know about Jesus, a great deal left unsaid by the gospels. But there is also a great deal that we do know that is undeniable, unavoidable, and troubling to our settled arrangements with the present order.

In a world of amorphous, undemanding deity and nebulous spirituality we are sometimes tempted to weasel out of our encounters with Jesus to jettison a particular God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in favor of a more generic one of our making. We may be tempted to make the faith as broad and as universal in its appeal as possible. So we might be tempted to talk about "love" without giving "love" the cruciform shape that makes Christian love so demanding.

We must trust Jesus enough to create the following that he deserves. The proper object of our worship is Jesus Christ. Our challenge, as people who have been called to follow Jesus is not that we get busy believing

that God was in Jesus but that God was in Jesus reconciling the world to himself. We cannot make this faith mean anything we want. Rather than attempting to smooth out the rough places between us and the good news of Jesus Christ, our calling is to highlight the distance between our ways and God's way, a distance that isn't bridged by simply smoothing the rough edges of the gospel. The way toward a fulfilling and deep faith life is a way that looks to Christ and seeks to embody the same self-giving and self-sacrificial love through which Jesus Christ so radically reoriented our lives.

Jesus often provokes conflict with our most cherished values and widely held beliefs. Jesus sometimes speaks to us in ways that are hard to understand. Sometimes Jesus makes demands of us that seem far out of range of our abilities. But if we dare to come forth and follow, if we will dare to believe that when he said, "Follow me" he was talking to us, he promises us a great adventure named discipleship. May we lay aside our doubts and misgivings, may our sights be set not on the kingdoms of this world, but may our vision be cast continually toward the Kingdom of God. A Kingdom well defined by Scripture, a Kingdom that is not merely "spiritual" but one that is real if we will but do the work of following Jesus.

Our Sunday School classes continue to meet! We offer classes for everyone! We have:




